The Pastor Ponders...*the Journey continues...*

I've not been here before...retiring from a Call to serve a congregation in the Office of Word and Sacrament. In my 32 years of ordained ministry, I resigned one call, finished five contracts for interim ministry (one early), and been on "leave from call".

I've not "retired" which is different from "resigned". My ministry at Gethsemane will be completed, and I will remain on Pacifica Synod's roster of ordained ministers as 'retired'. I can preach/preside on Sundays and/or serve an interim ministry if I choose <u>and</u> if a congregation or the Bishop asks. However, I'm not saying yes to invitations for at least six months as I've set this time as "sabbatical".

My standard answer to "what are your plans" is this: "I plan to spend six months to 'decompress' and explore options for the next part of my journey." I have a file folder of places/things to explore, and, alas, it continues to grow! In the folder is the New Arrivals Center at Crawford High School where teenagers from all over the world enter San Diego Unified; a class in Windows, Word, and Excel; TACO, Rachel's Women's Drop In Center, and Serving Seniors downtown because I am concerned there are so many older women and men with few options; Mid City Nazarene, a multicultural congregation in City Heights, led/served by friends; continue with a Personal Trainer and ponder weightlifting in the Senior Olympics; Oromo Christian Fellowship, Pacifica Synod's developing congregation of Ethiopian immigrants, needing support with English language ministry; a class at the Osher Institute at SDSU; read my Louise Erdrich collection (Chippewa/German writer from North Dakota); experience Holy Week spiritually (not leading liturgy); a 2000 piece jigsaw puzzle, and more! Notice what's not there: golf, tattoo, or Half Marathon. I hope to make commitments after these six months but, as of now, I have no idea what it will be. I hope to discern whether God has a particular call for the next part of my life or whether God is saying, "You're free to choose what's next—surprise me with your faithfulness and creative use of your experiences."

For those of you for whom this Witness is my sole contact and thus "farewell": thank you for your place in my life and for being you and affirming me for who I am. May God's ongoing presence and blessing keep us living in God's amazing and sufficient grace! Our Christian Vocation of Citizen

Most Sundays we pray for our vocation as citizen. These past months, our "Remember in Prayer" page in the bulletin had this request: "our Christian vocation as citizen in a contentious election year." I've had conversations with some of you in which you've shared your concern with the divisiveness of the campaign for President. There's no unanimity on the stadium, legalization of marijuana, or abolishing the death penalty but these don't cut as deeply! Some of you have wondered whether the deep divisions in our country will be healed in the foreseeable future, if ever. Because you've shared these concerns and because we are a 'place of prayer', I will ensure the Chapel is open the day before, the day of, and the day after Election Day, November 8 (see the calendar for the specific times).

Trusting we can be a different kind of community than we see in the news, I am offering times for conversation as Christians in community:

Monday, November 7, 1 or 7pm

Tuesday, November 15, 1 or 7pm I will moderate these conversations so we might explore our vocation as citizen before and after the election and, if we choose, share our concerns. These times are not designed to be partisan and debate who is right and who is wrong. I ask those who come to acknowledge that Christians do not always agree on candidates or basic principles of public policy. If needed, I will review a Lutheran understanding of how God works in the world and the church. I ask those who come to acknowledge the following: the unity we have in Christ is our deepest relationship. Pastor Gloria

In the midst of a food desert, where no grocery stores sell fresh produce, McLaughlin Grows Urban Farm is meeting a critical need for residents of Muskegon, Mich.

McLaughlin Grows Urban Farm, supported by your gifts to ELCA World Hunger, grows everything from radishes to tomatoes in the middle of the city and teaches adults and teens how to grow their own food.

During the summer, Laurie Wieschowski, the farm's manager, teaches middle schoolers the importance of weeding the farm and picking bugs off plants. The reward, says Laurie, comes when the produce grown is served at the public school for lunch.

"They get excited when they see the kale, lettuce and carrots they've been tending," Laurie said, adding that some students return after the session to volunteer at the farm.

This program also hires student interns who earn a stipend while learning how to



promote urban gardening and develop leadership skills. In a city where nearly two-thirds of the residents earn incomes below the federal poverty level, this is an important investment in the community's future.

High school senior Briane Brooks has been involved with the farm for two years, weeding, harvesting and talking to the farm's visitors. "I love the work," she said. "I love being involved in the community."

As part of the Youth Empowerment Program, Briane is paid hourly, but for her, getting healthy food to people is the important goal.

To ELCA World Hunger, she adds, "Your donors are involved in something much bigger than you'd ever believe. You are helping a hurt community."

Thanks to your gifts to ELCA World Hunger, Briane and many residents of Muskegon now have access to fresh, affordable fruits and vegetables they need to thrive.

Meet Pastor Karin Boye

Bishop Andy Taylor of the Pacifica Synod of the ELCA appointed Pastor Karin Boye as the Intentional Interim Pastor for Gethsemane. This was affirmed by the Council in October. An Intentional Interim Pastor is trained in the tasks/needs of congregations in the transition of pastors. While the experience of each congregation is unique, this time in the life of a congregation has been researched extensively and a "best practices" approach has been developed. Interim Pastors also assist in the development of the Ministry Site Profile, a congregation's "Job Posting".

Pastor Karin served San Marcos Lutheran (where she still lives) and five interim ministries, including Ascension in Allied Gardens. Hamburg, Germany, is "home" and where she was ordained and served the church prior to immigrating to the U.S. 15 years ago with her husband, Hossein Nahrvani. Pastor Karin serves a German speaking congregation, leading worship at First Lutheran one Sunday afternoon a month and is on-call for pastoral care. She also works at a North County Mortuary.
