

Van Briggle Pottery & Tile

In 1899, when Artus Van Briggle stepped off the train in Colorado Springs he must have felt worlds away from the studios of Paris and the landscapes of Italy where his extraordinary talents had so recently flourished. Here, however, surrounded by the beauty of the Rocky Mountains, the defining moments of his life would occur; the twin destinies of a great artistic triumph and an imminent personal tragedy would unfold, leaving in their wake the dawn of a 100 year artistic legacy - Van Briggle Pottery - an American tradition in art pottery since 1899.

Artus Van Briggle, an American artist of Dutch descent, was established as a world class painter in Europe. Having been trained at the finest academies there, and with paintings accepted by the Paris Salon, he received the highest honors for a painter in his day. Yet his artistic passions would ultimate lead him away from his brush, canvas, and easel toward another artistic pursuit that would ultimately define his genius.

Though Artus was a brilliant painter, his artistic passions were most eloquently expressed in the forms and colors of one of history's oldest arts - pottery. From his years as a celebrated artist at the famed Rookwood Pottery in Ohio he knew first-hand the extraordinary range of expression an artist could achieve with the potter's materials. His pursuit was the creation of exquisite satin matte glazes, like those he'd seen on ancient Chinese masterworks, in a palette of glorious colors, never achieved by any artist in modern times. The materials this brilliant artist would use for his greatest artistic pursuit would be minerals from the earth - clays, feldspars, oxides, - and the glowing orange flames of a fiery kiln. When transformed by the creative mind and the skilled hand these materials become the essence of both humanity and nature blended in unity. Clay and glaze are indeed extravagant media, offering the artist a lifetime of challenges and rewards. Artus, however, didn't have a lifetime - tragically, he had contracted tuberculosis and, though a relatively young man, his future was uncertain.

Artus had achieved some success in discovering a formula for these beautiful matte glazes prior to his arrival in Colorado but he continued his work there, seeking a standard of perfection not yet achieved. Pottery is a melding of art and science, and during the time when he conducted his experiments Artus knew success could not come without the patience of a scientist and the passion found in all great artists. He

pursued his vision with tireless effort, though the effects of failing health often interrupted his progress. No specific date is recorded, but one day in the spring of 1901 he reached into the kiln, with the anticipation known well by countless potters throughout the ages, and finally held in his hands the perfect, rich, matte-glazed pottery he had sought for so long - the first pieces created in centuries, the first ever on this side of the world. Against the odds of failing health and a pursuit which no western artist had ever achieved, he succeeded; his passion was realized - a lost art was now reborn. The world would once again see and touch of the soft marble-like glazes first known by ancient Chinese masters half a world and so many generations away.

When you hold in your hand a piece of fine artistry and craftsmanship, a human creation with elegant lines and a sensual surface - something experienced by the eyes and hands and ultimately felt by the soul, you'll know what Artus Van Briggle was seeking - and what he ultimately achieved. He lived to see his artistic passion fulfilled before his own mortality could eclipse his dream. Though the sun setting on his own life, a new era was on the horizon for one of the oldest arts in history.

Once perfected, Artus Van Briggle's exquisite new glazes graced his elegant Art Nouveau pottery designs which were sent across the Atlantic and, when shown to Europe's best art judges, were proclaimed, "A supreme discovery in modern ceramics." Soon, art critics across the continents marveled at his works, lavished him with praise, and brought international acclaim to this quiet American artist on the Colorado frontier.

Before long, he succumbed to tuberculosis and died there in the shadow of the Rocky Mountains, but not before receiving word that when shown at Exhibitions here in the United States and in the Salons of Europe, his creations had won their highest awards.

Van Briggle Pottery is the living heritage of an extraordinary artist whose heart and hands were given only half a lifetime, and to his wife, Anne, whose own dedication and fine artistry after Artus' death carried their vision to success in its earliest years. Together they left a timeless and permanent imprint on the tradition of American art pottery. With each passing year and with each new piece created, their artistic legacy continues, a legacy in known as:

Van Briggle - a Tradition in American Art Pottery since 1899.



Visitors From Around the World Gather for the Annual Chicagoland Antique Advertising, Slot Machine & Jukebox Show

"I've been here 63 shows in a row, never missed one," said John Pappa of the National Jukebox Exchange in Mayfield, N.Y. Although the dealer sets up to sell, he buys too, and quickly purchased "a very difficult to



"This one is too nice to sell -- I'm taking it home with me." said dealer John Papa. He purchased the "very difficult to find 1946 Wurlitzer 1080 jukebox" just outside the fairgrounds building shortly before the show opened.

find all-original 1946 Wurlitzer 1080 jukebox" before the show "from a guy in a van parked next to me who had it laying on its side." Although Papa valued the 78 rpm record playing machine at \$6,500, he chuckled and said it was "too nice to sell – I'm taking it home with me." One jukebox Papa did offer for sale was a 1958 Seeburg model 162 that could play 80 45rpm records at your place for \$4,000.

Once again, the largest display of the show was hosted by Bill Rawski, Zap Props of Chicago, sprawled over 10 booths with coin-operated and vintage advertising items. Coke collectors stopped to gawk at his mint condition 7-foot-long die-cut 1950-60s cardboard foot-tall Coca-Cola "festoon." The rarely seen piece illustrating Coke and vintage auto themes could hang at your place for \$4,500. Toy collectors checked out his mint condition painted tin 1920s

Gilbert Erector Set advertising display with die-cut windows displaying four different items from the famous toymaker. It could sit on your shelf for \$6,000.

Rawski also announced he was exploring the idea of forming a "Coin Op & Advertising Dealer

Association" to promote the hobby, and invited interested people to contact him via cell phone at 773-848-0120 for more information.

