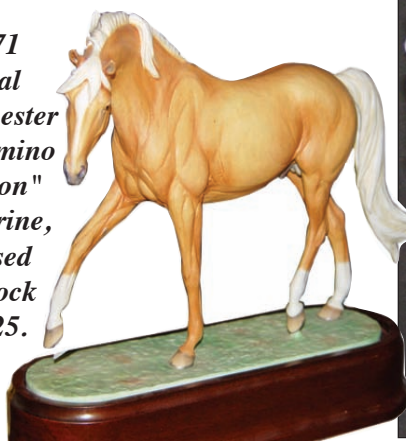
Horse Collectibles Bring Strong Prices at Munda 2 Day Auction

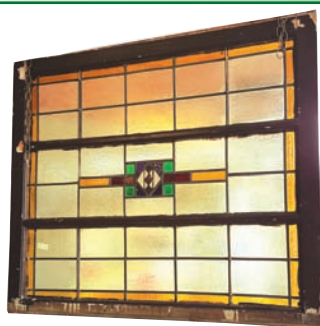

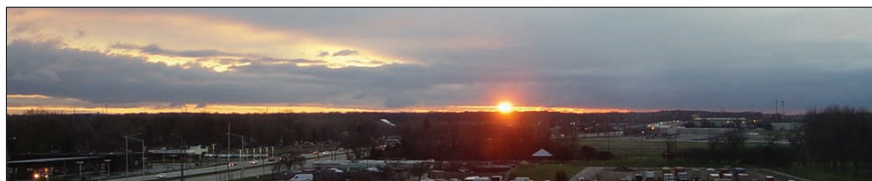

Fantastic Pieces Draw Crowds at Chicagoland Antique Advertising, Slot Machine & Jukebox Show

Foot traffic came to a halt at the multiple-booth display of Frank Zygmunt Jr., of Westmont, Ill., where more than 70 slot and coin operated machines were priced from \$800 to \$125,000. Capturing lots of attention was a showy 20-inch-tall nickel plated cast iron 1915 Caille slot machine priced at \$45,000. Sitting next to it was a 1910 Mills Imperial Shocker wood and cast iron machine that offered a mild "jolt" for one penny - and a payment of \$18,000.

Slot buyers with lighter wallets checked out three expertly restored examples shown by dealer Dave Close. They included a silver dollar 1940s Pace for \$3,200, a 1930s penny operated Watling Baby Bell, \$3,200, and a 1930s Bertmeier Pony 2 Reel Slot priced at \$3,000. Close said it was a six-hour drive to Chicagoland from his home in Lake City, Minn.

Looking for a restored flashy light-up 1940s Wurlitzer jukebox that could play 24 78-rpm records in a row? Tim Walker of Milwaukee, Wis., was your man. He pointed with pride to a 1940s 1015 juke tagged at \$6,900, then to a model 1100 priced at \$6,000 and a Victory Model 42 that could play sweet tunes at your place for \$6,800. Walker said he had been collecting and restoring these machines for 30 years, starting at age 10 with his grandfather, Melvin Walker.

Collectors looking for a good selection of counter-top coin operated trade stimulators, and parts were drawn to the booth of Ken and Jackie Durham, who drove to the show from Washington, D.C. Three dozen machines priced from \$800 to \$1,600 filled their booth. When asked how many years they had been setting up at Chicagoland, Jackie smiled and said, "Since the late '70s" adding, "We're like the swallows of Capistrano -- we just keep returning year after year."

"Look at those match machines" blurted one shopper, pointing at seven penny operated machines priced from \$150 to \$3,495. At the same spot, dealer Paul Hinden of Mequon, Wis., pointed with pride to a 16-inch-tall cast iron 1915 Hance peanut machine that could vend goodies at your place for \$4,495.

