Antique & Appraisal School Celebrates Half-Century Milestone



Asheford Director, Charles Green Celebrating School's 50th Anniversary

While not quite considered an "antique" just yet, the Asheford Institute of Antiques, a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles, and appraising, turned fifty this past week, marking a milestone in antiques and appraising education, as the longest running Institute of its kind. Although the school premiered its home-study program to the antique world in late 1965, it didn't officially open its doors to students until 1966.

"We've seen an awful lot of changes since our inception" said Peter Green, the Institute's original founder. Green, who started the school based on the notion that there was a need for antique and appraisal education, said he could hardly believe how the antique and appraisal services market had grown over the past 50 years – "I can remember when antique stores were hard to find... now you can tap your phone and find virtually anything instantly!"

During the 1980's, Green's son, Charles took over the day-to-day operations of Asheford, and is the school's current director. When asked what he thought represented the Institute's high-water mark over the past fifty-years, Green unabashedly responded that the introduction of the school's new online e-Course earlier this year was a game-changer for antique and appraisal education in general. "The e-Course allowed us to bring a half-century worth of teaching expertise to a new and expanded format," said Green. "With the ability to use online interactive

multimedia for instruction, we've really been able to raise the bar in antiques and appraising education for our students." Green went on to say that although online instruction had obviously become the new norm, the "text-book" version would still be offered for a number of years to come.

According to a press statement, as part of the school's year-long celebration, staff from the Institute will also participate in a traveling roadshow to commemorate the school's 50th anniversary. Plans reportedly include tours of major antique events and shows throughout North America, and will incorporate free appraisal clinics, business seminars and evaluations to mark the Institute's anniversary. "We really want to give something back to our students and those interested in antiques," said founder Peter Green, "It's been a great privilege to teach so many... it's just our way of saying thanks." Exact dates for upcoming events have yet to be released, but are expected to be announced later this month according to school spokesperson, Pamela Drew.

Packed Crowd at Beloit Auction & Realty's January 27th Sale

The Richard Lorenz "Apache Warrior" oil painting went to an in-house bidder for \$5300, and bidding reached \$4000 on the Oliver Dennett Grover Venetian canal bridge scene oil painting. Listed Russian artist Vasily Mazur's oil on canvas brought \$300. Franz Hochmann's oil painting sold for \$400.

Other highlights included a Victorian wire plant stand, which brought \$250, a 1952 anatomy school study skeleton in a wooden box that sold for \$425, an autographed James Dean photograph brought \$525, and "Mickey Mouse & Minnie Mouse as Acrobats" with original box sold for \$260. High bids on three original WWI posters ranged from \$80 to \$210. The Catawba Valley pottery jug by Propst Pottery sold for \$360.

A signed Willie Jazzie Navajo sterling silver jewelry set brought \$460, an 18K yellow gold ruby & diamond ring \$850, a 14K white gold and diamond ring \$900, a sterling silver charm bracelet \$160, and a vintage Hamilton Model 22 Chronometer watch in mahogany case \$525.

Several long guns and hand guns (all federal and state laws applied) were integrated in the auction. Hammer price for a Smith & Wesson Model 27-2 was \$650, a

Browning Hi Power Fabrique National Herstal Belgique 9mm pistol \$675, a Hi-Standard Model 104 Supermatic Citation .22LR target pistol \$775.00, and a Universal M1 .30 caliber carbine \$425.00.

\$400 was the winning bid on the Bradley & Hubbard table lamp with reverse painted flowers. An adjustable Victorian wrought iron organ lamp sold for \$210. A pair of Mid-Century Modern cherub lamps on marble top tables brought \$210.

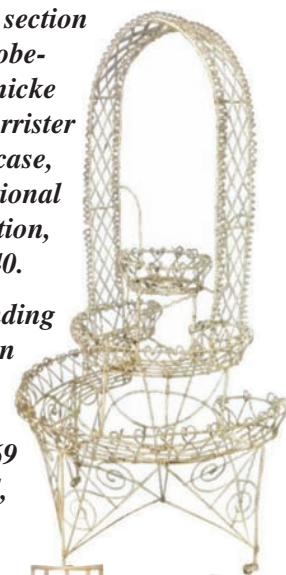

The History of the W. Nelson McCoy's Blue Bird Pottery

W. Nelson McCoy was born in 1820 in Harpers Ferry, Virginia, which is located in West Virginia. In January 1848, he and his wife Ester moved to Ohio's, Muskingum County, Springfield Township, in a community called Putnam. At that time, Putnam was a suburb of Zanesville, but in 1872, it became incorporated into Zanesville.

