Stanton's Spring Music Auction Generates Strong Results

After collecting, gathering, moving, cataloging and assembling estates and collections from across the United States Stanton's 3-day auction of automatic music machines was conducted on May 5th, 6th & 7th. Nearly \$900,000.00 of rare and quality machines (and related items) crossed the block, producing strong results from the competitive bidding from both the onsite and offsite auction participants. The successful buyers came, and/or participated from all across the United States, Canada, Australia and Europe to have a chance at acquiring items from this huge offering.

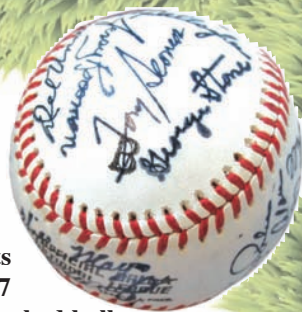

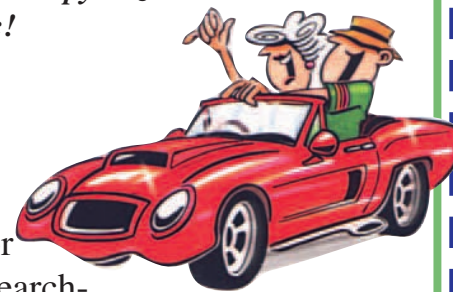

Exceptional Cremona "K" Series Nickelodeon Brings \$44,000 at Stanton's Spring Music Auction

Everything from disc and cylinder music boxes to antique phonographs crossed the auction block during the event. A Reginaphone Style 240 console or floor model disc combination music box and phonograph in an oak cabinet (rare) with lions heads sold for \$12,100; Regina Style 36 - 15 1/2" automatic changer disc music box in a mahogany case with curved glass sold for a reasonable \$11,275, and a Regina Commercial style changer (15 1/2") with cast iron legs and coin operated brought \$7,150; A Regina 27" casket model in a mahogany cabinet (with a spring problem) brought \$4,950; A Rare Reginaphone Style 140 console disc music box & phonograph in a Rookwood decorated cabinet brought \$7,975.; While the matching Regina Style 40 console model (disc music box only) in the same Rookwood decoration sold for a strong \$7,150.; A fantastic Allard and Sandoz cylinder music box with table and 6 cylinders sold for \$15,350, followed by a very nice Paillard Orchestral box with 6 cylinders and matching renaissance style table that brought \$11,000. Finally, a Regina 20 3/4" disc playing music box in a mahogany desk sold for \$7,425.

In the field of antique phonographs the highlight of the sale was a very rare Berliner "JS" disc gramophone that sold for \$38,500, this machine for followed by a Berliner early "hand crank" disc gramophone example that brought \$33,000, both were prime and excellent examples; Edison Opera (mahogany) with wooden cygnet horn \$5,500; A Brunswick floor model disc phonograph with Asian decoration \$1,650; A Berliner ratchet wind disc phonograph sold for a reasonable \$8,250. A Columbia BC (20th Century) cylinder phonograph (a rather common unit) had an extremely rare repeater attachment on it that made it sell for \$6,150 to a collection from Florida, it was said to have been one of two seen.

Other related items in the field of automatic music machines included a Superb Cremona "K" series nickelodeon with original arched stained and leaded glass doors

and windows in the front and the hanging lamps. The piece in a pristine oak cabinet sold for \$44,000. Even though it was in need of mechanical restoration, it was of the nicest examples that Stanton's had said they have had the opportunity to offer. A fantastic and modern Raffin 31-119 street organ with heavily inlaid case brought \$19,250 with music, a beautiful example. There was also a rare Morse Automatic Telegraph machine that was undocumented by the collectors or in books, sold for \$3,850; A replica of an Edison "Hardy" model tinfoil machine produced by Ray Phillips sold for \$3,080; Double bird cages and 2 bird boxes sold in the range of \$1,700 to \$2,700; A walnut case Symphonion grandfathers clock with one disc (no crank) sold for \$5,500. Also sold was an excellent Edison cylinder phonograph with "Lyre" (early) grill for nearly \$4,500, it was a prime example.

The auction liquidated over 1450-catalogued items, as well as nearly 1,000 pieces of general uncatalogued music examples including records, parts, memorabilia, signage, and more was sold. The crowd was in attendance from across the United States, as well as Canada, and bidders unable to attend participated from around the country and internationally as well.

