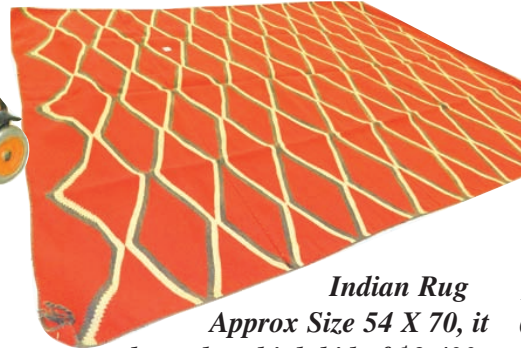
Hexton SW Wisconsin Knife 9 1/2 Inches Long, it brought \$1,000.

Waukesha Expo Center Hosts Spring Edition of the Lake Country Antiques & Art Show

There are more than 15,000 lakes in Wisconsin, and many folks think they're found mostly in the northern half of the state. But there's another watery Badger State playground as well: The "Lake Country," located just a short drive west of Milwaukee in the southeast corner of the state. And the more than one-hundred lakes found here have attracted visitors for a long time indeed.

Increase Lapham, father of the U.S. Weather Bureau, was making pioneering weather observations here well before Wisconsin became a state in 1848. Soon after, Delafield's celebrated Hawks Inn stagecoach inn opened, and the region became an important stop for travelers in what was then still part of the Michigan Territory. And the oldest degree granting institution in Wisconsin, Nashotah House, opened its doors here way back in 1842.

Today's Lake Country is best known as an upscale vacation destination. Whether you're a history buff, or just want to explore the many lakes, golf courses, and fine dining establishments in the area, you can't go wrong with a trip to the Lake Country. But of course there's another main attraction here: the Lake Country Antiques & Art Show

The Lake Country Antiques & Art Show, originally named the Delafield Antiques Show, has been bringing the best in antiques exhibitors here for a quarter of a century. Connecticut's Harold E. Cole and Bettina Krainen are always among them, bringing a fine selection of New England artifacts ranging from classic hollow-body copper weathervane figures to early American primitives. And New York State exhibitor James Wm. Lowery Fine Antiques' display was just as impressive – my pick there a classic American Chippendale four-drawer chest in fine condition.

In more of a Midwest mood? Look no further than Thomas Good Antiques, whose display was filled with Badger State country furnishings to spare. The country furniture theme continued at Beneath the Dust - a standout there a Southern Illinois punched tin pie safe in an apple green finish.

And fine art collectors are never disappointed by the selection here. Milwaukee's Ralph Spano Antiques brings dozens of noteworthy examples to each Lake Country Antiques & Art Show, specializing in regional oils & watercolors. London exhibitor Randall Hopkins Art & Antiques focuses on fine art too, but with an emphasis on traditional English rural scenes. 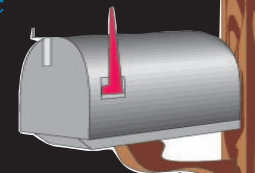

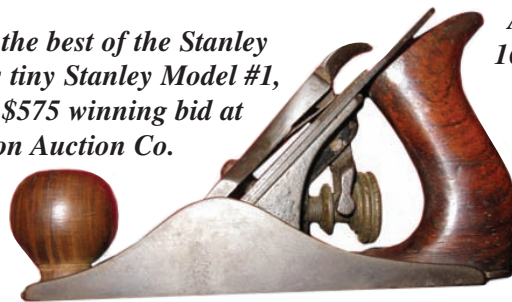

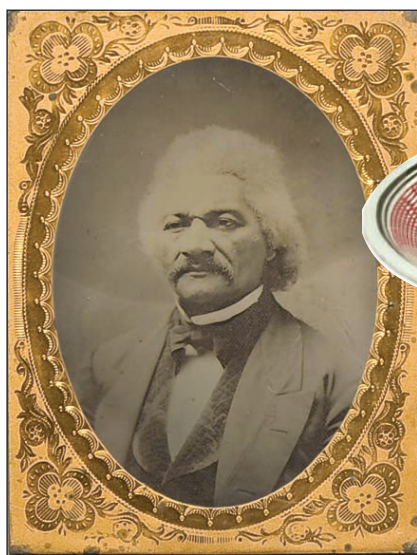

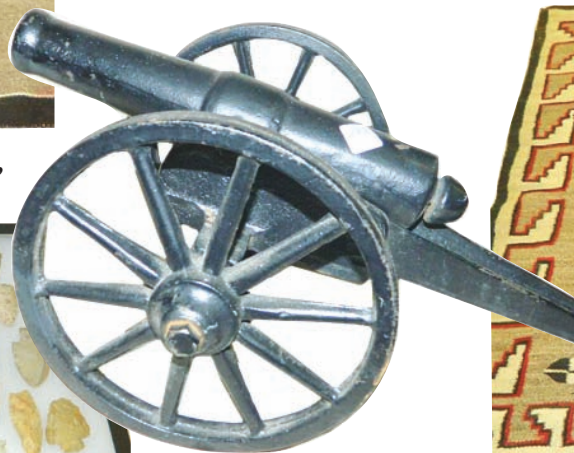

This show started 24 years ago with a few Daisy BB gun collectors in the backyard of Bob Surface's home in Swartz Creek, Michigan. It has grown over the years and now boasts over 100 tables of bb guns, airguns of all makes and models, and

toy guns. The name of the show was

changed to the Kalamazoo Airgun Show & Daisy Get Together to better describe that the show welcomes all types of airguns from antique to modern. This show is a wonderful informative gathering of collectors, shooters, friends and good times. Last year air gunners from approximately 16 states attended the show. Every year the show has been sold out, and the managers expect the same this year.

One of the many types of collectable airguns that will be featured at the show is airguns that were used as trainers by the military of different countries. During WWII the Czech had a Mauser-pattern bolt action service rifle that even mounted the standard bayonet. The Swiss used an air conversion system that fit into a Swiss K-31 rifle and made

by Hammerli. The Egyptians used a rifle made by the German firm Anschutz that resembled their Hakim service rifle. The Germans used a couple of trainers, both resembled the Mauser. The Mars was produced in Mehlis Germany and the Haenel which was designed by Hugo Schmeisser, of the sub-machine gun fame. Here in the USA we had a couple of Aerial Gunnery machine gun trainers, the MacGlashan Air Machine Gun Company from Long Beach California and the Hotpoint, made by Edison General Electric of Chicago Illinois. During the Vietnam War the army used an instinctive shooting training program. The guns were made by Daisy and had no sights. The first model looked just like an M16 rifle and is very rare.

The show will once again be held at the Kalamazoo County Fairgrounds Expo Center. This 8,500 square foot hall is wonderful with its great lighting, ample parking and its easy access off I-94 is an added bonus.

New host hotels this year will be the Fairfield Inn (269.353.6400) and the

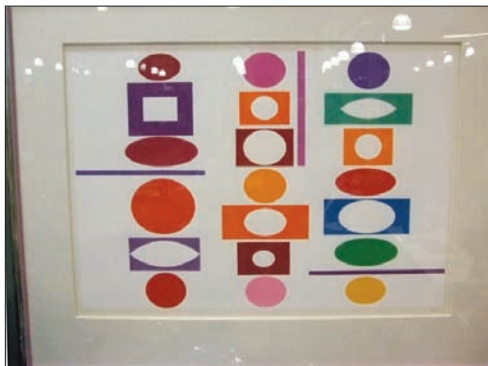
