### G.I. Joe Collectibles Still Popular With Grown-Up Boys

A G.I. Joe accessory kit brought \$900, while 3 early GI Joe figure sets sold for \$3,120. While these prices were strong, the market for Victorian dolls is still relatively soft, with many of those dolls bringing under \$100.

Saturday and Sunday were both double ring sales that packed the 30,000 square foot gallery. These sales also included Native American items, guns, military collectibles, edged weapons, and 19th-21st Century antiques and collectibles. The Native American collectibles included a beautiful collection of silver and turquoise cuff bracelets, the highest selling for \$450, and a silver and turquoise necklace that brought \$660. This sale also included a large assortment of beaded items with prices

While there were items from approximately 50 different consignments and estates, a large portion of it came from one Chicago area estate. Normally, collectors of guns and Militaria tend to be males, but this collector turned out to be a woman. A rarity to be sure. With approximately 150 guns being offered, the crowd was highly com-

petitive. A Colt 1849 pocket percussion revolver brought a total of \$1,320, and a Colt Python double action revolver brought \$2,160. The auction continued on the a strong path with a Sharps 1859 conversion carbine selling for \$1,560 and a Winchester lever action saddle ring carbine found a new home for \$2,640. The crowd stayed on

for the Militaria portion of the sale with strong prices continuing. A German WWII canvas 6-clip holder for MG 38-40" brought \$540, while a reproduction Prussian style helmet even brought \$1,800. A group of U.S. and German helmets

sold for \$3,000. At the end of the sale only the anglers remained, looking over a large assortment of lures, rods, and reels. Tackle boxes with lures included sold for as much as \$570 and

#### **Antique Motorcycle Club of America**

The Antique Motorcycle Club of America was founded in 1954 by a group of antique-bike fans in the New England area (pictured from left are T.A. Hodgdon, Emmett Moore, Henry Wing Sr., and Henry Wing Jr.). AMCA FoundersIn the decades since, the AMCA has grown to become one of the largest organizations of antique-motorcycle enthusiasts in the world, with 11,000 members in the United States and more than a dozen other countries.

Owner with three-wheeled motorcycleFrom the beginning, the purpose of the club has been the "preservation, restoration and operation of old-time motorcycles." Members of the AMCA own, restore, preserve, study or just admire motorcycles that fall into the antique category, meaning they are at least 35 years old. Although the Club is based in the United States, fans of motorcycles from all countries are welcome, and ownership of an antique motorcycle is not required to become a member.

Through its network of 59 affiliated Chapters in the U.S. and abroad, the AMCA provides a way for antique-bike fans to share their interest with others in their local area. Chapters typically host regular meetings, plus activities like bike shows, swap meets and antique-bike road runs.

At the national and international level, the AMCA maintains a calendar of National Meets and Road Runs that include some of the premier antique-motorcycle gatherings in the world. National Meets typically include a large vendor area, where members can sell everything from antique-bike parts to entire motorcycles that are at least 35 years old. In addition, National Meets offer a full schedule of other activities, ranging from seminars and bike shows to motorcycle field games and antique-bike racing.

Judging All National Meets also feature the AMCA's National Judging Program, in which members' motorcycles can win awards in three categories: Restored, Original Condition or Period Modified. Instead of competing against each other, bikes entered in the AMCA Judging Program are evaluated on a 100-point scale against the standard of the same motorcycle as it would have appeared when it originally left the factory.

National Road Runs provide an opportunity to use these classic machines for their intended purpose—riding on back roads in some of the most scenic parts of the coun-

In addition to those events, AMCA members also get access to a number of benefits, including a high-quality magazine six times per year, online forums where they can seek advice from experts, and the AMCA Virtual Motorcycle Library, featuring downloadable copies of hundreds of old and rare sales brochures, parts lists and repair manuals. Plus, AMCA members receive discounts on admission to some of the country's premier motorcycle museums.

Mostly, though, people join the AMCA to meet up with others who share their interest in machines from the classic era of motorcycling. For some, that means the satisfaction that comes from investing thousands of hours in bringing a rusted hulk back to it original perfection. To others, it means preserving artifacts of the past so that they can be appreciated by future generations, or the simple pleasure of enjoying a two-lane road at an unhurried pace—just like motorcyclists generations ago.





#### HISTORY OF THE FOSTORIA GLASS COMPANY 1887 - 1986

The Fostoria Glass Company began operations in Fostoria, Ohio, on December 15, 1887. This site was chosen because natural gas at a recently opened field in the area had been offered at a very low cost to attract new industries. However, the field was so short-lived that in 1891, Fostoria moved to Moundsville, West Virginia, where there was an abundance of gas and coal, and other needed materials were close by.

