Small Town - Big Event The Marbold Antique Show & Farm Fest

The small town of Greenview, IL will host a big event on June 22 and 23, 2019, The Marbold Farmstead Antique Show and Farm Fest. The Marbold Farmstead sits just south of Greenview, alongside Route 29, 20 miles north of Springfield. The income from the fundraising event will provide funds for the 2019 Capital Campaign, "The Next Chapter," to help with restoration of the house. Restoration efforts are currently underway and feature repair/replacement of windows and doors, dormer work, chimney caps, tuck-pointing, electricity, plumbing and HVAC systems, at an approximate cost of \$250,000.

The Marbold Farmstead was established by German immigrant, John H. Marbold in 1850. He grew his farm from 200 acres to over 4,000 with the help of his son, H. H. Marbold. Through their farming years, the farm went from horse and plow to steam engines and finally gas engines. The Marbold family utilized the latest technology of the industrial revolution. Using a boiler system, forced hot water heat was sent into the home through underground clay tiles. Electricity was installed in the home and throughout the property. An indoor bathroom was built to provide better sanitary conditions and a conservatory was added to provide plants and mood-altering stained-

glass windows, a Victorian-age concept. The farm was self-sufficient, growing most all their food for themselves and their hired help. It was a farm revered by the community and county in central Illinois.

This is the seventh year for the antique show at the Marbold Farmstead. The farm fest was added two years ago, creating the Marbold Farmstead Antique Show & Farm Fest. With the addition of farm equipment and demonstrations guests get to see farm equipment and farming techniques from the past. A shingle maker, baler, gas engines and more give guests a look at how a farmer worked.

A variety of craftsmen, demonstrators, flea market merchants, antique dealers, historic programs, tours of the house and grounds, a trolley tour of the community, music, food and more will round out the fourth weekend in June event. Gates open at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday and close at 5:00 p.m. and on Sunday, the gate opens at 9:00 a.m. and closes at 3:00 p.m. Admission fee is \$5.00 for this rain or shine event.



Antique Vintage Handkerchiefs Fun To Collect And Use

Handkerchiefs have been around for centuries, but in the 1920's, Kleenex tissues began to take their place. A hanky became an inexpensive accessory for an outfit and the perfect "Christmas gift for a friend or relative because you didn't need to know the size to purchase. Also they were a special gift easy to enclose in a card and mail.

Today, many ladies carry or tie them on their purses or put them in the cuff of a blouse so they are handy when needed. The distinguishing features of handkerchiefs are patterns and designs. They come in many styles, colors and shapes. Many animals, such as dogs, appear o handkerchiefs, while floral ones are plentiful.

Children's hankies depict cartoon characters or nursery rhymes. In the 1930's, many children went to school with a handkerchief pinned to their clothing.

There are designer handkerchiefs, and some are signed like works of art. Though they were mass produced, you'll be able to recognize the style of a particular artist even if the handkerchief isn't signed.

History and patriotism is a way of learning of a handkerchief's age or time span. the red, white and blue hankies represent the armed forces and instill patriotism in the wearer. Many military personnel purchased hankies as gifts for loved ones. "Remember Pearl Harbor" is one of the most poignant of all the hankies. After World War II, gas rationing stopped and many people took to the road for vacations. No item was a better souvenir than a handkerchief - inexpensive and small.

Most handkerchiefs are cotton or linen and most have hand-rolled edges. There are also some that are silk.

To bring your handkerchiefs back to a nice condition, try to remove stains by soaking them in Oxy Clean or use cold water with hand soap. Always rinse thoroughly and never squeeze or wring it dry. Lay the handkerchief flat on a towel to dry and then iron it and store with acid free paper between each handkerchief.

Lace, crocheted and tatted handkerchiefs are very nice for special events, such as confirmation or first communion. For a wedding, a handkerchief can meet the need for something borrowed, blue, old or new.







Fan Enthusiasts Convened in Boston, Massachusetts

The Fan Association of North America (FANA), which includes hand fan enthusiasts from across the country, recently convened in Boston, MA for their 37th annual meeting on April 10-14, 2019 to view fans at three area museums and from private collections. Meeting organizer Shelly Gonçalves stated, "museum-quality fans are rarely exhibited due to their fragile construction, so it was a particular treat for FANA members to view fans 'behind-the-scenes' at the Boston Museum of Fine Arts

and the McMullen Museum of Art at Boston College (Chestnut Hill)." Former FANA member Ester Oldham's collection at the MFA includes gems such as a rare 1590 découpé fan1 imitating lace, an Italian ca. 1820

souvenir fan illustrating Vesuvius erupting, and a 1740s mask fan. The McMullen's Hicks Collection has many fans with mother-of-pearl making up the monture (sticks and guards) of

the Four Seasons.

In the late 1800's the largest concentration of American hand fan manufacturers were located in and around Braintree, Massachusetts. FANA members visited the Braintree Historical Society where members viewed the current fan exhibit (on view until May 31) and met with curator Mary Fraiser to learn more about the fan manufacturing companies: Hunt, Allen, White Brothers, and Strauss. FANA members brought their own fans for Ms. Fraiser's determination of whether or not they were "Braintree" fans.

Members also welcomed student interns from Lasell College

(Newton, MA) to the meeting, who presented their research cataloguing fans from the Lasell Fashion Collection.

For the FANA members' fan showcase, scrap fans were the theme. Scrap fans were very popular in the late 1800s when the owner would take a plain fan and glue logos of hotels, colleges, businesses, fraternal organizations, etc. clipped from stationary or envelopes to make their own personalized souvenir fan.


