

#### **SB154 and HB397**

**SB154** and **HB397** as proposed would <u>decriminalize most misdemeanors</u> resulting in a summons and complaint rather than an arrest including, but not limited to, charges such as Menacing, Prostitution, Public Lewdness (exposure of private parts or a lewd act in public), Shoplifting, Theft 4°, bad checks, Trespassing, Disorderly Conduct, Failure to Obey a Police Officer, Unlawful Possession of Marijuana 2°, Unlawful Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and others. A suggested reason for the passing of these bills was to allow for tickets for Unlawful Possession of Marijuana by college students, however, the bill wording would allow for a summons and complaint for potentially more serious alleged crimes. <u>Rewording the bills to limit to only misdemeanor marijuana possession could be done without expanding to other offenses, however attention should be given to potential problems as described below.</u>

"Senate Republicans Announce "Fighting for Alabama" 2018 Legislative Agenda "Fight for Alabama's Children by Strengthening Punishments for Child Sex Traffickers.

"Senate Republicans are committed to protecting the most vulnerable Alabamians. President Trump has signed a proclamation declaring January 2018 to be National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month. In Alabama, we join President Trump in fighting to protect children from modern-day slavery. Under current law, the obstruction of an investigation into child trafficking is only a Class C felony – meaning conviction could

result in merely one year in prison. Should SB179 pass, the punishment for obstruction will be increased to a Class A felony, with a minimum jail sentence of ten years."

- Potential issues with summons and complaint for Shoplifting, Theft 4°, and bad checks: Businesses and individuals who have been victims of shoplifting, theft (up to \$500 in value), and bad checks deserve to have their cases heard against an accused. Should the accused fail to appear, as do many who are currently being released on personal signature due to the practice SPLC, ACLU, and other groups are propounding, the victim will not be provided the opportunity to have their appropriate redress. Many locally owned businesses such as dress boutiques, pharmacies, etc., as well as large corporations (Walmart, Belk, Dillard's and others) will be affected. Businesses will either close or prices will be increased to compensate for missing inventory and losses. Records show the state churned out more than 5,000 such felony convictions between October 2010 and September 2015."

  Should a person be charged with a felony after an Unlawful Possession of Marijuana charge if that allegation was done as a summons and complaint without appropriate identification of the individual with fingerprints and photograph? <a href="What if someone used your name and identification for a summons with the proliferation of identity theft occurring">What if someone used your name and identification for a summons with the proliferation of identity theft occurring?</a>
- Many more individuals will fail to appear on a complaint and summons rather than an arrest using the premise of, "It's just a ticket." Ask your local municipal clerks. See the chart below based upon a study in Charlotte, NC. Also, an arrest which culminates in a personal guarantee rather than sufficient surety based upon a monetary penalty should the defendant fail to appear is limiting the ability of the court to properly dispose of a case to the benefit of a victim or the betterment of our communities. As the court already has the ability to determine on a case-by-case basis the method of jail release of an individual, preference should be given to a court's discretion rather than a blanket approach of citations or jail release which creates numerous other problems which have not been addressed. An arrest is not punishment, it is a deterrent toward the commission of a crime, as well as an opportunity to fingerprint and photograph an individual with the ability to discern as to whether the individual has not only correctly identified themselves to the officer but has done so in the event the individual has outstanding warrants in other jurisdictions which would not be identifiable without proper vetting of the accused.
