The Chupp Brothers - Lyle, Dale and Devon - certainly know how to how to throw together a good party and lively auctions.





The next day, the show continued, beginning at 8 a.m. in the auction facility, until 4:30 a.m. Shortly afterward the Chupp brothers provided a feast for some 225 hay tool buyers and sellers. Served were mouth-watering ribs, potatoes, fresh chicken breast and beans over an open fire.

The food was catered, according to Lyle Chupp, with the Chupp women and children serving the food, followed by a small "warm up" auction of some 225 uncataloged items that already had some of the bidders cranked-up for the "big auction" set for the following day.

Shipshewana, named after a local Potawatomi Indian from the 19th century, is the perfect location for buying, selling and displaying antique farm tools. Located in LaGrange County, abutting the Michigan state line, the area is the third largest Amish community in the country. Throughout the gently rolling countryside, colorful quilt-pattern murals adorn historic barns, family homesteads and public spaces.

It is here that Indiana's first Barn Quilt Trail celebrates the history of agriculture, the time-honored tradition of quilting and the community's passion for art.

But on Saturday, the real action began at 8:30 a.m. when around 300 bidders from 17 different states, plus Canadian bidders, began queuing up for the auction featuring 500 lots of hay collector, country store, advertising, petroliana, pocket watches, antique firearms, John Deer tractors, farm primitives and more.

"People were ready for this auction," Lyle Chupp said. "When I arrived there at 7:30 (a.m.), there were already people waiting to get in."

> The crowd was not disappointed, for the offerings were truly spectacular. Selling for \$20,000 was an early Success No. 21B horse-drawn manure spreader. In excellent condition, thought to have never been used, the museum piece had its original early paint and stenciling. Bidding was very strong - both onsite and live Internet bidding - for what was described as one of the best early original manure spreaders. The Success company was later purchased by John Deere.

Speaking of John Deere, there were four of the old hit-and-miss tractors, dating from the 1930s. that crossed the auction block. One tractor, a 1934 John Deere Model GPPA, completely restored and featuring a dazzling green color sold for \$9,000.

The prices quoted are hammer prices. For onsite auctions, Chupps Auctions does not charge a buyer's premium. Internet bidders, however, pay a fee.

Other items selling for a top dollar, included an Advance salesman sample hay carrier on a homemade stand, selling for \$14,000; and an early 1-horse delivery wagon, identified by excellent stenciling (and original paint) as a "Chas. Ulmer of Holland, NJ with 📝 a Geo. Snyder maker's tag, \$11,000.


A 28-inch by 16-inch Kreso Dip Livestock and Poultry stand-up counter sign sold for \$5,750; a salesman sample of a Bull hog oiler, measuring 4-inches tall, brought \$5,000; and a Studebaker cement pillar topper from Studebaker Proving Grounds, went for \$4,700.

A 4-foot by 54-inches Brahmans cattle sign sold for \$3,000; a 35-inch tall metal Cow-Ease Sprayer display sign with superior graphics, sold for \$2,500; a Perfection cow tail holder

with original 1891 label, earned a top bid of \$2,750; a 42-inch in diameter "Studebaker Authorized Service" sign, brought \$2,900; and a 48-inch in diameter "Studebaker Authorized Sales & Service" sign with a metal frame brought \$4,500.

Chupp Auctions next big sale is scheduled for the last weekend of October, where they will be selling country store items, advertising, farm items and much more.





In later life, Sousa crisscrossed the country encouraging high schools to develop top-notch bands and orchestras. Sousa's untiring efforts and international stature as well as composing over 100 marches, 9 operettas along with many orchestral suites, have given him the well-deserved title of "The March King".

A Brief History of Antique Pressed Glass

Pressed Glass, also referred to as Pattern Glass, was produced between 1850 to 1910. The majority was produced in the 1880's. When it was originally designed, it was intended for everyday use and was made to be very durable and at the same time, attractive.

Families would use glassware as part of their table setting or for entertaining guests. For these reasons, producers made many different patterns to attract the customer to buy their products. Once a pattern was designed, it was patented along with its name so that it could not be duplicated, unless patents or molds were sold to other companies.

Often competitors would produce similar patterns or similar names, if the pattern proved to be popular with the public. For example, the "Flamingo" pattern has similarities to the "Clear Flamingo" pattern, not only in looks, but name as well.

Pressed Glass was produced in both Canada and the United States, with American companies outnumbering Canadian factories. Each year companies competed to produce the most attractive and popular patterns. Pressed Glass patterns were designed and then duplicated into a cast iron mold. The mold was then fired at an extreme temperature. The pieces of the mold were pulled away from the glass and the piece was left to cool.

If you examine a piece of pressed glass you will always find either two, three or four seams running through the glass, although sometimes the seams were well hidden in the pattern. The number of mold lines in a piece of glass does not determine the age. If the piece was small, manufacturers would use a two piece mold; if they were making compotes they would use a three piece mold. When manufacturers made punch bowls, they would use a four piece mold because of its large size, or a four piece mold was used for square patterns to help create the shape.

Around the 1920's, Pressed Glass lost its popularity and crystal became the 'in thing'. Affordable crystal was being shipped from Europe and France. When the depression came, people could no longer afford crystal and returned to pressed glass, or "the affordable glassware." This new period of glassware became known as "Depression Glass". It was produced the same way, pressed into a cast iron mold, but in different patterns and colours to brighten your day.

When manufacturers began producing pressed glass (1850-1910); patterns ranged from very plain to very elaborate cut glass imitations. The market tried and tested each pattern. Even patterns with Animals, Fruits and Florals were designed and created, with attention to fine details. Some of the patterns were produced as full table settings, while others were produced only in goblet form or single tableware pieces. People originally bought goblets and tableware for their beauty and artistic design. In addition, it was functional and affordable.

Just as ladies back then were collecting, trading and buying pressed glass for gifts, we continue to do so today. Collectors enjoy choosing and finding their favourite patterns among the over 3000 known patterns produced in early Pressed Glass.






