Victorian Furnishings the Focus at Auction Specialists Stoughton Living Estate Auction

The Bereskys had been passionate collectors for decades, filling their Victorian-era Stoughton home with the best in period furnishings. A recent move to Seattle, Washington meant a downsizing was in order though, so they gave Jim Seamonson of Auction Specialists Stoughton a call. And I don't think any of the hundred-plus bidders that turned out for the sale were anything but impressed with the quality and quantity of the offerings. The sale was moved to the nearby Mandt Community Center, a large climate-controlled facility with ample parking that was much appreciated on this sunny June day.

Auctioneer Don Kleven, Jr. began the sale with the smaller household goods, then quickly moved on to the period lighting and furniture. The lighting ranged from vintage brass floor lamps to an ornate Victorian piano lamp, but the real prize among them was a green slag glass table lamp in nice condition and with a lighted base. Two determined bidders vied for the piece - the winner eventually paying \$1,100 for the privilege.

The furniture found ready buyers too. The many Victorian chests and tables were

mostly of walnut, and sold for up to \$250 apiece. A vintage Marshall & Wendell baby grand piano was likewise a nice buy at \$275. Buyers also had the opportunity to bid on a few Mid Century Modern pieces, plus period patio furniture and the like.

A small-but-nice collection of porcelain had a few standouts as well. It took a surprising \$600 bid to win a matched pair of floral-decorated Nippon vases. A French porcelain fish service, despite a little damage, managed a respectable \$160 hammer price. A look at the photos will give you an idea of what other treasures the day had to offer.

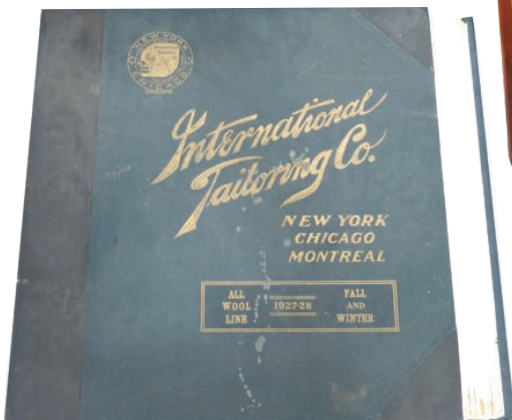

Roseville Creamware "Good Night" candle holder. Roseville began making decaled Creamware utility ware by 1910 and continued making it at least through the 1920's if not longer.



Roseville Early Utility pitchers. Introduced around 1900 and popular for decades thereafter, Roseville made dozens of different pitchers. Some Roseville collectors specialize in pitchers alone!



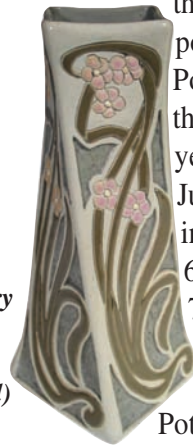

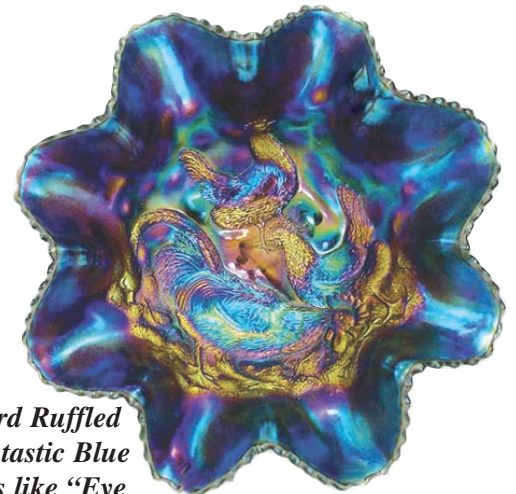

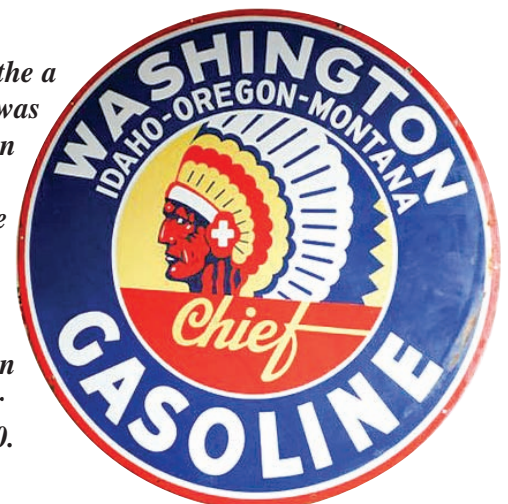

The History of The Old Reel Collectors Association

In 1989 Mike Nogay, a dedicated reel collector from West Virginia, decided that it was time for reel collectors to have their own organization. He thought up the name, had the club logo designed, and had ORCA incorporated as a non-profit, educational corporation in the state of West Virginia.

