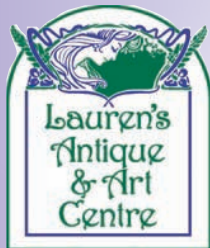

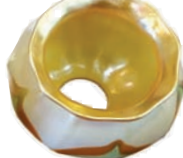

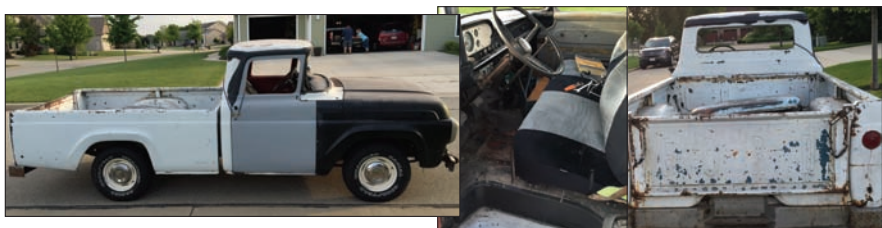

Sixty-Five Dealers Strong - The 24th Annual De Pere, Wisconsin Antiques Show

It was nearly four centuries ago, the year 1634 to be exact, that famed French Voyageur Jean Nicolet and his crew traversed the Great Lakes, paddled into a huge cove on Lake Michigan, and stepped ashore where the Fox River enters Green Bay. He thus became the first known European to enter what we now call Wisconsin. Nicolet was met by members of the Ho-Chunk Nation, and established a trading post at the site.

Within forty years of that landing, two Jesuit missions had become established in the area. One was erected in what is now the city of Green Bay, the other by Pere Claude-Jean Allouez at the last set of rapids on the Fox River, a site known as Rapides Des Peres, or Rapids of the Fathers. That mission, the St. Francis Xavier Mission, was the foundation of the town that came to be known as De Pere.

Fast forward a couple of centuries and you come to another of the city's defining moments: the founding of St. Norbert College, host of the De Pere Antiques Show. Opened in 1898 by Abbot Bernard Pennings, the college is now one of the region's premier educational institutions. The college offers undergraduate programs in more than forty areas of study, and enrolls about two-thousand students. St. Norbert is consistently ranked as one of the top five comprehensive colleges in the Midwest by U.S. News & World Report, and is also listed among the "Best in the Midwest" by Princeton Review.

The college has hosted the De Pere Antiques Show since its start more than two decades ago. "This show was the first on-site antiques show I'd ever done" said Audre Hanson of A R Promotions. "I had started a mall show in Wausau a few years earlier, but always felt there was a need for a quality antiques show in the Green Bay

area. It turned out to be true, and it's still the largest show I run, with consistently over sixty-five dealers."

Pearmont Antiques was one of those dealers, bringing an eclectic inventory that ranged from automobile advertising to vintage toys. Also there: two of the finest agricultural salesman's samples you could ask for – both from long-shuttered Badger State manufacturers.

Furniture more your thing? There was something for you everywhere you turned, from the huge inventory of restored fine furniture at Ken's Family Antiques to Crooked Ladder's selection of painted primitives. And with more than sixty-five exhibitors at the De Pere Antiques Show, you're sure to find something to love, whether your tastes run towards fine art, folk art, or even period Native American artifacts.

When you're done seeing the sights at the show itself, be sure to take a stroll through the beautiful St. Norbert College campus, situated right on the shores of the Fox River. Those a little more adventurous can follow in the footsteps of the voyageurs on the Fox River Trail, a twenty-five mile hiking, biking, and equestrian trail that passes right through De Pere on its way to the shores of Lake Michigan in Green Bay proper.

Audre & Ray Hanson of A R Promotions did their usual great job organizing the event.