Frank Zygmunt Jr. of Westmond, Ill., filled several booths with vintage slot machines including a fancy mammoth upright 1910 wood and cast iron Caillie Black Cat slot machine upright payout slot, with music box, for \$90,000 – but Zygmunt called attention to a lesser priced machine. "I've seen most every slot machine over the years, but never this one" he said, pointing to a quarter play double Mills Bonus High Top slot that he called "ultra rare," with a relatively modest price tag of \$8,000.

Several tables and shelves of gambling and vending machines filled the booth of Jan Pursell of Herrin, Ill. Drawing lots of attention was an early 1900s cast iron and wood countertop Mills Brownie slot featuring the famous Cox Brownie on the front, and a price tag of \$4,000. Sitting nearby at the same

price, was a Royal Ace classic round globe cast iron base vender that Pursell called "only one of six known."

"This one was featured in the 1950s movie, 'Quicksand' "said dealer Alex Warschaw pointing to a 5-foot-tall coin operated metal stand-on foot massage machine that he said could give you a treatment for a nickel – plus purchase price of \$1,500. The Phoenix Ariz., dealer hung a "sold" sign on a countertop cast iron Bat-A-Penny top coin operated baseball machine tagged at \$3,000.

Another coin operated baseball machine, this one an action filled 1972 Williams Line Drive pinball machine, gained lots of attention in the booth of Paul Reno, Home Game Room Supply, Franksville, Wis. Priced at \$2,695, it was just one of the packed booth of pinball machines priced from \$1,200 to \$5,600 each, with "another 30-40 back at the shop," according to Reno. His wife Carrie, a special education teacher, took time away from the

special education teacher, took time away from the classroom to assist at the Chicagoland Show.

Life size re-created coin op arcade machines filled the booth of Bob Sossa of North Olmstead, Ohio. Many folks stopped to gawk at his 8-foot-tall oak and cast iron penny operated Humpty Dumpty, with cone shaped hat, priced at \$4,500. Sossa estimated it took about 50 hours to create the device.

Others checked out his standup tin nickel operated

Glossy original vintage rec room machines that were restored to what some folks called "like new condition" were featured at the booth of Rod and Janet Heuerman of Fun-Tronics, Teutopolis, Ill. An ice chest type floor model 1940s Royal Crown Cola cooler could keep your beverages chilled for a cool \$4,800. And snacks could be served at your home from a 10-cent coin operated floor model dome top 1950s T & C Co. old fashioned popcorn stand, priced at \$3,400. For a more moderate wallet the couple had items priced at \$125 and up.

Several dozen popcorn items were featured by Marque Popcorn Co. of Rockford, Ill. Joe Verace and Christine Schneider showed off poster-size framed copies of famous popcorn box advertising they termed "home décor wall art," priced each.

The couple said a buyer could take it home from the show, or they could ship the machine anywhere in the country for \$145.

Vintage toy collectors were drawn to the booth of Keith Miller of New Franklin, Ohio who offered select goodies. "I love my toys," said the dealer pointing to a 1934 Daisy Buck Rogers 10-long-pistol with holster that he said was "the first space toy made" ready to draw and shoot anywhere for \$400. Other shoppers checked out his 1954 Nichols Toy Co., 30-inchlong cast metal and plastic Fury 500 cap-shooting machine gun --

-The Chicagoland show usually hosts many offbeat items, and this show was no exception. Samples included a stunning condition 1920s woman's lifesize wax head with real stitched-in-hair and glass eyes, thought to have been used in a stand-up fortune telling machine, priced at \$2,000. "She has thicker hair than I do," joked dealer Jo Addie, Somewhere In Time Antiques of La Grange Park, Ill. At the same spot, jewelry collectors could checked out hundreds of 1920s Deco/Nouveau Czech items ready to wear home for \$135 to \$465 each. As in years past, chatter from the crowd came in many languages as foreign



The American Society of Military Insignia Collectors

The American Society of Military Insignia Collectors, commonly known as ASMIC, is one of the oldest and largest organizations of military insignia collectors in the world. Founded in 1937 by a small group of enthusiastic collectors, it is chartered under Ohio law and recognized as non-profit 501 (c) (3) organization. The Society is "home" today to 2,000 dedicated collectors in the United States and foreign nations. Whether an individual is an experienced or beginning collector shoulder sleeve and distinctive unit insignia (patches and DIs), rank insignia, wings, decorations and awards (medals), elite forces emblems, cap badges, specialty markings, or of simply information on heraldry and the symbolism of heraldic devices, membership in ASMIC has many advantages.

ASMIC publishes a quarterly journal entitled The Trading Post and a Newsletter. The Trading Post contains a wealth of information on all aspects of U. S. and foreign military insignia. It includes articles from members, illustrations of old and new emblems as well as an occasional color section depicting American or foreign insignia. Unidentified Insignia are covered in a separate column in The Trading Post

The Newsletter brings word of insignia and dress items for trade or sale via classified and display ads. Society members rely on the Newsletter to advertise for insignia they wish to include in their collections and for announcements of regional and national insignia and militaria shows.

The ASMIC Reference Library contains almost 1000 items available for loan to members. These publications range from back issues of The Trading Post to major reference works published by our members and other militaria experts. The Library also includes many journals from other militaria societies for use by our members

Over the years, ASMIC has produced more than 20,000 black and white line drawings of military insignia, along with detailed descriptions of the insignia and known variations. 





The auction kicked off at 10:00 am on Saturday with over 200 lots of non-cataloged items, for just in-house bidders. Auctioneers Fred Van Metre and Tom Millie sailed through those by noon. When the first cataloged lot came to the podium, the house bidders were joined by an additional internet following from 37

countries across the globe. When Sunday's session wrapped up, those bidders captured nearly half the auction. According to Penn,
