

Student School Representative Position

- Post flyers on school bulletin boards and hand out "minis" for the next Dance Project (TDP) dance to students at your school
- Contact school newspaper to have the next TDP dance shown as an upcoming event
- Contact school clubs that would be interested in dancing and give info on next TDP dance
- Post flyers for the next EDP dance at three of your high school student body's favorite "hang-outs" (e.g. if seniors love running out to Subway after school, post a flyer there)
- Speak with your school administrators about hosting an upcoming dance on location
- Have TDP upcoming dances added to school announcements

This position is a great fit for students who are interested in pursuing a career in publicity & marketing. The representative is in charge of "putting the word out." Because *The Dance Project* is a non-profit organization, students can earn community service hours which benefit their college applications and resumes. *Student School Representatives* keep their positions for a year and get a free pass to all TDP community dances for the season.
