Advertising the Focus at Huge Miller's Auction Company Sale in Tomah, Wisconsin

It was quite a sight as I arrived at the Monroe County Fairgrounds on a brisk December 5th Saturday morning – the second day of the two-day auction. And while day-one featured a range of agricultural, automotive, and soft drink advertising, breweriana was the focus for today. Hundreds of classic signs filled row after row of tables, with many more jumbo examples lining the walls of the building. This December Miller's Auction Company sale was among their biggest and best of the year, with eight-hundred cataloged lots of choice period advertising. As expected, a large crowd filled the hall by the 9am start of the event.

And I don't think a single one of them were disappointed with the quality of the offerings. Period neon signs drew many to the sale, most of which were in exceptional restored condition. That certainly described the Point Special Beer example that lead the way pricewise at \$6,200. Other neon sign highlights included another Point Beer version selling for \$5,500, and a 36" x 54" Hamm's Beer sign that made a solid \$3,900

The many classic porcelain signs did just as well. Two hard-to-find Fox Head Beer shield signs were a standout, selling for \$5,000 and \$4,900. A very-clean Goetz Country Club Beer porcelain sign sold for \$4,900 too, and an unusual Wooden Shoe Beer sign surprised at \$4,100. Budget not that big? Bidders had hundreds of other lots to choose from in all price ranges.

And although signs dominated the sale, I shouldn't fail to mention the two very-different classic cars that crossed the block on day-one. A restored 1923 Ford Model-T Roadster came complete with a trailer to take it home on, and made a respectable \$5,900. And of course that previously mentioned 2008 Ford Carroll Shelby Mustang

Convertible that was easily the top-lot of the auction, selling for \$31,000.











Overall the axes, quality flint and known historic Indian artists items were very strong throughout the auction. Beadwork seems to continue to strengthen from it's down turn in 2009. James McKinney was known to have always carried an arrowhead in his pocket. Beginning in the 1930's as a young man, he hunted the fields, streams and cave shelters of Maries Co., MO. Following his military service in the South Pacific in World War II in which he earned a Bronze Star, as well as playing in baseball for the U.S. Army's traveling team, Mr. McKinney returned home to farm and manage the local MFA Farmers Elevator. Although he helped raise six fine children, coached softball teams for many years, farmed crops and cattle, he continued to expand his relic hunting areas to include Osage, Franklin, Gasconade and other Central Southern Missouri counties. Jim enjoyed showing his collection to school children, and was a familiar presence at many Missouri Archaeological shows. Mr. McKinney was the recipient of several "Best of Show" and "Best Personal Find" awards at Missouri and

Greater St. Louis Archaeological events over the years. We were especially honored to present this as the first sale to liquidate his fine lifetime assemblage.

The Vander Vorste family hunted Indian relics in North & South Dakota from the 1920's through the 1950's. Margaret Vander Vorste was especially avid throughout the 1930's and 1940's in finding and preserving relics in the counties of Campbell and Emmons near Pollock, South Dakota. Many of the items contained in this sale were on display in the local museum near Pollock for many years. All items offered herein were personal finds or acquisitions prior to 1960.

After retiring from a distinguished lifetime career in the U.S. Air Force in 1978, Master Sargent Kenneth Mullins assisted his wife Sandra in assembling an impressive quality cookie jar collection. 