During its first ten years, Fostoria made pressed ware, but early in the 20th century Fostoria realized the importance of developing fine quality blown stemware.

In 1924 the company was one of the first to start a program of national advertising, and the first to produce complete dinner services in crystal. Besides their regular line of blown, etched and pressed patterns they did custom work such as providing glass with government seals for officials in Washington. All the presidents from Eisenhower through Reagan ordered glassware from them. At one time Fostoria was the largest maker of handmade glassware in the United States, employing nearly 1000 people. The AMERICAN pattern, introduced in 1915, is still being produced by Lancaster Colony (who bought the Fostoria company in 1983), making it the most successful pattern in the history of glass making. Fostoria's business peaked in 1950 when they made over 8 million pieces of glass.

In 1986, after struggling with an outmoded plant and foreign competition, Lancaster Colony was forced to close the Fostoria Company, ending nearly 100 years of glass making.

#### **International Nippon Collectors Club**

The International Nippon Collectors Club was founded in 1982 by a group of Nippon enthusiasts with a vision to form an organization through which fellow collectors with a common interest in Nippon would exchange knowledge and share friendship. The club now has membership representing every state as well as Canada and Japan. There is such diversity within Nippon-era porcelain that it takes years of study and information exchange to become what is referred to as a "knowledgeable collector."

The first glance when pulling up the INCC's website conveys the word "quality." The site is well designed and presented and the photography is outstanding. The top of the homepage has the name of the club followed by the invitation "Welcome to the exciting world of Nippon porcelain collecting!"

The rest of the homepage is very simple, including photos of Nippon pieces and links to eight sections - INCC Information, Membership Information, Nippon Photo Galleries, Back Stamps, Conventions, Reproduction Alert, Books & Publications and a Nippon Tour. Both the photo galleries and the reproduction alert provide a tremendous resource to collectors and dealers alike, serving our entire industry.





#### **National Milk Glass Collectors Society**

#### The History of the National Milk Glass Collectors Society

In 1984, when a group of milk glass collectors answered an advertisement placed in several trade magazines by Walter Sill, a milk glass collector and entrepreneur from Nashville, Tennessee, history was made.

Regis and Mary Ferson of Pittsburgh, PA had already published a book, Yesterday's Milk Glass Today, in 1981. This sparked the interest of Walt Sill. In 1983, Walt conceived the idea of holding a convention where milk glass collectors could come together and talk and learn about opaque glassware. Walt contacted the Ferson's, who encouraged him in his pursuits, and agreed to come to this newly conceived convention.

Walt, not being sure if anyone else would be willing to travel to Nashville, pushed ahead. He placed ads and sat back and waited for responses. Just a few months after placing the ads, he had reservations from people representing ten states and a total of fifty people with paid reservations and expectations of seventy to one hundred attendees.

The agenda at this first convention is basically the same agenda that is still followed at today's conventions. There was a dealer setup area, exhibit of rare pieces, a trading area, a business meeting and an auction of three hundred pieces of milk glass. Enthusiasm ran high and there was a general agreement that the group should meet again the following year.

Conventions were held in 1985 in Pittsburgh, PA and again in 1986 back in Nashville. In 1987, the convention was held again in Nashville and at this convention the NATIONAL MILK GLASS COLLECTORS SOCIETY was officially organized. The following were elected to office: Jim Slater, President; George Storey, Vice President; Judy Reynolds, Secretary; Kathy Mroz, Treasurer. The first executive board members were: Helen Storey, Terry Baker (Simpson), Margaret Horsman, Stan Sohl, and James Reynolds serving as its Chairman. Mary Ferson, Regis Ferson, and Walter Sill were voted as Honorary Presidents (later modified to Honorary Members).

The NATIONAL MILK GLASS COLLECTORS SOCIETY is dedicated to the preservation, study, and enjoyment of milk glass including all periods and manufacturers, both domestic and foreign. The society promotes research projects, informa-

tion exchange, and social activities to increase and enhance the knowledge and acquisition of milk glass by its members.

Our official publication, Opaque News, is issued four times a year, in March, June, September, and December. Each issue, averaging between 15-20 pages, contains notices about the society's activities, articles on the history, production, identification, and other concerns relating to milk glass. Listings and color photos of previously unlisted pieces are featured, as well as reports on auction sales, book reviews, and members' activities. Members are also welcome to place ads, free of charge, listing pieces they wish to sell or buy.

