Out & About

The little amount of snow we received compared to the East Coast was kind of refreshing. It was just enough and at the right times that I did not have to be on the road driving. Sounds like our antiquers are still getting out to attend auctions and shows. The malls have reported that foot traffic and sales are up.



I thought this might be interesting to know, that after 21 years of printing it is still hard to imagine how the print process works. We have been with our printer for over 19 years, that's longer than my marriage. We have been with our postmaster just as long. People will tell you I don't like change and I like doing business with people in person. I feel if it works don't mess with it and I am one for having things organized. My mom (Jeni) will tell you I have been this way since I was a child, but I have learned to let more things go with age. Back to my printer who I also consider friends, it starts with us turning all of our pages into PDF's and sending them over to Jay who makes the plates. Plates are metal sheets that have our paper imprinted on them. We print in 4 colors, Cyan, Magenta, Yellow, Black (CMYK). Jay is like a little elf, he works his magic on our pages, sometimes having to fixing things. He is always playing music in his office and singing, it always puts a smile on my face. We use a plate in every color (CMYK) for every page, because that's what it takes to make the ads. The plates then go to Terry. He is like a hummingbird. He is fluttering everywhere non-stop constantly checking color, alignment, water and the paper and I am sure a million other things. He goes up and down this straight 8 foot ladder with such ease, it always amazes me. On top is where all those plates are, and they need to be constantly aligned and color adjusted, as you can imagine with all those plates, it is a task. You also have to consider that the pages do not print in a pair, so color matching can sometimes be difficult if there is alot of one color in the paper that week. At the end, the paper then comes out on a conveyer belt where we collect the paper and move it over to a different machine to start mailing the paper to our subscribers. This is where Eric, the magician, gets us all set up. This takes time, as other papers get mailed on this machine as well. He makes sure that the mailing machine works like a charm for me, he has even designed things for the machine, just for our paper. After every mail he will ask me how it went and how he did. Sometimes perfect, and sometimes the machine just doesn't want to cooperate. After mailing the subscribers papers, we move on to the malls, auctions and shows. This is where we hand count, label and seal every bundle and box. This we have done for 21 years and counting. Then Tom and I mail the boxes and go to the post office where we always see our paper being delivered. This is where Kim goes through our pallets by hand before they go on the truck for Green Bay, Wisconsin. Carrie then handles my first class and gets me set up with all my stamps. I make it all sound like an easy process but in actuality it is a very tedious process from start to finish. A process that like us humans is not always perfect. Over all, I enjoy mail day and all the wonderful people I get to work with and visit. So, when we say we are on top of things, we really are. These friends have been with me longer than my marriage and have seen my children grow up and know them by name. They are my small town business heros, who help me bring your paper to you every week.

The Green Bay and De Pere Antiquarian Society: Celebrating Ninety-Plus Years of Preserving Wisconsin's Cultural Heritage

The Green Bay and De Pere Antiquarian Society Holiday Antiques Show is one of the Badger State's oldest antiques events, started way back in 1957. The society itself is far older though, founded ninety-one years ago by local businesswoman Jesse Buchanan. She had an ambitious goal: to make Green Bay an American center of history and culture. Buchanan was tireless in advocating historical preservation in the area and did much to preserve its treasures. She, along with a group of like-minded area women, founded the Green Bay and De Pere Antiquarian Society in the 1920s.

Distressed upon seeing early Green Bay artifacts being sold to distant collectors, Buchanan began a systematic search for historically accurate artifacts for the area's historic landmarks. That effort, often supplemented with loans or donations from her own collections and coffers, also helped refurbish many area museums. She was also instrumental in initiating a campaign to restore several historic buildings located at nearby Heritage Hill State Historical Park. Today's members continue the pursuit and restoration of original or period authentic furnishings for area museums.

Recent Antiquarian Society acquisitions include what has become known as The Heritage Collection, an important and wide-ranging group of artifacts consisting of everything from a Matthew Brady photo of Abraham Lincoln signed by the President himself to a large collection of original Howard Pyle Paintings. Known as "The Father of American Illustration," Pyle's books, magazine illustrations, and paintings were well known both here and abroad. In fact, Vincent van Gogh once commented

in a letter to his brother that Pyle's work "struck me dumb with admiration."

And the Green Bay and De Pere Antiquarian Society's Annual Holiday Antique Show has been an important piece of their fund-raising pie for all of those years. This 59th edition of the show was a big success, with good attendance and sales on both Saturday and Sunday. Quality dealers from Wisconsin and the surrounding states journeyed to the Rock Garden Convention Center with a wide variety of quality antiques and artifacts.