"It's a mystery machine, none of the experts have ever seen one," said John Verber of Orland Park, Ill., adding "It may have been a prototype." The 10-inch-tall cast iron penny operated heavy round glass globe vendor carried no manufacturer's name. Verber said he estimated it's era to be 1905-1910 and he priced the device at \$3,500.

It took 10 hours for collector-sellers Rene and Monica De Paoli to fly to the show from Switzerland, a trip they both said "was really worth it." It was the third time at Chicagoland for the couple, who said overseas foreign friends with shipping containers would transport the couples items back home. Rene said with a laugh, "There is so much cool stuff here, I may run out of money!"

As the title of the show states, it's all about vintage advertising too, and nobody had a bigger selection than Bill Rawski of Zap Props, Inc., Chicago. His offerings stretched across 12 booths and included a giant 6-foot-long Mobil gasoline flying red horse priced at \$6,500. Many people stopped to gawk at his aluminum and cast iron 8-foot-tall ornately crafted two-unit 1920s traffic light with three lenses on opposite sides that could direct traffic at your place for \$4,500.

The show was once again "a family affair" as dealer Nathan Lippe of Hanover Park, Ill., showed off a large selection of collectable signs --with assistance again from daughter Charlotte, 6. The young "sales lady" plopped an advertising bread truck drivers hat on her head and with a big smile, held up a 1950s 44-inch-long Table Queen Bread tin advertising sign tagged at \$350. At the same spot, several dozen other gas, oil and general advertising signs could be purchased.

Yet another father-daughter team was at the Chicagoland event. Kristina Kesely joined her father George again this year, noting she had been "helping Dad buy and sell at Chicagoland and giving out free hot dogs starting at 5 years old." That early devotion paid off as she recently earned her Ph.D. in chemistry from Purdue University! Both proud-father and daughter wore "items-wanted" collector t-shirts at the April show promoting Dad's phone number in Munster, Ind.

Pepsi-Cola Collectors hovered around the 10-by 24-inch tin 5-cent Pepsi-Cola sign offered for \$850 by David Wolfe of Athens, Ga. Still others checked out his deep-color Indian trademark illustration 18- by 24-inch Devoe Paint from the 1940s tin sign priced at \$450. Wolfe called the Chicagoland event "a decent show with good buys and plenty to see."

Even though advertising and coin operated devices were the cornerstone of the show, the event has the reputation of offering "just about anything desirable and col-

lectable." Thus, foot traffic came to a stop for a close look the lifelike 5-foot-tall 1893 bronze figure of "Little Egypt" shown by Wheeling Sale Barn of Wheeling, Ill. The life-size piece was said to have been shown at the 1893 World Columbian Expo in Chicago - and could grace your home for \$9,500.

"I'm sold out," smiled B.J. Pawlaczyk as he looked over sold signs on his display of 22 restored outboard motors. He added, "One customer bought all I had left, cleaning me out." The 1914 through 1952 lavishly restored outboards were priced between \$1,100 and \$5,500 each.

The "Dutch Pickers" from the Netherlands, Astrid and Ben Franse, were at the show to purchase collectables to take home for resale- and to show off their new book - about Marilyn Monroe!

The couple purchased a large quantity of jukeboxes and arcade games from a dealer in California 20 years ago and convinced the dealer to include a box of newspaper clippings and photos from the owner of the Blue Book Model Agency, Marilyn's first entry into stardom. Taking the box home, the couple said it was stored under a desk until it was re-discovered again.. The forgotten box contained many never-before-seen photos and information about Marilyn before she became famous.

That discovery led to publishing a hardcover 238-page book titled "Before Marilyn /The Blue Book Modeling Years" available from all major internet sellers for around \$25.

Meanwhile, author-collector Bill Howard of Akron, Ohio, was autographing and selling his book, "Every Picture Tells a Story, Supplement." The enertaing 205-page 9-by 12-inch hardbound book follows up his first book offering from 2005, detailing information and photos about his personal collection of coin operated devices and advertising displays. As stated inside, the book offers "A whimsical romp through America's Past." Only 250 copies of the book have been printed, priced at \$75 each. Howard can be reached at 1-330-773-8687.

