The resurrection of Jesus came as a huge surprise to all. The political rulers didn't expect it; the religious leaders didn't expect it; his followers didn't expect it; and even his closest allies and family had no clue that this was coming – though he had announced it several times during the course of his ministry.

They didn't hear it or they didn't want to hear it; they heard it and didn't believe it. This was an impossible possibility! Why, on earth should anything



like this happen? But it did! He was nailed to the cross, died a horrific death, was buried in a tomb and now he is alive. God chose to transcend all pain and death. It happened – for you, for me, for us. God fulfilled the promise given a long time ago:

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:19)

Chapel Chair arrangement

You might have realized (or not) that the arrangement of the chapel chairs keeps changing. Partly this is the result of multiple groups using the sanctuary. But partly this is intentional:

Human behavior communicates meaning! Ever since the chapel had changed to a 'lengthwise' seating, the worship attendees sit spread out. The goal of changing the direction of the worshiping community was to create a setting like a semi circle facing the altar. God's table was moved more into the center of the congregation.

The flipside is that the music team and those sitting in front of the sound board get addressed 'over the preacher's shoulder'. Seeking eye contact with the whole congregation present, turns a preacher into watching a tennis match—left, right, left, right... Then the desire emerged to have the slightly decreased number of attendees sitting closer together: Hopefully it would create a warmer, friendlier, more inviting, and a more cohesive feeling. "A new pastor would be able to see that the seating on Sunday morning would reflect the 'togetherness' of GLC." So most of the chairs in front of the sound board got moved to the center, adding a front row that is now divided by an aisle to ensure better accessibility. The kneeler went to the side to move the altar closer to the wall. Communion is served now to the left and right of the altar.

Feed back on the rearrangement? Nobody said they loved or they hated it. One person said they liked it; nobody said they particularly disliked it. Nobody said they understood it or they didn't understand it.

Next Steps in the Call Process

- Call Committee (CC) confidentially receives names and interviews candidates for the call
- CC selects a candidate to recommend to the congregation and notifies church council
- CC Chair, Council Executive Committee, and candidate discuss and agree on compensation package
- Congregational Meeting will vote per constitution and by-laws to extend the call to the candidate
- Result and signed papers will be reviewed by the Bishop and forwarded for acceptance/rejection of call from the candidate (up to 30 days)

On March 27th, the Call Committee had a positive and productive meeting with Pastor Terry Tuvey Allen from Pacifica Synod. During this meeting, Pastor Terry provided names and profiles of three candidates who will be our initial interviewees. The Synod will continue to receive and review candidates on our behalf. and we remind the congregation that the Call process provides an opportunity for congregation members to be included. If a member knows of a rostered clergy or a seminary graduate that they believe would be a good fit for our church, they can propose them. The form is sent directly to the Synod office. You will need to know the candidate's contact information and be able to explain why you think this person would be a good candidate. The Synod office will then decide if they think this person also would be an appropriate candidate for us to interview. You can get this form from Linda Juhasz or Mary Erlenborn. ELCA News

Meeting March 1-6, the ELCA Conference of Bishops met to discuss congregational vitality and leadership. How vital is the ELCA now, how can vitality be cultivated and how can the ELCA foster cultivation. Key findings identified in the conversation included: The most vital congregations can be any size or shape; vitality is not directly connected to numeric growth nor is it related to congregation location; more vital does not mean more sustainable.

Also, the conference spent time discussing increasing the diversity in ELCA congregations. In 2016 the Churchwide Assembly had stated: "This church commits itself to ethnic and racial diversity. Each expression of this church shall

diversity. Each expression of this church shall annually assess its ethnic and racial diversity when compared to the demographic data of its community or territory."


