Prehistoric and Historic Indian Artifact Specialty Auction Held at A+ Auctions in March

It was still a chilly day outdoors but there was an air of excitement warming the attendees of this sale. About 80 bid cards had been issued but the buyers bid lively on a number of the items offered. A 5000 AD copper spud w/ribbon and original published Badger State archeological magazine that had been pictured in a previous Auction Action News made \$1,100. The Set of 31 graded Indian game balls w/ wooden display sold for \$500. A large frame of 169 arrowheads under glass went for \$650. The large bronze "The Cheyenne" brought \$850. A fine sugar quartz 4" spear point sold for \$790. An axe made from a mastodon rib sold for \$760, this had originally been part of the "Phillip Schupp collection". There was a number of beaded items both modern tourist items and authentic wear. There was a sweet pair of beaded baby moccasins that sold for \$67.50, a wall basket hangar of black velvet with beading that was an early 1800's whimsy that sold for \$105 and many other pincushion and other shaped whimsies that sold for bargains in the ten to twenty dollar range.

There were between fifty and sixty box lots of field grade and better arrowheads and

other points that sold between \$12.50 and \$80 per lot which contained a dozen to 15 points per lot.

An outstanding quill covered birch bark basket sold for \$100. A ceremonial mask brought \$185.

Numerous ax heads were offered for sale. These ran the gambit from bargain prices for a lot of three at \$12.50 up to a high of a large one going for \$290.

A lot of five prayer sticks brought \$205. A Very old hide and beaded doll made \$155. A banded slate bird stone sold for \$300.

There were a number of Eskimo items that sold including an old seal skin Eskimo doll for \$40.00 and an old hide miniature kayak for \$525.

It was very refreshing to see such a nice offering available only to those people who attended with no outside competition from phone or online bidders and selling with no reserves to highest bidder. Everyone had an equal opportunity to take home a special new addition to their collection.

Some clubs do a tremendous job with membership services, offering newsletters and publications, mentoring programs, an educational website, annual convention, shows and auctions, price guides and research projects, resource libraries and archives, collector insurance programs, reproduction alerts, ethics guidelines for both collectors and dealers, member supply stores, annual membership collectors items and much more.

In reviewing what clubs offer and their various membership dues structures, it seems to us that membership in most clubs is a real bargain - a year's worth of service often for about the same price you would pay to go to a movie (with popcorn and drink), or a sports event or concert (and often a lot less).

Another factor to consider is that for most clubs we are talking about a one year commitment. Membership dues is usually for 12 months. At that time you can either renew for another year or decide not to.

Even for a person who is just beginning and maybe only mildly interested in a collecting area, what better way to determine if you want to become more serious in that collecting area than having a year's worth of member services from the club supporting that collecting area to help you "weigh your decision"?

For the collector who may possibly be interested in four or five different collecting areas, we would strongly suggest consider joining the clubs which support each of these four or five collecting areas. OK, so maybe you're not that much of a joiner. It still is the most practical way of letting the collecting club sell you on which area to eventually collect more seriously through the simple technique of camparison shopping. Let the clubs sell you on collecting in their area.

Another option, without the obligation of actively paying membership dues, is to simply ask a collecting club you may be interested in to send you some information on their club and the collecting area they support.

This is the main thrust of the Association of Collecting Clubs' Join A Club program - promoting the ACC Club Directory and the listings of over 6,000 collecting groups... probably some you've never heard of before, and how to contact them.

Now, getting back to the original question, "Why join a collecting club?" Probably the best answer is because YOU want to. It has to be your decision. Like your collection, itself, it's a personal thing. You decide what to collect... what to buy... how to display it... and everything else connected with your collecting. Joining, or not joining, a collecting club is a part of this. Most collecting clubs exist to support and help collectors, and perform a good service for their collecting area. But they also have the obligation of convincing you that you should join their group as a member.