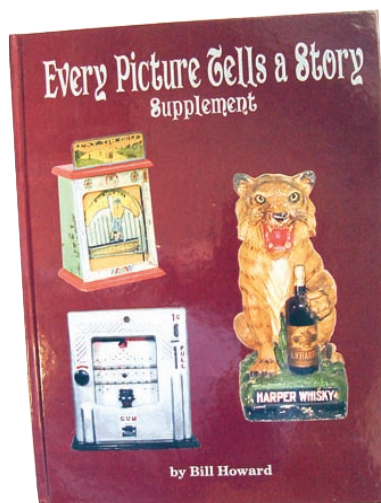

Once again, the covered walkways between the hotel and Mega Center show location offered plenty of shelter from rain, wind and sometimes snow that pelted the area on and off during the weekend.

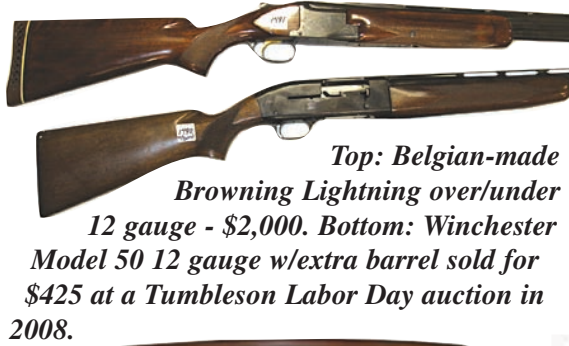

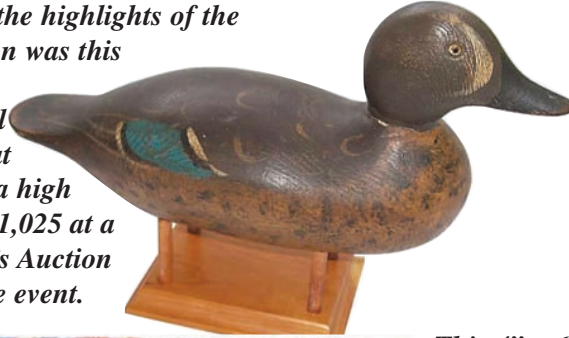

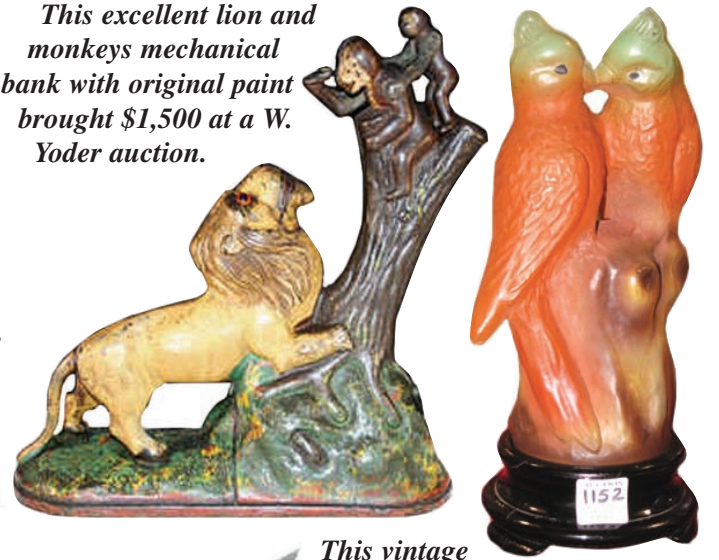

Antique & Appraisal School Celebrates Half-Century Milestone



Ashford Director, Charles Green Celebrating School's 50th Anniversary

While not quite considered an "antique" just yet, the Ashford Institute of Antiques, a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles, and appraising, turned fifty this past week, marking a milestone in antiques and appraising education, as the longest running Institute of its kind. Although the school premiered its home-study program to the antique world in late 1965, it didn't officially open its doors to students until 1966.

