Dear Brother Knights, Greetings and prayers to all of you from Fr. Jimmy Joseph

We come together as friends, colleagues and perhaps strangers but bound in common humanity (Citizens of earth and heaven) to pause, be silent and to remember. When we celebrate Remembrance Day across our land, we remember that others laid down their lives so that we might be able to live with the freedom that we now enjoy. But the price was steep. In Churchill's finely tuned words it was paid "in blood, sweat and tears." But today is also a stark reminder that our world is deeply broken and divided because of human violence.

Think back to some of your earliest memories. Some will be quite brilliant, others will not and we might struggle to understand why particular events or scenes are so imprinted into our consciousness. And Remembrance Day isn't about war or winning; it's about building peace by building justice, about lifting up the values of our faith that Jesus came to give to all people. So on this day of "remembrance" let us seize the opportunity and prayerfully take to heart the radical message of Jesus, the Prince of Peace and follow his way of reconciling love. Let us discern together the ways in which God is calling us to be peacemakers in his world!

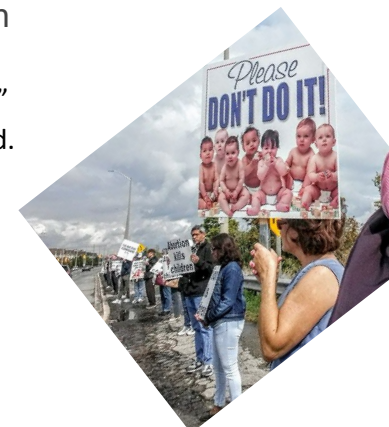