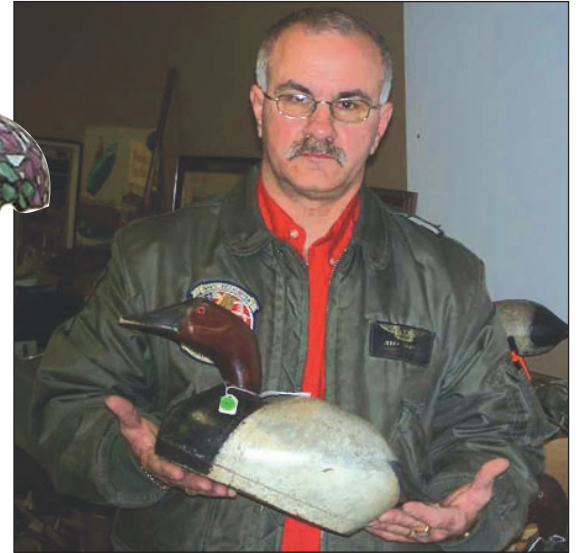

Kokomo Event Center Hosts Pure and Simple Antique Show

Kay and Bill Puchstein of Frankfort, Ohio, had some unusual items, including a cardboard bodice priced \$895.

From the first show to the most recent installment of Pure and Simple, the Korbas have clearly been ahead of the house. The biggest winners, however, are the shoppers who have discovered this to be one of the best antique shows in the Midwest. Strong on country items and Americana, it has become a favorite of dealers and collectors looking for material that hasn't been messed with, whether it's a tiger maple chest of drawers in an early finish or a slide-lid box in original bittersweet paint.

The seventh annual Pure and Simple featured 70 dealers, including a few new faces to Kokomo and a larger number of sellers from out of state. Among both groups was Jane Langol of Medina, Ohio. She came to Pure and Simple with a fair bit of anxiety.

"I was concerned," she said. What she carried wasn't the typical Pure and Simple stock and trade. Instead of step-back cupboards and cobalt-decorated stoneware, Langol brought art pottery and textiles.

"I'm different," she said, standing in front of her booth and looking up and down the aisle at the offerings of other

dealers. And yet, it worked. By mid-afternoon she had sold two quilts priced more than \$500 each, three pieces of pottery, a folk art figure and a watermelon sign. It's not just that she didn't expect to do so well. Instead, she wasn't sure she would sell anything. The art pottery was her biggest surprise.

"I'm shocked that they want my pottery. It's not cottage or primitive," she said. However, her pottery had a good look, and a number of pieces were scarce. One such item was an experimental Weller vase in a matte glaze, circa 1905 to 1915, tagged \$500.

What set Langol apart from others might also have been what kept buyers so interested. Other dealers had rag rugs, but she hung hers from a wall, the design standing out like a piece of artwork, and it didn't take long before someone was writing a check for the piece. Another rug would go in its place, and the process would repeat.

Despite some apprehension, Langol had a plan from the start. She chose white paper for her walls, just to be different from everyone else. And, she intentionally brought art pottery in neutral glazes.

"It was a very definitive thought process, because I was terrified," she said. "The person across the aisle is completely different but equally successful."

That neighboring dealer was Ed Logan of Danville, Ind., who came to Pure and Simple with inventory more typical of what's seen at the show. Like Langol, he sold well all day. Small items were especially good, as he wrote receipts for a green, a drying rack, a 1780s tavern table, pewter and stoneware. He also sold two oil paintings, one a portrait, the other a landscape.

Late in the day, his primitive sideboard in old blue paint sported a red "Sold" tag. Other furniture still available from Logan included a 10-foot-long deacon's bench in

old blue, priced \$1,650. However, buyers had already carried off a lot of merchandise.

From across the aisle, Langol pointed to Logan's booth and said, "Look how bare it is."

Strong demand made more than just a few booths look sparse by the middle of the show. Sales were steady. Dealers across the floor reported small items were doing better than furniture, although Mike Korba said his helpers were busy carting furniture off the show floor all day.

There was plenty of good furniture to buy, from a New England tavern table, priced \$2,800 by Bruce Rigsby of Lancaster, Ky., to a one-piece corner cupboard, scraped down to the original blue paint, offered at \$9500 by Kay and Bill Puchstein of Frankfort, Ohio. The Puchsteins purchased the cupboard more than a decade ago, and it had been in their home until it was loaded in the truck and brought to Pure and Simple.

The mix across the floor also showed the great variety that was available, even for the same type of object. Bob and Carole Closser of Red Kettle Antiques in Carthage, Ind., offered a Queen Anne desk-on-frame, in a red wash, at \$1400, while Ron Broughman of Caulkins House Antiques of Plainwell, Mich., showed a slant-lid desk on stand, of Canadian origin, priced \$575.

