The Travelling Vocations Chalice Family Praver for Vocations

The Chalice is offered to you as a reminder of your obligation to pray for vocations. It is a prayer tool intended to encourage within the family, prayers of thanksgiving to God for all our Priests and Religious, and to continue to beseech God to expand the hearts and minds of the many men and women whom Jesus continues to call with the words, "Come, follow me."

How does the program work?

- Families who are interested in bringing the chalice home are asked to contact the office.
- Please provide family name, address, contact information and the weekend . mass which you usually attend.
- The designated family will receive the chalice after Communion during the • weekend Mass which they attend.
- The family will keep the chalice, with the prayer booklets, for seven days. •
- The family will return the chalice to Father (in the Sacristy) before the 5pm • Saturday Vigil Mass.

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Many of us have been greatly blessed. Since much has been given us in life, then the Gospel demands that we give much to others in life as well. God has entrusted whatever wealth, skills, abilities, and time we have and enjoy to be used in turn as "the servant of all." Don't confuse "servant" with "slave." A servant, in Gospel terms, freely and generously sets himself or herself to bear good fruits for others. Spouses, parents, teachers, leaders, politicians... everyone can and ought to see in their vocation and obligations in life a true calling from God to do good, to improve the world in which we live, and to correct abuses and selfishness in every way.
