
Eagle's Old World Wisconsin Historic Site Hosts **30th Star Benefit Antiques Auction**







Outsider Art creates a Stir at the Friends of the Wisconsin Historical Society Benefit Auction

Never made a visit to the Old World Wisconsin Historic Site? You're missing out on a lot more than you know! Founded in the town of Eagle in 1976 as a living museum, experts gleaned the Badger State and selected buildings that represented Wisconsin's unique history, painstaking moving them brick-by-brick and board-by-board to Eagle.

The site now consists of more than sixty historic structures ranging from ethnic farmsteads to an 1880s Village complete with its traditional small-town institutions. In fact, Old World Wisconsin's historic farm and village buildings comprise the world's largest museum dedicated to the history of rural life. It's not just a museum, though, but a living museum, where costumed volunteers are plowing the fields and spinning wool just as they would have in the 19th century.

And it was one of those buildings that hosted the April 23rd auction: the historic Clausing Barn - an imposing 1897 octagonal barn built by noted Ozaukee County barn-builder Ernst Clausing. A standing-room-only crowd turned out for the Saturday sale, hoping to snag a bargain or two while helping the Society's restoration efforts.

Bidders had a wide range of items large-and-small to choose from, all donated by folks from Wisconsin and several surrounding states. Of the furniture, a country pine corner cupboard dating from the 1850s was the winner, selling for a solid \$550. A three-shelf sectional oak bookcase made \$250, as did an ornate English oak display cabinet.

But there was never any doubt as to the stars of the sale: that large group of Adam Berg "outsider art" paintings. Berg retired in the 1960s to Wild Rose, Wisconsin after life as a Chicago cab driver, and began producing the astonishing works he called "oil carvings." Living in a modest cottage with his wife, he became known as the "asparagus man" from the large patch they used to supplement their income.

He spent years on some of his paintings, adding dozens of thick layers of paint to build up the figures into three dimensions. Some of his smaller works were simple still lifes, many were religious in nature, and some, including a flag-waving Emmett Kelly, were a little harder to explain.

Most of the bidder interest was concentrated towards two monumental Berg works, each measuring 48" x 60". The first, his 1969 Last Supper, featuring the traditional Jesus and Disciples scene in which the Kennedy family were depicted as the angels floating above. It sold for \$5,750. The other example, his self-described "masterpiece of his life's works," was titled Heaven on Earth. It ended up as the top-lot of the auction, selling to an Illinois collector for \$6,500.

The best part, of course, was that all proceeds from the auction went for a good cause: the Wisconsin Historical Society's funding of restoration of the H. H. Bennett Studio in the Wisconsin Dells. Considered one of the 19th century's best landscape photographers, Bennett's studio is still open – and is likely the oldest operating photography studio on the United States!

Thanks to Old World Wisconsin for hosting the event. And a special thanks to Friends of the Wisconsin Historical Society volunteers Debbie McArdle and Riene Wells for their tireless efforts in organizing the auction, and to auctioneer Carol Miller of Bailey's Honor Auctions for volunteering her considerable skills as the day's auctioneer. Old World Wisconsin is now open for the 2016 season seven days a week. And besides the re-creation of early Wisconsin life you'll experience here, there's a lot more on the Old World Calendar. How about a traditional Independence Day Celebration held on July 2nd through the 4th. Or watch one of the 1870s Historic Baseball games played on the Old World Wisconsin grounds by their very own Eagle Diamonds home team.

And there are workshops by the dozen, from adult blacksmithing and rug-braiding to kid's only Adventure Camps exploring everything from The Civil War to Getting Close to Farm Animals. Just visit www.wisconsinhistory.org to get the lowdown on Old World Wisconsin and all of the Society's other Historical Sites. Or join the Friends of the Wisconsin Historical Society at www.friendswisconsinhistory.org. And as always, keep an eye out for the 2018 30th Star Benefit Antiques Auction in the Auction Action Antique News!



Antiques Abbreviations

A while ago a reader asked about explaining some of the abbreviations they encounter in auction ads. This got me thinking about the abbreviations auctioneers use and why we use them. After a phone call to Gloria I offered to put together a listing.