Among the early paint-decorated furniture was a Sheraton chest of drawers, New England, 1835-1845, priced \$6485 by James Wm. Lowrey of Baldwinsville, New York.

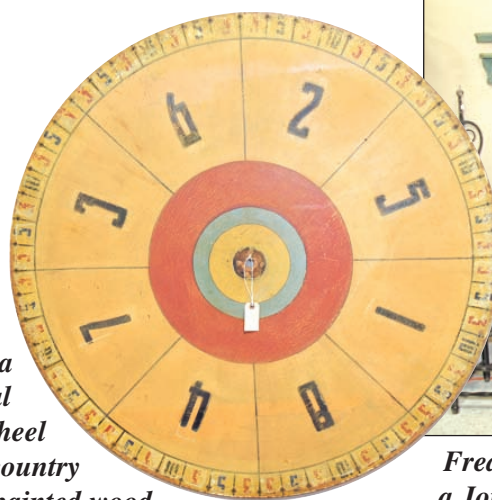
Unusual items at the show included a stairway from a home in New York State, both narrow and steep, with 11 treads, in original mustard paint, priced \$1,050 by Roger and Bobbie Pries of Bobbie Pries Antiques, Westfield Center, Ohio.

The best of the smalls included an early cast-iron Sight Seeing Auto by Kenton, the toy dating to circa 1905, priced \$5500 by Bob Zordani and Heidi Kellner of Z&K Antiques, Urbana, Ill.

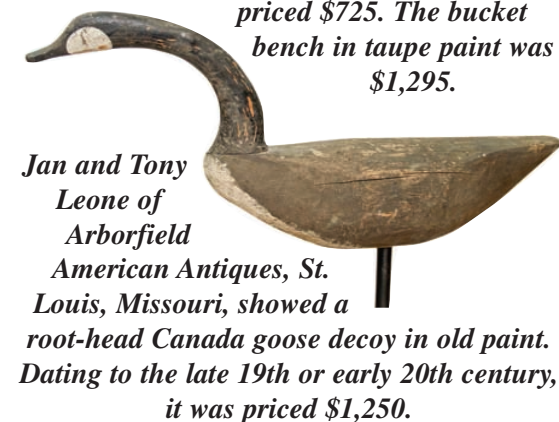
And then there were the game wheels. None was bigger nor shinier than the example offered by Don and Marta Orwig of Corunna, Ind. Made by Evans & Co. of Chicago, the piece was all-original, from the colorful paint to the tripod stand. At about 7 feet high and dating to the late 1920s, it was priced \$3,750. Randall D. Lippert of Chelsea, Mich., had a more primitive example in painted wood, wheel only, at \$525, while Bill and Karen Harper of Red Rooster Two Antiques in Vincennes, Ind., had a flax wheel that had been turned into a game wheel, painted red, white and blue, priced \$335.

For Pure and Simple, the wheel keeps turning up winning numbers. Buyers are convinced. "Best Antique show and sale in the Midwest," wrote one person on Facebook three days before the show. "Kokomo was the best ever," replied another patron in an email the day after the event.

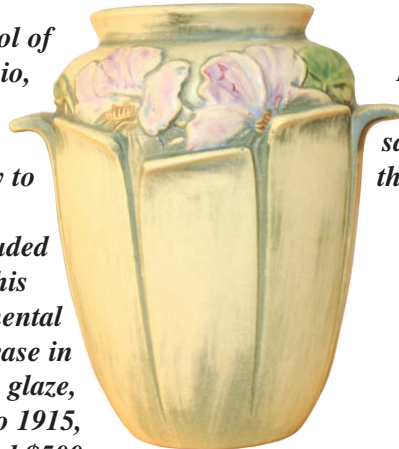

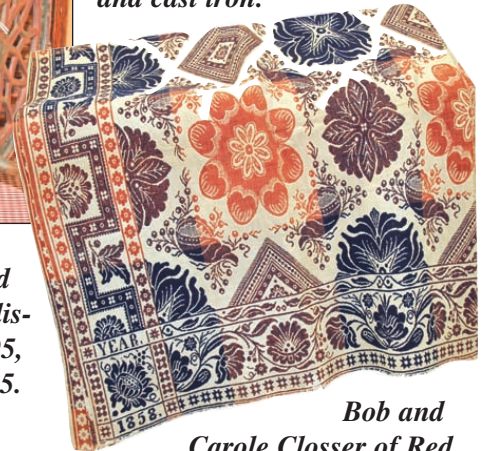
