





Chicagoland Show Brings Buyers & Dealers from Across the Country

In fact, spring-like temperatures held sway Sunday, the last day of the event - in sharp contrast to the usual cold blasts and rain of some previous shows.

Early buyers scampered around the parking lot, armed with flashlights during the pre-dawn hours on Friday, dealer set-up day, and many of them plunked down \$50 to shop with dealers as they moved indoors. More frugal visitors waited for the later Saturday and Sunday show openers with a more modest \$7 entry fee.

There was a buzz in the air during Friday set up day as news traveled of a rare and expensive early 1900s Berger vending machine being offered by Bill Rawski of Zap Props Co., of Chicago. "It's only one of three known," said Rawksi, adding "and the only one with the original fancy twisted fancy iron stand." The 21" tall tent-shaped bulk vending device also boasted original paint, decals and lock, which are important to collectors.

Oddly enough, the buyer, who shelled out what he called "five figures to take it home," is a collector of coin-operated trade stimulators - not vending machines. That buyer, Tom Gustwiller of Ottawa, Ohio, said, "I'm not into vending that much, but the stand with lion feet really triggered me," adding, "I know what's powerful and good." Fellow collectors who admired the rare find agreed it was a treat to see it in person.

"I started in the coin op business at age 13 and am still working at age 77," said Steve Squires, who traveled to the Chicagoland Show from San Mateo, CA. Three of the many slot machines he offered at the show were a 1938 Mills Bursting Cherry for \$1,450, a 1934 Mills War Eagle for \$1,950 and a 1934 Mills Castle Front for \$1,750. He added that there were "hundreds more slots at the shop, Squires and Corrie Slot Machines, priced from \$500 to \$5,000 each."

Wisconsin dealers Paul Hinden and Jack Freund live only about 50 miles apart but set up across the aisle from each other at the show. Both "friendly competitors" are known for rare original coin-op finds, and once again they did not disappoint. Hinden, of Mequon, showed off a circa 1915 "very desirable" Columbus 36 cast iron vending machine, just 5 inches tall, priced at \$3,895. He also pointed with pride to a 1920-30s 19 inch tall Sunny Boy trade stimulator/vending/payout coin-op machine complete with marquee (which usually is missing) offered for \$6,595.

Not be be outdone, Freund, of Springfield, displayed "one of a kind" treasures. The first, a 15" tall double-glass-cylinders and cast iron Pepsin Gum and perfume penny-operated vendor, could grace your collection for \$7,900. Sitting next to it was an 11" tall Balba Bouquet cast iron base 10-cent perfume vendor offered for \$3,695.

For many, the Chicagoland Show is a family affair. Dealer Nathan Lippe of nearby Hanover Park, IL, was visited by daughters Charlotte, 5 and Hannah, 2. The girls pointed with pride to Dad's 1950s giant 6-foot neon Pepsi-Cola sign priced at \$9,500. At the same spot, a 16 x48 inch arrow-shaped Double-Cola sign could be taken home for \$1,950. Although the tots seemed to like the signs, they quickly showed off their prizes purchased at the show - two stuffed toy unicorns.

Little Nathan Warden was just a baby when he attended his first Chicagoland Show with mom and dad, many times sleeping as busy crowds strolled by. But now,

at age 4, he was playing with arcade machines while perched on a chair to reach the controls. His parents, Jeff and Diane Wardon, who run Arcade Adventures, Crystal Lake, IL, said "sales were brisk" at the November event.

"I started collecting records in 1958 and now it's jukeboxes," smiled John Maletz of Chicago. Many people stopped by his booth to admire and operate his fully restored light-up 1947 Seeburg jukebox, playing 78 rpm records, and lovingly nicknamed "the trash can" by collectors because of its design, tagged at \$3,700. Others "oohed and ahhed" over a 1952 Rockola Fireball jukebox, one that played 45 rpm records, priced at \$6,600.

Not all jukeboxes at the show were old. A replica 1940s light-up Rockola '91 countertop jukebox with wood stand, could play a selection of cd's at your home for \$2,795. At the same spot, dealer Steve Hanson of Vernon, Conn., showed off a vintage Orange Julep soda fountain syrup dispenser priced at \$950.

