



Blackhawk Center Hosts Sixty-Sixth Annual Oregon, Illinois Antiques Show

If you're coming into the little town of Oregon, Illinois from the north, be sure to take Route 2, one of the most scenic drives in the northern part of the state. The road follows the meandering Rock River from Rockford, through the little town of Byron, and on to Oregon itself.

And just north of Oregon at Lowden State Park, look across the river, and you'll see the majestic image of a Native American gazing over the Rock River Valley. This is no ordinary statue. It's a fifty-foot-tall reinforced concrete wonder that is aweinspiring. The figure weighs more than half a million pounds, and is said to be the second largest monolithic concrete statue in the world. Sculptor Lorado Taft designed the statue as a tribute to all Native Americans, but it's more commonly associated with Chief Black Hawk.

And whether you're antiquing or not, Oregon, Illinois is worth a look. Just twenty-seven miles south of Rockford and ninety miles west of Chicago, it's often referred to as "the prettiest small town in America." The tree-lined streets are populated with picturesque Victorian homes, and in the center of downtown sits the venerable Ogle County Courthouse. Other Historical attractions abound in the area, including the nearby John Deere Historical Site - where Deere invented the self-polishing steel plow that that opened the prairie to agriculture.

The modern Blackhawk Center, just west of downtown Oregon, is host to the sixtysix year-old Oregon Women's Club Antiques Show. The multi-use facility, a joint effort of the local school & park districts, is a terrific venue for the show, and quite an accomplishment for this town of just over 4,000.

There were more than fifty dealers set up at the show, coming from several Midwest states and beyond. And don't be fooled by the show's small-town location:

you'll find quality antiques here, the dealers drawn by attendance that often exceeds that of the "big city" shows. Of course, the event is a mainstay for many Illinois dealers, including Country at Heart Antiques.

They brought a huge inventory of the country Americana they're known for - classic New England painted furniture and accessories of every description. The American country theme continued in the nearby Robinson Ridge Antiques, where I found an interesting 19th century "well elevator" used to store perishable foods by lowering them down the well-shaft.

Country not you thing? How about the great period fine jewelry spanning the centuries shoppers found at Sunshine Treasures, or the amazing displays of art glass & pottery at both Vine of Time Antiques and Grape & Cable Antiques. In fact, you'll find dealers here specializing in everything from tools and toys to furniture, advertising, and more. Just take a look at the photos and you'll see what the show's all about.

Thanks to Oregon Women's Club for inviting me to the event. They said not to forget to mention the fantastic job that show manager Ron Bry did promoting the sixty-sixth edition of the event, attracting many new dealers to the show - and many new shoppers too. It's an important event for the Woman's Club. Each year the show brings in the lion's share of the funds they use throughout the year to benefit the community. Why not come out next year and have a look (and a homemade meal from the Chana United Methodist Ladies food concession!) at the sixty-seventh edition of the Oregon Woman's Club Antiques Show. 

Red Wing Collectors Society to Celebrate 40th Annual Convention - July 7-9

Red Wing, MN - Fads come and go and interests often fade away, so it's no surprise that ery few collectors' clubs have been around for 40 years. The Red Wing Collectors Society RWCS), however, bucks the trend. The organization will mark its 40th Annual Convention 'Ruby Red Wing" when more than 1000 members assemble in Red Wing during the week of July 4th. The 2016 Convention will kick off a year of celebration, as the club's 40th anniverary will be recognized in 2017.

RWCS President Larry Birks attributes the club's long-term success to Red Wing's diverse product lines and the strong bonds that RWCS members share.

"The stoneware and pottery companies of Red Wing made such a wide variety of wares between 1877 and 1967 that they appeal to collectors of completely different periods," Birks ays. "Whether a person gravitates to country primitives, Arts & Crafts, Art Deco or Mid-Century Modern, Red Wing made it. And as we say, the stoneware and pottery is what first rings collectors to Red Wing and the RWCS, but the camaraderie, friendships and the beauiful City of Red Wing are what keeps them coming back."

