The Pastor Ponders...our vocation as citizen

Most Sundays we pray for a powerful moving of the Holy Spirit among the powerful and the powerless in all nations to work for peace, mercy, and justice; for those who lead and serve us in the diverse levels of government in the United States; and for "our vocation as citizen". Lutheran theology holds that God's design to preserve human community uses "government" so that serving as civic leaders or in staff positions within government is "godly" work.

In real, practical terms, Christians have lived under many systems of good and bad governance. In my travels over the years, the most profound statement about the vocation of citizen came from a Lutheran pastor in the German Democratic Republic ("East Germany") in 1984. (Before the fall of the Berlin Wall, I was on a Peace Pilgrimage visiting Martin Luther "sites" and the close of the Lutheran World Federation Assembly in Budapest, Hungary). He believed that wise and thoughtful people could make a difference while at the same time understanding that critique and peaceful protest, which was needed at times, carried risk.

Lutheran theology is also humbled by our failures... painfully visible ones such as support for the Nazi government by some German Lutheran Christians or the Christian defense of apartheid in South Africa and Namibia and hidden ones where "our neighbor's need" is ignored.

That "government is from God" is true in the big picture but not necessarily true in the real life situation Lutherans find themselves in. We "know" about protest as the church in Luther's day was often corrupt when it had governing and churchly power. Thinking this through is hard work!

This year's campaign for the Office of President of the United States is challenging, to say the least. Both presumptive nominees have high "negatives", and citizens are very polarized and often not open to the thoughts of those who differ from themselves. I don't intend to tell you how I plan to vote or how you should vote...that would be inappropriate. But I am inviting you to worship on July 3 when Galatians 5:13-14 on freedom and law will be explored as the church's need as well as society's need...Judge Roger Krauel will help on the latter one. Then from 11am-noon we will explore what is meant by the "vocation of citizen", especially in times of polarization. Where are the voices of reason? Might that be our call? What are our biblical and Lutheran theological resources "for a time like this"?

Gethsemane's "Welcome Statement" was adopted in 2005, and some from the LGBT community have "tested our waters". On June 29, we will begin with conversation in the Garden Room and then move to the Chapel to pray and remember. Together we will decide, "What's next?

PARKING LOT/FRONT SIGN UPDATE...

We met our goal! Over \$10,000 in gifts and pledges was received by June 15. If you have not yet responded, it's not too late. Our hope was that everyone will be a part of this project. Our Financial Secretary reports that gifts were \$5,\$50,\$500,\$5,000 and many stops in between. "We may be small in number but when we work together we can do some amazing things!" (If we do not use all of Don Snowden's Bequest for this project, we will be able to do something missional as we continue our forward movement.) The Council will vote on extending contracts when they meet on June 27. Work could begin on the Front Sign around July 11 and on the Parking Lot in mid-August.

Liturgy and Worship Update

Written comments were received and conversation happened in response to the Holy Communion Liturgy (Setting Eight) during the season of Easter.

Generally, the comments were favorable with requests that the Holy Communion Liturgy be used once a month in addition to the season of Easter. We will implement this starting in August. Another request was that we might occasionally sing one of the chant-like settings used in the (green) Lutheran Book of Worship. In our current hymnal, this would be Setting Three or Four. We will wait until the choir returns to try this.

There was strong support for the blended form of liturgy that we use regularly because we sing more hymns. Appreciative comments noted that the ELW has a wide range of songs/hymns, old and new, global and ecumenical.

The one part of the Holy Communion Liturgy which received "negatives" was the passing of the peace. Since we have time both at the beginning and the end of the liturgy to greet and share God's peace with one another, we will not use this part.

Thanks to everyone who shared their thoughts and engaged in conversation.

As we come to the end of the "choir year", we express our deep appreciation for the commitment and faithfulness of the choir, director Ken Baker, and accompanist Andy Attwood. May you have a blessed Sabbath rest.