Furniture purveyor Beneath the Dust was among them, their booth filled with period furniture from fine to funky. Among their inventory: an unusual Arts & Crafts oak hutch/game table with a leather seat and with hidden poker chip and playing card storage. Haven Hill Antiques continued the fine furnishing theme, and also brought American fine art from nautical to pastoral.

Period jewelry more your thing? There was something for every taste here at the show, ranging from vintage Bakelite bangles at Barbary Stoy Antiques to En Vogue's huge array of Miriam Haskell fashion jewelry. In fact, no matter your collecting interests there was probably something here for you - from authentic Native American artifacts and trade goods at Welsch's Antiques to vintage toys, antique coins, and much more.

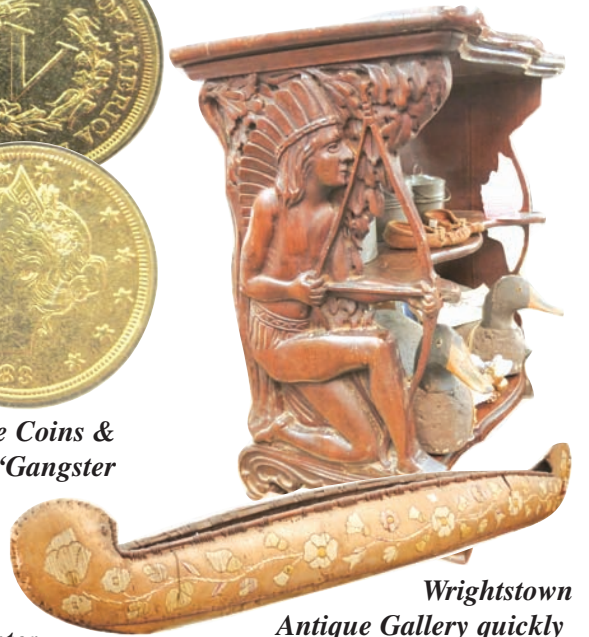

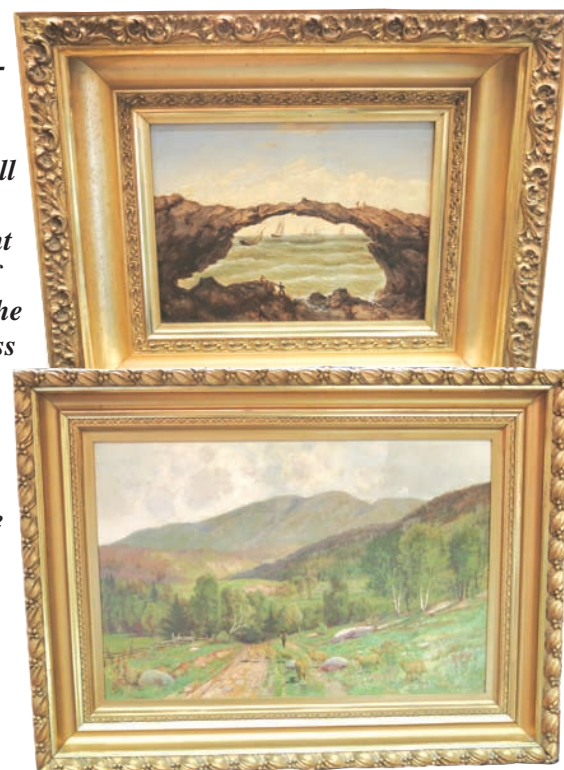

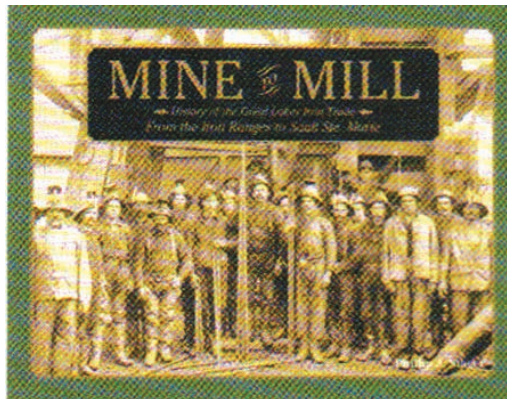

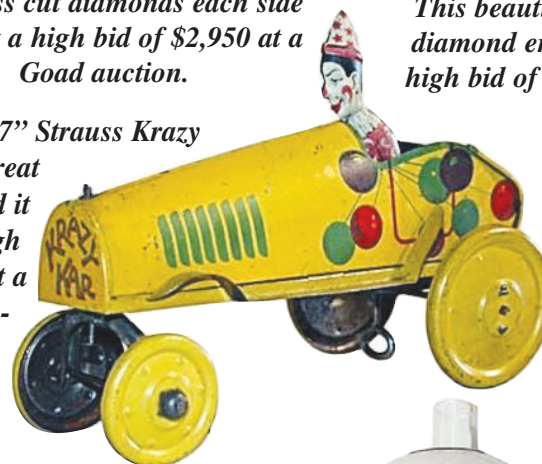

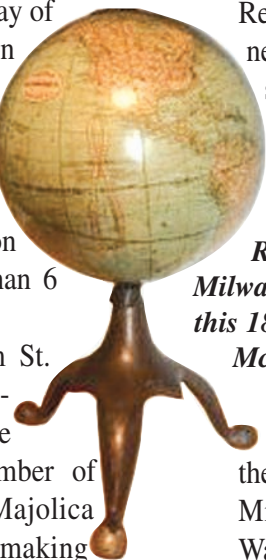

“Asparagus Man”