"We've seen an awful lot of changes since our inception" said Peter Green, the Institute's original founder. Green, who started the school based on the notion that there was a need for antique and appraisal education, said he could hardly believe how the antique and appraisal services market had grown over the past 50 years – "I can remember when antique stores were hard to find... now you can tap your phone and find virtually anything instantly!"

During the 1980's, Green's son, Charles took over the day-to-day operations of Ashford, and is the school's current director. When asked what he thought represented the Institute's high-water mark over the past fifty-years, Green unabashedly responded that the introduction of the school's new online e-Course earlier this year was a game-changer for antique and appraisal education in general. "The e-Course allowed us to bring a half-century worth of teaching expertise to a new and expanded format," said Green. "With the ability to use online interactive

multimedia for instruction, we've really been able to raise the bar in antiques and appraising education for our students." Green went on to say that although online instruction had obviously become the new norm, the "text-book" version would still be offered for a number of years to come.

According to a press statement, as part of the school's year-long celebration, staff from the Institute will also participate in a traveling roadshow to commemorate the school's 50th anniversary. Plans reportedly include tours of major antique events and shows throughout North America, and will incorporate free appraisal clinics, business seminars and evaluations to mark the Institute's anniversary. "We really want to give something back to our students and those interested in antiques," said founder Peter Green, "It's been a great privilege to teach so many... it's just our way of saying thanks." Exact dates for upcoming events have yet to be released, but are expected to be announced later this month according to school spokesperson, Pamela Drew.

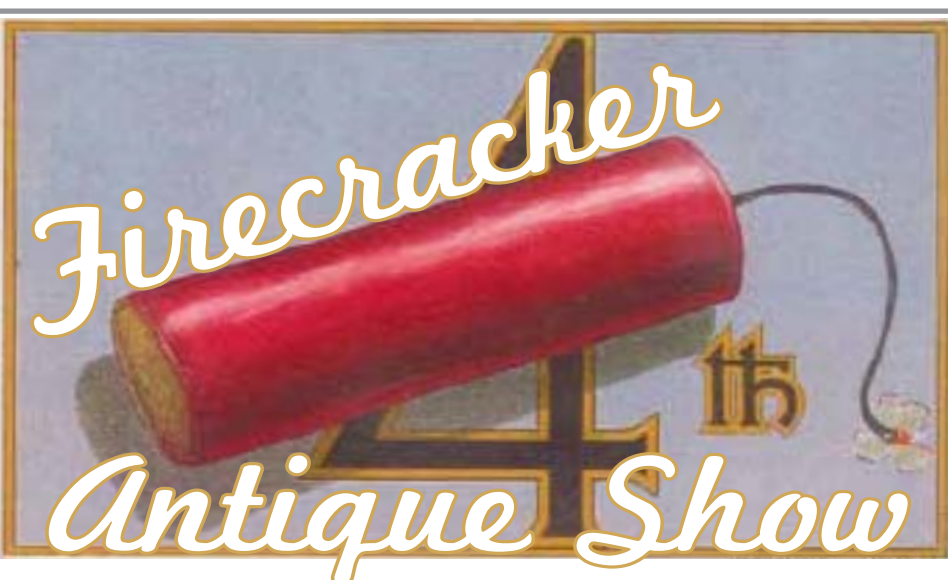

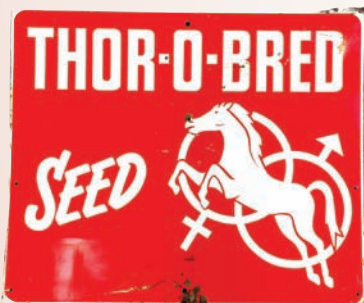
