A mentor and friend of mine posted the following story on his daily blog. I'd like to share it with you:



Jeremy jumped out of bed with a start, having been awakened by his mother's shouts. It took a moment to get oriented. Finally, he understood what she was saying: the barn was on fire.

Pulling on his jeans and boots, he ran toward the well to draw water, but it was too late. The fire was too far along when they discovered it. The barn was gone.

Fortunately, most of the animals got out. Even Bessy the old milk cow managed to break down her stall and escape. As morning dawned and they surveyed the damage, Jeremy walked beneath the charred rafters, which were all that remained. He almost stumbled over the body of a dead chicken, and he wondered why it hadn't made its escape.

As he bent to collect the remains before they began to stink, four chicks suddenly scurried from beneath the dead hen's body. Their soft, yellow down looked pure and clean against the soot and ashes.

Jeremy realized that the mother hen could have escaped. It wasn't the gate or even the fire that trapped her. It was her love. She laid down her life for her babies. Suddenly, Jeremy felt like kneeling. Although he'd been out of church for a long time, he still remembered that it was Jesus who compared his love to that of a mother hen. For just a moment, Jeremy simply wanted to nestle beneath those wings of love.

True or not, a very moving story. But I also wonder about the mothers, fathers, siblings, relatives or even strangers who are trying to protect threatened children, neighbors, elderly, and vulnerable during the deadly bombardments in too many places of the world...

We need to be reminded of our mortality, our ability to harm others, and of God's commitment to be with those who are suffering.

Lent is a powerful time to be reminded.

<u>9% - let's talk money!</u>

In December last year the Congregational Meeting accepted the budget 2018. In January this year the Congregational Meeting received the reports of last year—among them the financial reports. In this financial report it states on page 12 that "giving increases by 9%.

Let me be clear: By accepting the Budget 2018 and the Annual Reports as written <u>YOU</u> committed (are asked) to increase your giving by 9%!

If this comes as a surprise to you because you didn't notice or if you don't care a lot because you were not present at the meeting or you didn't vote for this because you don't know how to increase your offering or you feel that the church just wants your money and you cannot give more anyways—mind this:

It is your generosity that makes the church tick! Cent by cent, you are the one who moves Gethsemane's ministry and mission forward, changing one life at a time. Frankly, it is not about the facility, its upkeep, utility bills and salaries. It is about all of us together makeing a difference in the world, and will continue to do so—thus using a facility and professional staff. The main reason for my giving is that I believe in the church's mission!!!

So how can we go about this?

First let me state that I am not writing this as your pastor who wants more FROM you, i.e. your money. I am writing this because I want more FOR you, i.e. the joy of giving, the joy of giving back and of making a difference. How? In his book 'Not Your Parents Offering Plate' ,Clif Christopher suggests "three pockets of giving" that we can dig into, three areas providing resources ready to be given away graciously.

The first pocket is your **Earned-Income** (salary, pension etc.) out of which you pay all your bills as well as your weekly or monthly offering. The second pocket is the **Cap-ital** Pocket in which you keep stocks, bonds, insurance policies, savings as well as excess money like a loan paid off, an inheritance received or a life insurance due. The third pocket is the **Estate** pocket. This is what you will have available once you leave this earth. You will not need it any longer but you will still be responsible for the treasures God gave you.

So looking at your first pocket you might feel your giving reached its limit. What about the other two pockets? I am not writing this because I want something **FROM** you - your money. I want something **FOR** you. I want you to experience the joy that follows giving. Joy about knowing that your action matters, knowing that sharing God's gifts sets you free from the bondage of treasures you are tempted to hoard. There is something deeply satisfying in being sure that you are doing the right thing. "**God loves a cheerful giver!**" (2 Cor 9:7)