On October 9, 1990 a letter was mailed out to reel collectors that had expressed an interest in the formation of such a club. Finally in January 1991 the first Newsletter of the Old Reel Collectors Association, Inc. was mailed to the original 36 charter members.

From those first wobbly steps, ORCA has grown into an adventurous adolescent. As ORCA passed our tenth anniversary in 2000, we have reached our identity. ORCA's membership currently remains between 800 and 1000 dedicated members.

The original four page newsletter has now grown into a 32-36 page magazine, The Reel News. The first ORCA Convention was held in Pennsylvania in June, 1999. This event was a fully rounded Convention rather than just a tackle show. In 1998 ORCA was the first tackle collector's club to jump into the electronic age, with its own Web Site, and electronic data to help out our members who are on line.

ORCA is headed toward maturity with a full head of steam. There is no longer a question of whether ORCA is going to make it. The faq section (frequently asked questions) is very simple and yet, very helpful. This is a section that should be considered on every collecting club's website. It simply and briefly answers questions like: Who belongs? How do I determine the value of items? Are there Society shows that are open to the public? How do I determine when an item was made? Where can I get more information? etc.

By spending only a couple of minutes on the site, if a visitor has an interest in collecting or studying golf memorabilia, it would be hard to resist joining!

Arts Group Publishes Guide to Northwest Wisconsin Arts, Growers, Heritage

In the small towns, villages and along the rustic roads of northwestern Wisconsin are some of the state's most valuable assets: creative human beings who nurture beauty, value nature and share their heritage through places, objects and edibles that are handmade and homegrown.

Now there's a brand new paperback guidebook published by the Wisconsin's Northwest Heritage Passage: 208 pages that shine a light on these places and people who live and work along and around the Highway 63 corridor in 13 northwest Wisconsin counties.

It's called The Wisconsin Passage: an Adventure in the Handmade, Homegrown and Historical Offerings of Wisconsin from the Mississippi River to the Lake Superior, or simply, The Wisconsin Passage. The book is the culmination of a dream that began 12 years ago when a group of northwest Wisconsin people like Spooner weaver Alene Peterson realized that the cottage industries of working crafters, artists, growers were key to a sustainable "creative economy" in this region.

Peterson and a committee of five - all volunteers -- began by establishing a set of criteria. "We were looking for locally made or grown items, quality products, interesting destinations, environmental responsibility, openness to the public, and safety," said Peterson.

Each of the 350 listees in the book submitted written descriptions of their studios, galleries, farms, museums, and other arts, agricultures or culture-related businesses. Committee members visited each site, providing feedback about their experiences. Others collected and worked with submitted images or took photographs themselves.

Janet Krokson of Spooner was the book committee's muse who gathered the descriptions, historical facts, anecdotes, and other materials, weaving them into a narrative that makes the book an entertaining read as much as a travel guide.

Editor of the Spooner Advocate and life-long resident of the area, Krokson said, "It was a labor of love. I've lived in Highway 63 communities for the past 31 years," she said. "I love Wisconsin, and I particularly love this part of the state."

She continued, "I think of The Wisconsin Passage as a passage to more passages - to bygone days, to an adventure that anyone can take part in. It's about artists, artisans, performers, nature lovers, natural growers, pioneer settlers and storytellers of many genres who forged a life and culture along the heritage roads and trails."

Peterson added, "We want this book to bring the public together with artists and growers where they live and work and showcase those hometowns, villages and farms as well as the natural beauty of northwest Wisconsin destinations for travelers of all ages,"

The WNHP was founded in 1999 as an arts support group dedicated to supporting, showcasing and educating the public about the talents and creativity of northwest Wisconsin's communities. In 2001, 2004 and 2009, WNHP published and distributed more than 100,000 foldout maps listing handmade, homegrown and heritage sites. The Wisconsin Passage replaces those maps as a more permanent testament to the thriving creative economy in northwest Wisconsin.

There is no commercial advertising in the book. Production was funded by memberships, in kind and cash donations from businesses and private citizens through "Friends of the Passage." Proceeds from sales of the book will be used to update and publish future editions.

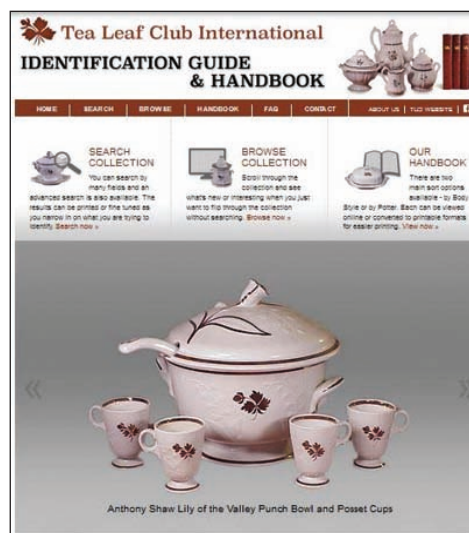