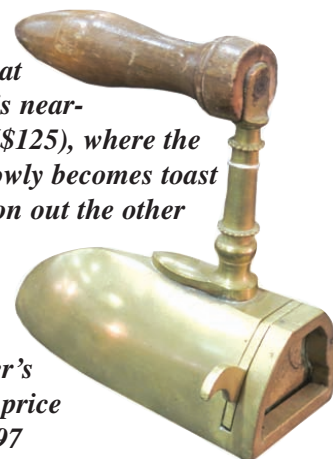

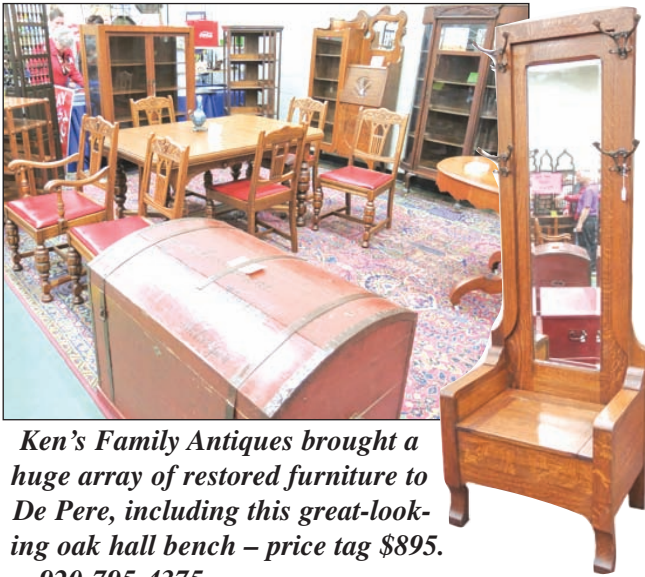

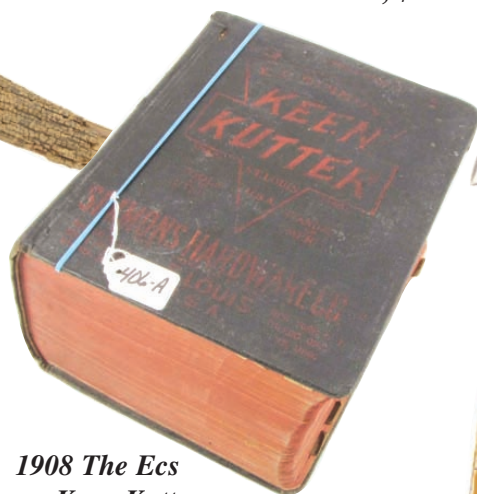

Antiques & Appraising School Launches "New" e-Course

Article by Charles Green (Asheford Institute of Antiques)



The Asheford Institute of Antiques (AIA), a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising, recently rolled out its first ever online "e-Course," at an industry trade gathering earlier this month, in anticipation of the school's 50th anniversary to be held in New York later this year.

Described by school spokesperson Shelly Dumont, as a watershed moment for the Institute, Dumont said the school's first foray into e-learning was consistent with Asheford's innovative and ground-breaking teaching techniques employed

over the last 50 years. "When we offer something new, we like to take the time to make sure it's done right," said Dumont at a Q & A session following the announcement.

When asked about the differences in curriculum between textbooks and the new e-Course format of the program, Dumont said there was literally no comparison. "In terms of sheer volume, it's almost double the size of the printed version, and

comes loaded with interactive videos, multimedia-activities, web-based resource links, and a host of other features we simply can't add into the texts." Dumont went on to say that the e-Course had been in development for almost two years by the school's IT team, before any release dates were even considered.

Industry insiders attending the trade gathering were granted temporary pass-codes to the e-Course, and were given full access to the programs options and features at a demonstration held during the event. Director of the school, Charles Green presided over the presentation, and noted during the unveiling, that the program had undergone almost a year of beta-testing by international students prior to its intended release in North America.

A statement issued from the school's Admissions Officer, Tony Drew seemed to indicate a "full" release date for the new e-Course to be some time in mid-July. "We don't want to rush it, but we're really pleased with the response so far," said Drew, "We think the e-Course is really going to be a game-changer when it comes to setting the bar for future antiques and appraising education." The press release went on to say that while the textbooks for the Asheford program were still available, they would likely be phased out in the next five to ten years.

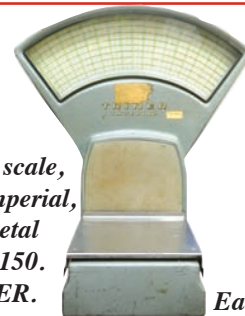

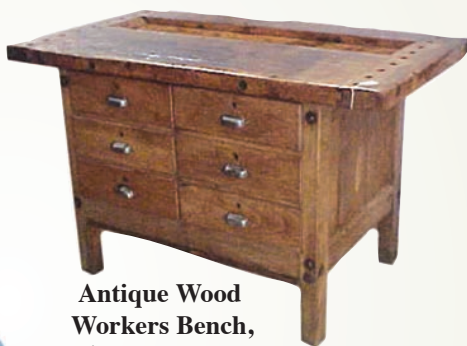