Above all, the society seeks to promote communication and good fellowship among its members in the United States and International.

Each year, the society sponsors a convention. The convention is held in various parts of the United States to allow members from different areas to attend. We seem to hit the eastern and middle states more as volunteers are always needed to host, and they seem to be coming from those states. We have been to Texas, Kansas, Ohio, Indiana, Tennessee and Pennsylvania just to name a few. The program includes prominent speakers, an auction of three hundred pieces of milk glass, and arrangements for dealers and individual members to sell, buy, and exchange pieces. Check our Convention page for the upcoming convention and to check out our previous conventions.

Membership entitles you to Opaque News, the society's newspaper, admission to the convention, and all the talk about milk glass you can stand. We have a library from which all members can check out resources by notifying the librarian.

Two of our members have published a book, called, The Milk Glass Book, by Frank Chiarenza and Jim Slater. The members of the society provided the items to be photographed for the book. It is currently available through the Schiffer Publishing Company and other book sale outlets.

The Society has access to original molds and produces a different commemorative covered animal dish each year. The Society owns several plungers that are used to stamp the Society logo and the date and place of the convention for the year the commemorative is pressed. These are then sold at the convention and can be purchased by members only.

#### The History of the W. Nelson McCoy's **Blue Bird Pottery**

W. Nelson McCoy was born in 1820 in Harpers Ferry, Virginia, which is located in West Virginia. In January 1848, he and his wife Ester moved to Ohio's, Muskingum County, Springfield Township, in a community called Putnam. At that time, Putnam was a suburb of Zanesville, but in 1872, it became incorporated into Zanesville.

During the same year as W. Nelson and his wife arrived in Putnam, they had a son whose name was James W. Years later J.W. would go on to establish a well-known pottery, the "J.W. McCoy Pottery".

W. Nelson came to Putnam as a farmer. He acquired some land and built a house. In addition to farming, he also built a small, log building to produce stoneware during the warmer months. The pottery was a small, "Blue Bird" type shop, which was like the ones many of the farmers had at the time. It was primitive in its equipment, and the ware it produced was rough and unfinished. Although during that period, most of the home-owned, "Bluebird" shops operated under primitive conditions.

W. Nelson only produced pottery for a few years, not eight as previously believed. In January 1853, a notice was published in the "Zanesville Daily Courier" stating that a partnership that W. Nelson had with Jeremiah Elder was dissolved. The partnership was in a Putnam grocery store, named Elder & McCoy, which had been established at some uncertain prior time.

On the same date that W. Nelson ended his partnership with Elder, a second notice was published reporting that he had taken another partner, Norman Dodge, in the grocery business. Later W. Nelson bought out Elder, and the name of the grocery was changed to "McCoy & Dodge".

35Considering his job at the grocery, and the labor involved in farming, maintaining his household, supplying clay and firewood for his kiln, one would imagine that W. Nelson only had a small amount of time for actual pottery production. Surely, the volume he produced was small, and it was undoubtedly unmarked, since none that is attributable to him has been found.

Prior to 1853 a grocery store in Zanesville was owned by "James Benjamin & Co." Sometime after 1858 W. Nelson acquired the major share in the "Benjamin & Co." and the name of the store was then changed to "McCoy – Benjamin & Co.". Hugh McDonald was another owner besides McCoy and Benjamin.

In addition to the operation of the store itself, James Benjamin had other interests; he was a wholesale dealer in stoneware. The newspaper "Zanes Times Signal" carried an article in 1957 by Norris F. Schneider, who, quoting old sources, said that during the 1870's Benjamin was one of the three major stoneware wholesalers in the region. The other major stoneware wholesalers at the time were J.C. Gillespie, and Hudson C. Ward.

The crock shown is an example of Benjamin's wares. The inscription on it is stenciled in blue ink, and reads, "Jas. Benjamin Wholesale Stoneware Depot Zanesville, O".

W. Nelson is not known to have been associated with James Benjamin in the pottery business in Zanesville. However, he and Benjamin were associated in the pottery business located in Cincinnati. (See the article, "The History of the James Benjamin Potteries and his Connection with W. Nelson McCoy", which is contained on this Web site).

W. Nelson as a long-time, Zanesville businessman, became respected and popular. In 1881, he was elected the mayor of Zanesville, and in 1883, he was reelected. Was Nelson continued managing and working in his grocery and dry goods store until the early 1890's. He died in 1894. For more information visit: www.mccoypotterycollectorssociety.org






