# God says: To the thirsty I will give water without cost from the spring of the water of life.\*) (Revelation 21:6)

Experience shows that **There's no such thing as a free lunch!** Our society, our economy, the life in this world as we have learnt to live it, tells us this in no uncertain terms. Nothing is for free – you have to work for it, or offer something of equal value in return for it.



And if something is offered for free, we know that there's a catch – it's an attempt to convince us to buy some more of it, or become active members of the organization, handing out such free gifts.

Even in matters of religion, humans all over the world are convinced that this is how things are. To appease or reconcile the gods, humans have always had to do something – make a sacrifice, live according to strict rules, follow some or other ritual or be members of a certain class, race or ethnic group. You can only expect blessings, grace, forgiveness and success if you are prepared to make the necessary contribution for it.

Even in Christendom this scheme has infiltrated our thinking again and again. It is used to keep the members in tow and convince them to give or contribute time, money and effort towards keeping the institution going.

This is why the rediscovery of free grace by Martin Luther was seen to be such a dangerous thing by the church of his day. Lutherans have celebrated the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation last year with many festive occasions and events – but reformation needs to be an ongoing movement – because the announcement that God will give the water of life to those who thirst for free is still a revolutionary, transforming message – for me personally, as I still measure the success of my life by counting all the things I have done, for various congregations in various places, as we continue to measure the success of our faith community by the things we manage to do and offer for our members.

Yet at the same time I realize how this contradicts all of God's intents. God is a God of love and grace - and there are no strings attached. This leads me to believe that the best days of GLC are still ahead: beyond all that we think needs to happen, has to happen, should happen and ought to happen... God is in this place already, doing the God-thing in our midst.

May God be gracious to us, so that we will relearn the astonishment that benefits the message, that life is a free gift. Then we can walk into 2018 with freedom and joy, doing the things we can, and leaving all else in the hands of God, who holds the whole world in divine hands—including Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Serra Mesa and YOU.

#### Transition Update/ Call Committee

The adventure continues! The year ended strong for Gethsemane Lutheran:

With the election of the **Call Committee**, its installation and the election of the committee's chair, now there is a good group in place to begin the work of identifying GLC's next settled pastor. These are the committee members: Jerry Class, Jeffrey Jenkins, Linda Juhasz, Mark Mendoza, and Earline Trinkle (Aaron Williams serves as an alternate), and the chair is Mary Erlenborn. Please support them with your continued prayer!

In January the Call Committee will meet with bishop's staff, Transition Team and council (the so called 4-way-meeting) to receive detailed information on the process and further steps. The date will be determined soon.

Meanwhile the congregation will have to take a second look at the range of possible call **expenses** and a **salary** package. This step has to do with GLC's budget 2018, i.e. your commitment and most likely will require a campaign to raise additional funds above and beyond. You would want to be in a financially solid place to avoid any surprises. In its last meeting during December Council educated itself on the possible variables and will forward this information to you. Let's get ready!!!

### San Diego Project Heart Beat

Project Heart Beat has one main goal: "To save lives through early defibrillation and educate society on simple recognition and response to SCA (Sudden Cardiac Arrest)."

AEDs are designed to be used by non-medical

personnel. The new generation of AEDs analyzes a victim's condition and, if necessary, delivers an electrical shock to the heart to reverse sudden cardiac arrest. Ease of operation with clear voice directions and automatic analysis enables a person with minimal or no training to use the device.