Like most antique collecting clubs, attracting young new collectors has been a challenge or the RWCS. A bright spot in the organizations recruiting efforts has come through the RWCS Facebook Chapter, which is a highly active page where recent finds are shared, quesons are answered and pieces are bought and sold by new and advanced collectors alike. To oin the conversation, visit www.facebook.com/groups/RWCSChapter/.

The RWCS Convention will unofficially begin on Wednesday, July 6 when the RWCS Coundation holds its "Wine-ing for Red Wing" fundraiser from 6 to 9 p.m. at the Pottery Museum of Red Wing at 240 Harrison Street, Red Wing. Admission for the fundraising event s \$20; it will feature food and beverages, silent and live auctions and live music by local Red Wing band Flatt and Square.

The RWCS Convention officially kicks off the next day with a welcome from the city's nayor and a keynote presentation on the earthenware made in Whitewater, WI, which predates Red Wing's earliest salt glaze stoneware by about 20 years. The official RWCS mempers-only auction, which features more than 250 pieces consigned by members, will take place in the Red Wing High School gym at 4:30 that evening.

RWCS members will also have their lineup of usual favorites to attend during Convention, ncluding street sales held at Red Wing's historic Pottery Place, auctions held on Tuesday and Wednesday, educational seminars and the official RWCS Show & Sale at Red Wing High chool that begins for members at 9 a.m. Saturday, July 9. It opens FREE to the public from 0:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

In addition to these activities, the 5th annual Crock Fest celebration will feature music, food nd fun from 5 to 6:30 p.m. on Friday, July 8 at the Pottery Museum of Red Wing. In addiion to its regular displays, the museum will introduce its "General Store" seasonal exhibit to collectors for the first time.

Other Convention activities include a "Crock Hunt" scavenger hunt around Red Wing, the pportunity to create a piece of pottery with local potter Richard Spiller, and a special display room at Red Wing High School where members create their own unique displays of Red Wing items for the education and enjoyment of attendees.

An annual commemorative will be unveiled and distributed to members beginning 'hursday, July 7. The commemorative piece is a closely guarded secret and there is much peculation as to what the piece will be each year. It is a miniature replica of a Red Wing potery item with a limited number made. Last year's commemorative was a stoneware canteen.





Van Briggle Pottery & Tile

Dozens of glaze colors, hundreds of designs, hundreds of thousands of pieces created - all bearing one name - the name of the brilliant artist and his wife whose lives left a permanent and timeless imprint on the tradition of American art pottery. This is the Van Briggle legacy - begun in 1899. With the passing of time new chapters are added, and this artistic legacy is as alive today as any time in its history. Each day the Van Briggle studios produce the early designs of its founders, Artus and Anne Van Briggle, as well as pieces created over the years that compliment their celebrated style, in a variety of colors - both historic and contemporary.

At Van Briggle Art Pottery in Colorado Springs, the beginning of a new millennium brought the dawn of a new century in this Van Briggle legacy. Beginning our second hundred years of creating fine art pottery, we find ourselves returning to our roots. Simultaneously, we are looking to the future, contemplating what legacy we will leave for future generations. We are surrounded by evidence that we bear the name of a creative genius, highly acclaimed in his day, and the dedication of so many artisans and staff over the past 100 years, which brings a deep sense of joy as well as responsibility.

Almost daily we experience poignant reminders of the Van Briggle legacy: someone walks into our showroom with a piece of Van Briggle wrapped in a towel or newspaper, placed in an old shoe box, with a story of how their grandmother purchased this piece 75 years ago on a trip to Colorado Springs - and that she wouldn't part with it for any price; we walk into a museum in Pasadena, California and unexpectedly see a small collection of Van Briggle pieces, all bearing dates from the early 1900's; we receive a telephone call from a collector who just bought an old "Lorelei" vase for a few dollars in a box lot at a farm sale somewhere in the Midwest - the farmer and his family had purchased the piece years ago when they came to Colorado after the harvest was in; while on a visit to the Metropolitan Museum in New York or the Smithsonian in Washington, D.C. we find pieces of Van Briggle pottery among their permanent collections.

