"By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." *Galatians 5.22-23*

Leaving the Season of Easter, we now move on into God's wholeness and shalom. First we will celebrate the Spirit ascending onto the followers of the crucified and risen. Then we will remember that God comes to us in ways we can un-



derstand best in the various situations we find ourselves in: God as the parental guide, Jesus as our brother, teacher and ultimate friend, and Spirit as the passionate power of life within and around us.

In his 5th chapter of the letter to the congregation in Galatia, Paul lists the 9 fruits of the spirit. That is: living in the Spirit and the Spirit in them means that they will do what is right and what is good. You will recognize Spirit-led people by what they say and do. Their words and acts will reflect the Spirit of God.

Paul lists the 9 fruits of the spirit for us, too. I cannot think of a better metric by which one should measure their growth in the Christian faith. In fact I encourage each of you to find some time for quiet prayer and meditation and lift up these 9 fruits of the Spirit. Ask the question, "where have I shown love?" And then ask the question, "where have I erred against love and lived contrary to the faith that is me?" Do the same with joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Take a fearless spiritual inventory and pray for the Holy Spirit to encourage, strengthen, correct and admonish your behavior and your production of these divine fruits that we are called to bear. If you are like me, you'll find yourself lacking in some and pleasantly proficient in others; but remember this is not a litmus test for salvation but an assessment of how we are living out the faith in regards to blessing others with the gifts of our lives in a world that increasingly emphasizes hatred, conceit, provocation of the other, and envy.

May the Spirit dwell within you and lead you day by day.

- Participating along with Pastor Karin as communion servers at the uplifting Thursday evening worship at the First United Methodist Church in Mission Valley.

- Rev. Alexander also shared the fascinating story of her Omaha congregation's discernment process leading up to their upcoming groundbreaking for a new church building at the Tri-Faith Campus in Omaha. - Attending workshops a) to become more educated in the complex political and religious history and influences surrounding the Islamic faith; and b) to get a grip on our church budget.

Transition Update

The Transition Team (TT) convened and began revisiting and revising the work accomplished by the Sustainability and Transition Planning Team (STP). This valuable work helped the good people of Gethsemane and their long-time pastor to end well. There is great comfort in being able to look back onto 21 years of ministry, thus realizing how healthy, vibrant and meaningful this ministry turned out to be today.

Now is the time to translate the findings into the socalled Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The MSP serves as the 'business card' of GLC as well as the 'job description' for the next settled pastor. A potential pastor candidate interested in GLC's ministry will find ample information on who GLC is as a community of faith and what is going on in this little corner of the world. Secondly the MSP summarizes gifts and needs expected from a new pastor to lead GLC into future ministry.

Identified sections of the MSP will be presented to the congregation after their completion so you will stay informed. The TT will appreciate your input.

Once the MSP is completed, you will get to see it and be asked for feed-back. Council will have to approve the MSP before it will be submitted to the bishop's office and then out to the nationwide database of the ELCA.

All of this looks like a for-ever timeline. But the experience shows that the more accurate and detailed the MSP is the better a fit between pastor and congregation turns out to be.