Many visitors stopped to drop a coin and check their weight on the penny scales filling the booth of Bill and Jan Berning of Genoa, IL. A long line of chest-high examples were priced at \$295 to \$325 each, while a 6' tall cast iron 240-pound Watling Lollipop scale -so named for the shape of it's face --was sold early in the show for \$2,400.

Penny arcade games along with vintage pinball games filled the booth of Phil Hubbert, Romeoville, IL. Sharpshooters tested their skills with a 1940s "Shoot the Bear" coin-op gun game that could entertain friends at your home for \$5,000. Hubbert said he had set up at Chicagoland "from the start" and makes contacts for service calls on other folks machines, as well as buying and selling.

It was a nearly eight hour drive to the show for first-time-vendors Dave and Allie Smith from Old 54 Antiques, Macks, Creek, MO. They offered an eclectic mix of collectables including a 16" tall wooden G.E. radio for \$900 and a "Pete the Pup" 1932 wood toy priced at \$295. Did they sell well? Allie thought for a moment and softy smiled: "We killed 'em."

"I like that witness window that reveals cheaters using slugs," said Bill Bryk pointing to the small coin-size glass cover on his 1930s countertop Try-It dice shaking machine. The dealer drove to Chicagoland from Coweta, OK. He also showed off an oddball and spooky 27" tall rubber construction 1940s "Mushroom Man," thought to be a movie prop. Mushroom Man could stand tall at your place for \$1,250.

Even though favorable weather greeted visitors and vendors, the covered tunnel-like pedestrian walkways that connect the Mega Center show to the nearby Pheasant Run Resort Hotel insures that everyone could move with ease between buildings warm and dry. "It sure makes for a more comfortable show," said one vendor, adding, "you never know what weather Chicago hands out in November."

Co-promoter Penny Traynoff said the November show was "sold out" for dealers and added she "saw many new collector faces at the show."

It will be spring before crowds gather at St. Charles again for the twice-peryear event, April 1-3.







Golf 101 "fore" the non-Golfer

Even if you are not into this rich man's game, golf offers some great collectibles and they're free!

Here's a thought for you! How about starting a new collection that won't cost a penny and might help you to lose a few pounds? Interested? Read on.

My personal collections range from Victorian butter pats to turn-of-the-century Flash Ruby souvenir glassware to British Royal family memorabilia. Despite having more than enough of everything, I still had the unshakeable urge to respond to the primordial call to continue collecting. Two major drawbacks: lack of space and money to start another collection.

Several years ago I found myself transplanted from my long-time home, which was located fifteen miles beyond Times Square, to a tiny village that happens to have a golf course. I am a non-golfer and have no interest in the game. However, I soon acquired a penchant for the diminutive treasures I started to find on my walks around the perimeter of the course.

Small white balls with colorful emblems beckoned to me from swamps, ravines, rock crevasses, and yes, even trees! Now here was something I could get into. I began to gather a variety of advertising golf balls with the thought that surely these items will be valuable one day.

On my walks I have garnered branded balls from charities and foundations, Disney and Warner Brothers, breweries, insurance and real estate offices, pharmaceutical companies, airlines, resorts and private country clubs. The list is endless. However, a word on protocol: Do make sure that you are not taking a ball "in play" from someone who has just teed off out of your eyesight.

When the big shots come to town for charity events or celebrity tournaments, many of them bring their own kit. This gives me an opportunity to expand my collection to include faraway places such as St. Andrews, Royal Troon, Munakata and usually a few balls from tony golf courses around the United States: Augusta, Pebble Beach and Kapalua. Then there are those snooty monogrammed balls that add cachet to my collection that is housed in a plastic bucket in my garage.

I now have a colorful and varied new collection that didn't cost me a dime and the added health benefits derived from the walking and bending over are a bonus.

Mary Dessoie founded the Butter Pat Patter Association for beginner and advanced collectors of butter pats from the Victorian through Edwardian eras and 19th-century to current-day transportation and restaurant ware. A butter pat is a miniature plate, part of a place setting of fine china, used to hold an individual portion of butter.
