
















Out & About

Great Finds Bring Buyers to the Centreville Show in July

Buying and selling antiques at Centreville is a family affair for many -- and for one teenager it started at age 5. "It's my parent's fault" chuckled 16-year-old Ariel Springborn of Decatur, Mich., while checking out a large box of collectible comic books, and purchasing several. She said she came to the July show to find some comics - and to assist in selling collectables in a nearby booth with her mother, aunt and grandmother.

Ariel's mom, Cindy Muir and aunt, Melody Swarthout and grandmother Chickie Morris displayed vintage toys, assorted antiques and more than 200 pieces of Pyrex glassware. "I just love Pyrex," said Aunt Melody who said the selection offered was priced from \$8 to \$100 each.

Another family, sisters Linda DeGroff and Stacy Cochard of Kendallville, Ind., filled several booths at the fairgrounds show. Catching lots of attention was an original green paint set of 4 metal deco style folding card table chairs that could seat guests at your home for \$69. Halloween collectors checked out their U.S. Metal 6-inch-tall horn-nose jack-o-lantern tagged at \$69. Linda said, "My obsessions are Christmas and Halloween items."

Still more glassware covered the tables of James Cooper of Grand Haven, Mich., who collects and sells Jadeite items. On display at the show was about five dozen examples priced from \$6 to \$175 each. Asked how many pieces he had in his own collection, he sighed and said, "I really don't have a clue."

"I fished it out of a dumpster behind an antique mall," said dealer Ron Staley of Delton, Mich., pointing to an unusual 24-inch-diameter saucer-shaped countertop brass contraption. The tag inside said it was made by V. Mueller & Co., Chicago, and was thought to be an early 1900s blood testing device. The "dumpster diving find" was priced at \$95.

Cast iron cookware collectors were treated to "before and after" looks at the vintage

pieces offered by Russ Wregglesworth of Buchanan, Mich. For example, the dealer showed an "as found" photo laying with a restored "The Favorite" 10-inch-diameter 1902 cast iron skillet made in a prison in Columbus, Ohio, and priced at \$60. With each restored item, a "before photo" showed the cast iron pieces as Wregglesworth found them, rusty and pitted.

"You never know what that guy is going to bring," said one shopper walking into the multiple-booth display of Paul Funk, Funk's Junk, Waldron, Mich. And once again he didn't disappoint. Covering six long tables were 170 dolls from the 1920s to 1980s and priced from \$20 to \$50 each. "I bought an entire doll collection," Funk said with a smile, adding, "guess I'm in the doll business for a while."

Quilt collectors were treated to fine examples in two booths at the Centreville show. A finely detailed 1940s queen size multiple-circle pattern quilt that was "in excellent condition with never-washed original sewing pencil lines was shown by Jeanne Rosie of Shipshewana, Ind. It could be taken home for \$600.

Meanwhile, a late 1800s feather-pattern appliquéd 83-by 84-inch quilt was priced at \$175 by dealer Denise McNabb of Mongo, Ind. The repeat Centreville dealer showed a business card stating, "Selling antiques since 1997."

Fine art filled the booth of Ervin Kimber of Fennville, Mich., who said he had "a two-story barnfull more at home." Stopping foot traffic was pair of papier mache' framed 20-by 40-inch Asian shadow puppets. The pair could grace your home for \$325.

When the day ended, dealers reported sales numbers in the usual mix of "very good" to "just okay."

Show promoter Bob Zurko evaluated the day with a smile and said, "I think we're really turning the corner. Centreville is starting to look vibrant and healthy."