Stories like these remind us that the work of our hands today is the continuation of a celebrated artistic heritage begun over one hundred years ago. Indeed, we do feel a responsibility that is both sobering and exciting as we continue the legacy of Artus and Anne Van Briggle. Their names hold a distinctive place in the history of fine and decorative arts. The desire to continue an honored tradition brings with it a dilemma: how do we continue their artistic legacy without simply mimicking its earlier sublime creations? We want to know that if Anne and Artus were to miraculously return to us one day, as we open another kiln filled with art pottery bearing their name, they would see designs and glazes they would cherish in their hands and hearts, as we hold theirs in ours. We would want them to recognize the pottery pieces inscribed with their name. However, knowing they were accomplished artists, we would also want them to say, "...and how you have grown with the years!" We must stay true to our past, yet we must evolve and grow – after all if art is anything, it is dynamic! Clay is a particularly versatile medium for an artist. A survey of what is produced by potters around the world shows that, more than any other medium, clay offers the artist extraordinary scope of expression.

As artists and artisans here at Van Briggle, we occasionally monitor what other artists



are doing with clay and glaze. Fads and trends have their moments in time, and it can be tempting to follow these more immediately accepted styles and idioms, though they lay beyond the bounds of the Van Briggle tradition. However, we are repeatedly drawn to one over-riding goal - to establish an aesthetic that transcends time; to create a style unique to our heritage that establishes itself by continually reaffirming its principles; to explore new ways of expression while always being reminded of their origins. In judging the viability of each new design or glaze we find ourselves asking these questions: Does it look like Van Briggle? Is it worthy of bearing that name? Is it informed by our legacy without simply repeating it?

An overview of Van Briggle pieces over the last century shows hundreds of designs with flower, animal or human subjects artistically applied to pottery forms. Typically, these pieces are highlighted with a soft matte glaze - Artus Van Briggle's passion. The subject of Van Briggle is, essentially, nature, which for all intents and purposes is an inexhaustible source for the artist. Themes and motifs inspired by nature can be interpreted and reinterpreted indefinitely on graceful forms. Matte glazes may be created with a broad range of hues to enhance and lend these forms a soft satin touch. A viewing of our current inventory shows a number of designs created by Artus and Anne Van Briggle that have been produced continuously since the early 20th century. Along with these, one finds distinctive designs by other artists that have been added to the collection over the years. Of course the majority of pieces are glazed with the signature Van Briggle matte glaze - one of Artus' most profound achievements - in various colors. Over the past two decades we have carefully identified and retained only the designs we feel fit most appropriately into the Van Briggle style, and have eliminated others that do not. When new designs are added they are carefully selected to enhance and further the Van Briggle tradition.

Artus Van Briggle established his pottery during the Arts and Crafts movement, a time when many artists and craftsmen were creating their works in reaction to the mass production of the industrial revolution. Though the scope of the Van Briggle tradition is broader than the movement, Van Briggle's work fits well within its emphasis on making hand-crafted art available to a wider public. In the same way, it is our goal in an era dominated by ever increasing emphasis on technology, to provide our society with a counterpoint of artistry and hand craftsmanship.

What could be more rewarding? Reminders of the Van Briggle legacy are all around us. An old black and white photograph immortalizes a moment when Artus posed outside a kiln while the earliest Van Briggle artisans brought pieces for his inspection. A former employee describes how the kilns used to be fired with coal, which he remembers shoveling by hand. A pottery piece from 1902 has mysteriously acquired a look and feel that only the passing of time will create. These reminders and countless others renew and strengthen our resolve to continue the tradition.

Each day brings a sense of excitement and anticipation; there is no end in sight to the Van Briggle legacy. Inspired by the essence of our style, successive generations can continue to express the timeless and endless themes found in nature, interpreted through creative minds and skilled hands. Artus and Anne Van Briggle's aims and values were noble and sincere. As we remain true to these goals, the Van Briggle tradition, begun so many years ago, will continue long into the future.