During the same year as W. Nelson and his wife arrived in Putnam, they had a son whose name was James W. Years later J.W. would go on to establish a well-known pottery, the "J.W. McCoy Pottery".

W. Nelson came to Putnam as a farmer. He acquired some land and built a house. In addition to farming, he also built a small, log building to produce stoneware during the warmer months. The pottery was a small, "Blue Bird" type shop, which was like the ones many of the farmers had at the time. It was primitive in its equipment, and the ware it produced was rough and unfinished. Although during that period, most of the home-owned, "Bluebird" shops operated under primitive conditions.

W. Nelson only produced pottery for a few years, not eight as previously believed. In January 1853, a notice was published in the "Zanesville Daily Courier" stating that a partnership that W. Nelson had with Jeremiah Elder was dissolved. The partnership was in a Putnam grocery store, named Elder & McCoy, which had been established at some uncertain prior time.

On the same date that W. Nelson ended his partnership with Elder, a second notice was published reporting that he had taken another partner, Norman Dodge, in the grocery business. Later W. Nelson bought out Elder, and the name of the grocery was changed to "McCoy & Dodge".

35Considering his job at the grocery, and the labor involved in farming, maintaining his household, supplying clay and firewood for his kiln, one would imagine that W. Nelson only had a small amount of time for actual pottery production. Surely, the volume he produced was small, and it was undoubtedly unmarked, since none that is attributable to him has been found.

Prior to 1853 a grocery store in Zanesville was owned by "James Benjamin & Co.". Sometime after 1858 W. Nelson acquired the major share in the "Benjamin & Co.", and the name of the store was then changed to "McCoy - Benjamin & Co.". Hugh McDonald was another owner besides McCoy and Benjamin.

In addition to the operation of the store itself, James Benjamin had other interests; he was a wholesale dealer in stoneware. The newspaper "Zanes Times Signal" carried an article in 1957 by Norris F. Schneider, who, quoting old sources, said that during the 1870's Benjamin was one of the three major stoneware wholesalers in the region. The other major stoneware wholesalers at the time were J.C. Gillespie, and Hudson C. Ward.

The crock shown is an example of Benjamin's wares. The inscription on it is stenciled in blue ink, and reads, "Jas. Benjamin Wholesale Stoneware Depot Zanesville, O".

W. Nelson is not known to have been associated with James Benjamin in the pottery business in Zanesville. However, he and Benjamin were associated in the pottery business located in Cincinnati. (See the article, "The History of the James Benjamin Potteries and his Connection with W. Nelson McCoy", which is contained on this Web site).

W. Nelson as a long-time, Zanesville businessman, became respected and popular. In 1881, he was elected the mayor of Zanesville, and in 1883, he was reelected. W. Nelson continued managing and working in his grocery and dry goods store until the early 1890's. He died in 1894.

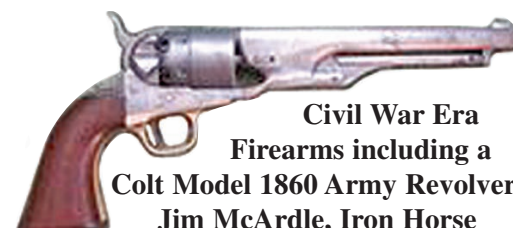

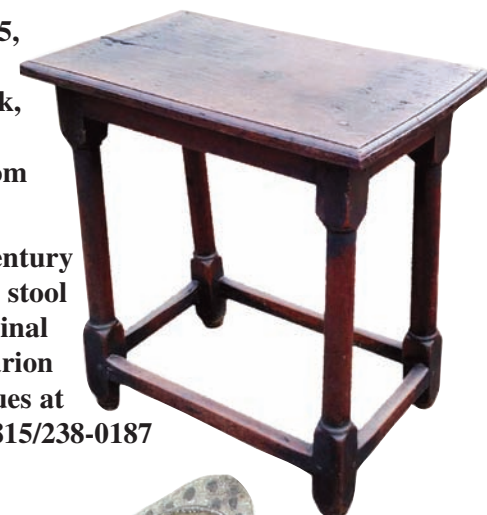
