



Antique & Appraisal School Celebrates Half-Century Milestone



50th Anniversary

While not quite considered an "antique" just yet, the Asheford Institute of Antiques, a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles, and appraising, turned fifty this past week, mark-Asheford Institute NEW YORK, N ing a milestone in antiques and appraising education, as the longest running Institute of its kind. Although the school premiered its home-study program to the antique world in late 1965, it didn't officially open its doors to students until 1966.

> "We've seen an awful lot of changes since our inception" said Peter Green, the Institute's original founder. Green, who started the school based on the notion that there was a need for antique and appraisal education, said he could hardly believe how the antique and appraisal services market had grown over the past 50 years – "I can remember when antique stores were hard to find... now you can tap your phone and find virtually anything instantly!"

During the 1980's, Green's son, Charles took over the day-today operations of Asheford, and is the school's current director. When asked what he thought represented the Institute's high-water mark over Asheford Director, Charles the past fifty-years, Green unabashedly responded that the introduction Green Celebrating School's of the school's new online e-Course earlier this year was a game-changer for antique and appraisal education in general. "The e-Course allowed us to bring a half-century worth of teaching expertise to a new and expanded format," said Green. "With the ability to use online interactive

multimedia for instruction, we've really been able to raise the bar in antiques and appraising education for our students." Green went on to say that although online instruction had obviously become the new norm, the "textbook" version would still be offered for a number of years to come.

According to a press statement, as part of the school's year-long celebration, staff from the Institute will also participate in a traveling roadshow to commemorate the school's 50th anniversary. Plans reportedly include tours of major antique events and shows throughout North America, and will incorporate free appraisal clinics, business seminars and evaluations to mark the Institute's anniversary. "We really want to give something back to our students and those interested in antiques," said founder Peter Green, "It's been a great privilege to teach so many... it's just our way of saying thanks." Exact dates for upcoming events have yet to be released, but are expected to be announced later this month according to school spokesperson, Pamela Drew.

Well, after spending the day at the Elkhorn Antique Flea Market, I've decided I'll never shop retail again. Why buy new when there's just about everything you could possibly think of for your home right here. From furniture to fine art, plus more vintage jewelry, lighting, home accessories, collectibles, and tableware than you'd need in a lifetime. It's all here in one place, at prices that are just as attractive as the merchandise.

There's no doubt that the Elkhorn Antique Flea market is about the largest show of its kind in the region. But of course, bigger doesn't always mean better. We've all seen numerous "antiques markets" slowly degenerate into everyday flea markets. But even though the N. L. Promotions Elkhorn Antique Flea Market is one of the biggest around, it has remained one of the highest quality antiques markets in the Midwest.

The dealers here run the gamut - from professional show dealers with high-end antiques to weekenders selling old family treasures. Included among them this May was Whirligig Antiques, who came with a large inventory ranging from funky advertising to a great set of Conant Doyle Mid-Century Modern occasional tables. The Vintage Modern theme continued at Little Bohemia Antiques, where shoppers found a group of way-cool 1947 Thaden-Jordan bent plywood chairs in wonderful condi-

Things couldn't have looked more different than in Frank Madsen's display, purveyor of toys of every description. Choices there included everything from classic

Arcade cast iron cars to the pressed steel vehicles many of us played with as kids. Also there: a rare Ferdinand Strauss tin-litho Timber King #112 log hauling truck, dating from 1927 and priced at \$450.

Whirligig Antiques and Frank Madsen are both well-established dealers that you'll see at many shows throughout the year, but at Elkhorn, there are lots of smaller dealers that you won't find anywhere else. Some are locals selling off grandma's estate, some budding collectors just trying out the show-scene. Whether you're looking for funky furniture or industrial artifacts, vintage jewelry or vintage fashions, or pretty much anything else, you'll find it at Elkhorn in quantity. It's all here in one place, at prices that are just as attractive as the merchandise. Whether you're a dealer, decorator, or just a collector like me, I can't imagine a day spent at Elkhorn wouldn't be a productive one.

The Elkhorn Antique Flea Market is a one-day event, so get there early. Parking is always free, and admission only \$5. The gates open at 7:00 am, but you'll still be hard pressed to see even close to all of the five-hundred-plus dealers at any given show. Luckily, there are four Elkhorn shows every summer. The June 26th edition has come and gone, but you still have two more chances to get here in 2016: August 14th, or the season finale on September 25th. That September show is often the largest and best attended one of the year. Dates for the 2017 season are already set too, with Elkhorn Antique Flea Markets scheduled for May 21st, June 25th, August 13th, and September 24th. Just check out their website, www.nlpromotionsllc.com, for more details. And as always, keep an eye out for all of N. L. Promotions' upcoming show listings in the Auction Action Antique News!