By definition, an abbreviation is a shortened form of a word or phrase used for brevity. Within context and reason it identifies certain aspects of a piece to the buyer without needlessly going into detail. A lamp buyer will know what a "bracket lamp" is. It's unnecessary to say, "Victorian cast iron wall bracket with mercury glass reflector, chimney & drop in finger font". Most auctioneers use abbreviations in order to keep the size of the ad affordable. However it can be too much of a good thing and some of the more arcane descriptions can confuse or mislead the reader. To a person who collects a particular category most abbreviations in that category are readily recognized. To anybody else they are probably gibberish. Even a novice farm toy buyer won't need a three day weekend to decipher IH, McD & JD. WWI & WWII are obvious but would most folks recognize CW (Civil War) out of context? Coins, firearms, Hummels (152/A TMK3 UB K255 HB, anyone?) and other categories all have their own abbreviations that often are exclusive to that field. But if you are a glassware buyer does it really matter if you can't translate a 28g, o/u, d-bbl, ss w/syn stock and vr?

Some descriptions, while not technically correct, get the point across. For example "Jewel T', (which is short for Jewel Tea, a grocery chain) takes up less space than "Autumn Leaf", (a pattern name for china offered as a premium by Jewel Tea). This may seem like a trivial difference but similar descriptions over several publications begin to add up.

A listing that encompassed all of the collecting fields would be more of a project than I can take on but the following abbreviations should get you through most ads for antique auctions. If you have others you'd like to add to the list or that you've wondered about, please email them to me at mike@paulauction.com.

A&C - Arts & Crafts. Refers to the style of furniture usually associated with early 1900s Stickley. Often but erroneously referred to as Mission or Prairie.

ABC - American Brilliant Cut. Refers to the "Brilliant" period of late 19th/early 20th century American cut glass

B&H – Bradley & Hubbard. A manufacturer of quality lighting and decorative accessories.

B&W – Blue & White. The glaze colors used on utilitarian stoneware that was often found in the kitchen.

CI - Cast Iron.

COP – Century Of Progress. Typically refers to souvenirs hauled back from the Chicago World's Fair of 1933/34. Even in the middle of the Great Depression, a lot of Wisconsinites made the trip to see the COP.

CRS - Somebody explained this to me once, but I can't seem to remember what they said.

Dmg - Damage.

gl - Gallon. Typically used when advertising stoneware capacity

For Rest - For Restoration. Don't go to the auction expecting a cream puff.

GBCF - Glass Ball Claw Foot. Describes the foot usually found on late Victorian parlor and lamp tables.

GWTW - Gone With The Wind. A style of lamp with a matching font and top globe. Correctly referred to as a parlor lamp but popularly known as a Gone With The Wind, after the movie of the same name.

LRRH- Little Red Riding Hood. Typically refers to the Regal China products that feature her.

MIB - Mint In Box. Any item, but often a toy, that is in the same condition as new and in the original box.

MOP - Mother of Pearl. Polished nacre usually derived from mollusk shells. Typically found in jewelry, ladies dresser articles, buttons and in the windows of RPOG art.

NIB - New In Box. Similar to above but often assumed to be of modern production NOS - New Old Stock. Old merchandise, often with original manufacturer's tags and merchant's price tags, that has never been sold or used.

NWOT - New With Original Tags, but sometimes used as New With Out Tags. eBay sellers are usually guilty of using this both ways. If buying online, clarify before bidding.

o/b - Outboard. An outboard motor.

OOB - Oil on Board. Art work done on a board, usually Masonite.

OOC - Oil on Canvas. Art work done on canvas.

Pre Pro - Pre Prohibition, prior to 1920. Refers specifically to alcohol related advertising.

Post Pro - Post Prohibition, after 1933. Refers specifically to alcohol related advertising.

QA - Queen Anne. Generally refers to a 1920's or 30's revival style exemplified by a cabriole leg.

Repro - Reproduction. A good definition would require a separate article but you get the idea. Occasionally people will use the slang "Repop" for repro or "Repo" which is inaccurate and what happens to your car when Vinnie pulls up in a tow truck.

RPOG - Reverse Painted on Glass. Less common as ROG. Any item where the design or artwork has been applied to the obverse side of the glass but typically a lamp shade, decorative framed art or advertising items.

