Transition Team Update

Let me begin with an honest feed back: For a while I was wondering about the fact that, beyond the Transition Team's discernment, there seems to be little conversation on the transition process and the interim journey. But the TT members assured me that the good people of Gethsemane learned to trust their leadership. Yet, in case you are having ideas, concerned or curious questions and want to know more, I can only encourage you to talk to the TT members: Roger Krauel, Jerry Albert, Jean Arneson, Debbie Attwood or Pastor Karin. Every voice counts!

Here is where we are in the process: While working on the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), the TT continues to implement some of the previous work done by the Sustainability and Transition Planning Task Force. Also the TT had asked the Council members and the congregation to help with some input specifically re: GLC's current leadership style and what primary tasks/helpful gifts a pastor candidate needs to address and bring with him or her. The questionnaires used had offered the MSP's multiple choice options. Council and congregation served as a sample group to update and modify information gathered in 2016 and the assessment of the TT. Keep in mind that filling out the MSP is rather a conversation starter on what really matters at GLC and into which direction the ministry and mission should go. The result will be the MSP yet the process provides helpful information for the Call Committee. The actual conversation also contributes to distinguish between what the congregation might want in a new pastor and what the congregation might *need* in the future.

Speaking of the Call Committee—no, at this point GLC has not appointed/elected a CC because there is nothing more frustrating for a highly motivated group of people than to wait... there is a time for everything.

Meanwhile keep praying for all involved in the process and your next settled pastor who is already out there.

The author Dan Hotchkiss writes in his recent article Clergy Transition and the Power of the Past that "Every congregation has some history with (or without) clergy. At time of clergy transition, that history influences the selection process and the partnership as it develops. Especially if the predecessor's ministry was long, people probably accepted certain compromises, leaving them with a pent-up desire for change. When that leader leaves, the compromises go away as well. What was settled is now open for discussion; postponed wishes become urgent needs. A great deal of what members say about the future stems from feelings about the past. And what is true of congregations holds also for clergy. The past exercises a strong influence on congregations-and clergy leaders' past experiences affect their choices, too. The point is not to achieve perfection but to remember, as the partnership begins, to look back at our own past conflicts, triumphs, and disappointments; to pay attention to our feelings and reactions as we enter; and to renegotiate from time to time."