Outsider Art Keeps Good Company

**Wisconsin Antiques Dealers Association Show
 Lends Assist February 5 & 6, 2016
 to Historic Sites**

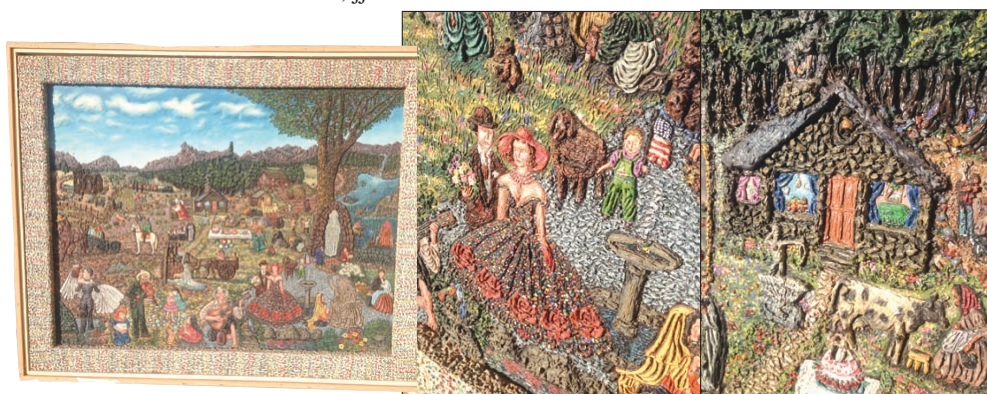
Anyone familiar with Wild Rose, Wisconsin, will remember it is as a tiny, picturesque town, smack dab in the middle of the state. If you ever traveled down County Highway K between 1947 and 1975, you may have encountered the tiny one-bedroom farm home of Adam and Anna Berg with signs “Odd Job Work” and “Asparagus” hanging on the clapboards. Adam had just retired as a Chicago cab driver in 1947 when he and Anna made Wild Rose their home, selling asparagus and charging 10-cent admission to their art gallery to generate a small cash income. He became known locally as the “Asparagus Man”. A self-taught folk artist, Berg believed isolation from the cultural mainstream allowed him to develop a technique to “carve” his paintings using the medium of oil. By adding multiple layers of oil paint over a period of years, he transformed his paintings into low reliefs up to 1/2 inch thick. Here, in his primitive Wild Rose surroundings, he traded his Chicago cab for a used bicycle, never owning an automobile again. He and Anna lived without modern conveniences, including running water (except a hand pump at the kitchen sink), so that he could pursue what he believed was his destiny - to paint in a manner no one had seen before.

Berg described “Heaven on Earth”, (completed in 1963 after five years of paint layering), as “the masterpiece of his life’s work”. He died in 1975. This most impressive work, purchased in 1973 for \$2,300 (more than \$13,000 in 2016 dollars!) was generously donated (along with several other Berg works) to the Friends of the Wisconsin Historical Society for their April 23, 2016 “30th Star Benefit Antiques Auction” to be held at Old World Wisconsin in Eagle. The Wisconsin Antiques Dealers Association is the founding and continuing sponsor of this biennial event.

Berg’s folk art created quite a stir at the February & October, 2015 WADA antiques show, spurring other donors to come forth with incredible donations. Now the “Asparagus Man” paintings are keeping good company with other worthy objects; a circa 1830 Windsor rocker in original paint, country store scales, Victorian buggies, commemorative flow blue, spinning wheels and much more.

February 5 & 6, 2016 the Wisconsin Antiques Dealers Association will again provide a free booth at their Waukesha antiques show where Friends volunteers will accept donations of antique and vintage items for their auction. Tax deductible receipts will be provided to each donor. In addition to the free booth space at the antiques show, WADA has provided their fourth grant to the Friends of the Wisconsin Historical Society, funding the restoration of a square grand piano at Wade House in Greenbush, Wisconsin. WADA, founded in 1948, is a not-for-profit organization and the admissions charged at their Waukesha shows fund such grant and scholarship programs.