RPPC – Real Photo Post Card. Differentiates a post card that was printed, (developed) off your film from one that was commercially printed. These were so popular that Kodak marketed the 3A folder specifically for the RPPC.

RR – Railroad.

RW – Red Wing. Red Wing, or less often, the several other stoneware companies that called Red Wing, MN their home.

/s/ - Signed.

s/g - Salt Glaze. Refers to the type of glaze used on stoneware and to differentiate it from the later, more common, zinc glaze.

TOC - Tin Over Cardboard. A type of sign made of tin wrapped over a piece of paperboard and hung by a piece of short thread mounted to the back side of the sign. Commonly used in the 1930's and 40's by brewing and other industries.

T&S- Time & Strike. Refers to clock movements. Differentiates between time only and striking movements.





The History of the W. Nelson McCoy's Blue Bird Pottery

By Dewayne Imsand An Old "Blue Bird" Pot Shop

W. Nelson McCoy was born in 1820 in Harpers Ferry, Virginia, which is located in West Virginia. In January 1848, he and his wife Ester moved to Ohio's, Muskingum County, Springfield Township, in a community called Putnam. At that time, Putnam was a suburb of Zanesville, but in 1872, it became incorporated into Zanesville.

During the same year as W. Nelson and his wife arrived in Putnam, they had a son whose name was James W. Years later J.W. would go on to establish a well-known pottery, the "J.W. McCoy Pottery".

W. Nelson came to Putnam as a farmer. He acquired some land and built a house. In addition to farming, he also built a small, log building to produce stoneware during the warmer months. The pottery was a small, "Blue Bird" type shop, which was like the ones many of the farmers had at the time. It was primitive in its equipment, and the ware it produced was rough and unfinished. Although during that period, most of the home-owned, "Bluebird" shops operated under primitive conditions.

W. Nelson only produced pottery for a few years, not eight as previously believed. In January 1853, a notice was published in the "Zanesville Daily Courier" stating that a partnership that W. Nelson had with Jeremiah Elder was dissolved. The partnership was in a Putnam grocery store, named Elder & McCoy, which had been established at some uncertain prior time.

On the same date that W. Nelson ended his partnership with Elder, a second notice was published reporting that he had taken another partner, Norman Dodge, in the grocery business. Later W. Nelson bought out Elder, and the name of the grocery was changed to "McCoy & Dodge".

35Considering his job at the grocery, and the labor involved in farming, maintaining his household, supplying clay and firewood for his kiln, one would imagine that W. Nelson only had a small amount of time for actual pottery production. Surely, the volume he produced was small, and it was undoubtedly unmarked, since none that is attributable to him has been found.

Prior to 1853 a grocery store in Zanesville was owned by "James Benjamin & Co.". Sometime after 1858 W. Nelson acquired the major share in the "Benjamin & Co.", and the name of the store was then changed to "McCoy – Benjamin & Co.". Hugh McDonald was another owner besides McCoy and Benjamin.

In addition to the operation of the store itself, James Benjamin had other interests; he was a wholesale dealer in stoneware. The newspaper "Zanes Times Signal" carried an article in 1957 by Norris F. Schneider, who, quoting old sources, said that during the 1870's Benjamin was one of the three major stoneware wholesalers in the region. The other major stoneware wholesalers at the time were J.C. Gillespie, and Hudson C. Ward.

The crock shown is an example of Benjamin's wares. The inscription on it is stenciled in blue ink, and reads, "Jas. Benjamin Wholesale Stoneware Depot Zanesville, O".

W. Nelson is not known to have been associated with James Benjamin in the pottery business in Zanesville. However, he and Benjamin were associated in the pottery business located in Cincinnati. (See the article, "The History of the James Benjamin Potteries and his Connection with W. Nelson McCoy", which is contained on this Web site).

W. Nelson as a long-time, Zanesville businessman, became respected and popular. In 1881, he was elected the mayor of Zanesville, and in 1883, he was reelected. W. Nelson continued managing and working in his grocery and dry goods store until the early 1890's. He died in 1894. For more information visit: www.mccoypotterycollectorssociety.org
