Tuscola, Illinois is a quintessentially Midwestern town, home to around 4,500 folks and the seat of Douglas County. The imposing Douglas County Courthouse dominates the town center, but the area is known much better for something else: its large and growing Amish community, founded in the 1860s and now numbering nearly five-thousand strong. A significant tourism industry has grown right along with them too, with dozens of shops selling Amish-made products ranging from rustic furniture to handmade cheeses

As you might imagine, the picturesque area is natural location for country-oriented antiques shows. The "A Gathering on the Prairie" show was the first of the now four antiques shows participating in the Illinois Amish Country Spring Antiques Weekend, and just celebrated its thirteenth season. It and two other antiques shows are located in Nearby Arthur, Illinois, with this Rural Life Antique Show & Sale just down the road in Tuscola.



Antiques & Appraising School Launches "New" e-Course

The Asheford Institute of Antiques (AIA), a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising, recently rolled out its first ever online "e-Course," at an industry trade gathering earlier this month, in anticipation of the schools 50th anniversary to be held in New York later this year.

Described by school spokesperson Shelly Dumont, as a watershed moment for the Institute, Dumont said the school's first foray into e-learning was consistent with Asheford's innovative and groundbreaking teaching techniques employed

over the last 50 years. "When we offer something new, we like to take the time to make sure it's done right," said Dumont at a Q & A session following the announcement.

When asked about the differences in curriculum between textbooks and the new e-Course format of the program, Dumont said there was literally no comparison. "In terms of sheer volume, it's almost double the size of the printed version, and comes loaded with interactive videos, multimedia-activities, web-based resource links, and a host of other features we simply can't add into the texts." Dumont went on to say that the e-Course had been in development for almost two years by the school's IT team, before any release dates were even considered.

Industry insiders attending the trade gathering were granted temporary passcodes to the e-Course, and were given full access to the programs options and features at a demonstration held during the event. Director of the school, Charles Green presided over the presentation, and noted during the unveiling, that the program had undergone almost a year of beta-testing by international students prior to its intended release in North America.

A statement issued from the school's Admissions Officer, Tony Drew seemed to indicate a "full" release date for the new e-Course to be some time in mid-July. "We don't want to rush it, but we're really pleased with the response so far," said Drew, "We think the e-Course is really going to be a game-changer when it comes to setting the bar for future antiques and appraising education." The press release went on to say that while the textbooks for the Asheford program were still available, they would likely be phased out in the next five to ten years.

In 1989 Mike Nogay, a dedicated reel collector from West Virginia, decided that it was time for reel collectors to have their own organization. He thought up the name, had the club logo designed, and had ORCA incorporated as a non-profit, educational corporation in the state of West Virginia.

On October 9, 1990 a letter was mailed out to reel collectors that had expressed an interest in the formation of such a club. Finally in January 1991 the first Newsletter of the Old Reel Collectors Association, Inc. was mailed to the original 36 charter members.

From those first wobbly steps, ORCA has grown into an adventurous adolescent. As ORCA passed our tenth anniversary in 2000, we have reached our identity. ORCA's membership currently remains between 800 and 1000 dedicated members.

The original four page newsletter has now grown into a 32-36 page magazine, The Reel News. The first ORCA Convention was held in Pennsylvania in June, 1999. This event was a fully rounded Convention rather than just a tackle show. In 1998 ORCA was the first tackle collector's club to jump into the electronic age, with its own Web Site, and electronic data to help out our members who are on line.

ORCA is headed toward maturity with a full head of steam. There is no longer a question of whether ORCA is going to make it. 
