






The NIADA Antiques Show was the very first show I covered for this newspaper - way back in 2003. It's still one of my favorites, with a flavor different from any other show I've attended. Perhaps the more intimate scale of the show has something to do with it. Or maybe it's the unique mix of dealers, many of who are longtime NIADA members.

Forest Hills Lodge hosted this fifty-sixth edition of the NIADA show, as they have for more than twenty years. You couldn't ask for a better venue for the show. It's just off of I-90, on Route 173 at the northern edge of Rockford. Parking is free, and it's only a modest \$6.00 donation for show entry. Proceeds from the show, as always, are donated to several local non-profit historical associations.

I always find lots of outstanding 19th century American country furniture and accessories at the NIADA Show, and this year was no exception. Pipsqueak & Me Antiques is always a good place to start looking. A great mix of period pieces awaited there, my pick an elegant 18th century country Chippendale high chest priced at only \$1,095. More fine country and primitive furnishings were to be found all over

the show, from Prairie Dock Antiques' classic Pennsylvania blanket in a faux-grain mustard finish to Gwen LeFevre's display of antique Scandinavian decoratives.

Want something a little funkier? Look no further than Little Bohemia Antiques, where a pretty-cool stenciled country store tin peanut warmer sat along Mid Century fine art. And a dated-1944 quilt from Old Smith Company drew lots of lookers too made from more than one-thousand Pabst Beer advertising ribbons in honor of their Peoria Plant's 100th anniversary.

It's great pieces like that that have kept folks coming back to this show year after year. I hope the photos give you a taste of what the NIADA Antiques Show has to offer. Be sure to pencil in February of 2017 and come out for the 57th edition of the Show! 





2012 Gave us a wonderful opportunity to see some gresh new items that captured the attention of all collectors. First, one of our collectors found the Oscar Peterson plaque on the left on the left on eBay. No one could have understood its character until you saw it in person. It drew a lot of attention at the preview & even more attention when it finallly hit the auction block. I found myself looking at it & then walking away & going back to absorb more of its character. Sold for \$123,000 it commanded a value that reflected just how special it is. I'm sure that as the information gets out about this wonderful item we will see more of these special efforts surface. Oscar Peterson did a wide range of items & this plaque is certainly special.

I can easily see Marty, Cameron or another carver doing this type of item for their residences, shops or hunt spaces. I have been in several hunt clubs that could sponsor such work. On the right is the Beckhart duck call that came to the show for appraisal. It is definitely a wow. Carved on all sides with amazing detail it is definitely a sight to behold. It went to auction this summer & sommanded a record bringing \$103,500 in spirited bidding. Both of these items are great examples of the terrific American Folk Art that is still being discovered across the country. I hope that the call will inspire some of the call makers & call collectors to new levels of energy in their efforts.

The American Society of Military Insignia Collectors

The American Society of Military Insignia Collectors, commonly known as ASMIC, is one of the oldest and largest organizations of military insignia collectors in the world. Founded in 1937 by a small group of enthusiastic collectors, it is chartered under Ohio law and recognized as non-profit 501 (c) (3) organization. The Society is "home" today to 2,000 dedicated collectors in the United States and foreign nations. Whether an individual is an experienced or beginning collector shoulder sleeve and distinctive unit insignia (patches and DIs), rank insignia, wings, decorations and awards (medals), elite forces emblems, cap badges, specialty markings, or of simply information on heraldry and the symbolism of heraldic devices, membership in ASMIC has many advantages.

ASMIC publishes a quarterly journal entitled The Trading Post and a Newsletter. The Trading Post contains a wealth of information on all aspects of U. S. and foreign military insignia. It includes articles from members, illustrations of old and new emblems as well as an occasional color section depicting American or foreign insignia. Unidentified Insignia are covered in a separate column in The Trading Post

The Newsletter brings word of insignia and dress items for trade or sale via classified and display ads. Society members rely on the Newsletter to advertise for insignia they wish to include in their collections and for announcements of regional and national insignia and militaria shows.

The ASMIC Reference Library contains almost 1000 items available for loan to members. These publications range from back issues of The Trading Post to major reference works published by our members and other militaria experts. The Library also includes many journals from other militaria societies for use by our members

Over the years, ASMIC has produced more than 20,000 black and white line drawings of military insignia, along with detailed descriptions of the insignia and known variations. Most of these drawings are available in our Distinctive Insignia or Cloth Patch catalogs, available to the general public and, at a discounted price, to ASMIC members.






