Fantastic Indian Relics Bring Strong Prices at Rainbow Traders

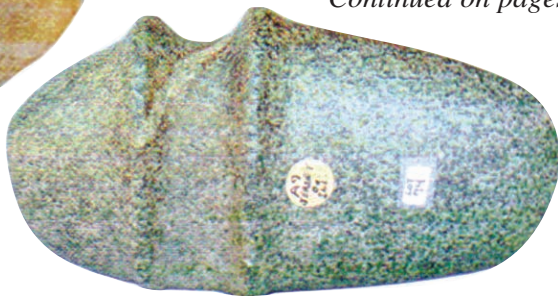

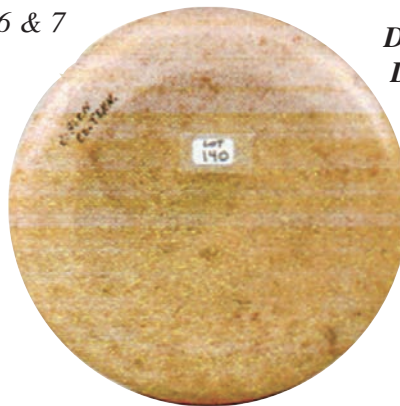

Trophy Ax from Illinois Brings \$8,200 at Rainbow Traders Auction

Born in 1933, Harold Carr has become known as a legend among artifact hunters for his ability & success in finding more than 150 axes in West Central Iowa and Northern MO. An Air Force veteran lifelong farmer who raised a fine family, Harold began hunting relics as a young boy on the family farm in Pendleton, Co., KY following horse drawn implements. Harold has continued to pursue his relic discoveries for more than 70 years.

Mr. Lou Pritchett grew up in the Memphis, TN area & extensively hunted Northeastern Arkansas counties amassing an impressive point & rare pottery collection.

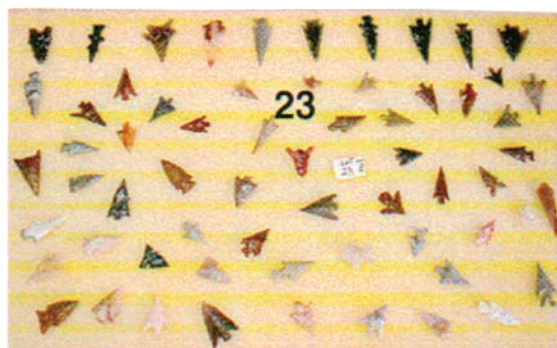
Rusty Flener of Wabash Co., Illinois has spent a lifetime searching the fields and creeks of the Illinois, Indiana Wabash river basin areas, resulting in many fine items.

James McKinney was known to have always carried an arrowhead in his pocket. Beginning in the 1930's as a young man, he hunted the fields, streams & cave shelters of Maries County, MO. Following his military service in the South Pacific in

World War II, in which he earned a Bronze Star, as well as playing baseball for the U.S. Army's traveling team. Mr. McKinney returned home to farm & manage the local MFA Farmers Elevator. Although he helped raise six fine children, coached softball teams for many years, farmed crops & cattle, he continued to expand his relic hunting areas to include Osage, Franklin, Gasconade and other Central Southern Missouri Counties. Jim enjoyed showing his collection to school children, and was a familiar presence at many Missouri Archaeological shows. Mr. McKinney was the recipient of several "Best of Show" and "Best Personal Find" awards at Missouri and Greater St. Louis Archaeological events over the years.

After retiring from a distinguished lifetime career in the U.S. Air Force in 1978, Master Sergeant Kenneth Mullins assisted his wife Sandra in assembling an impressive quality cookie jar collection.

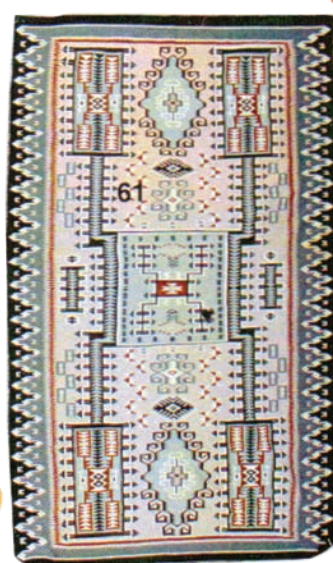


Oak frame with 63 Columbia River gem points from Washington & Oregon, \$1,300.

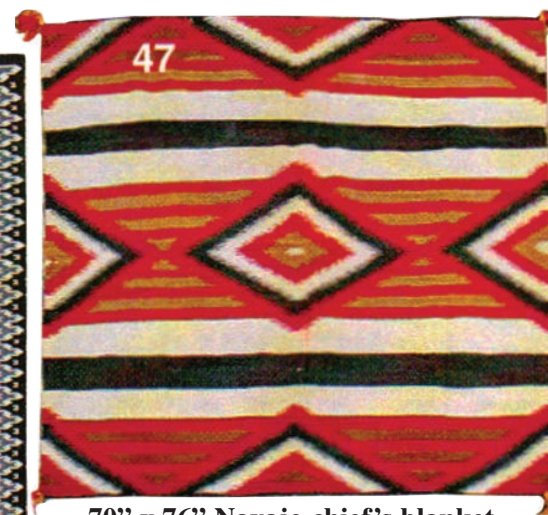

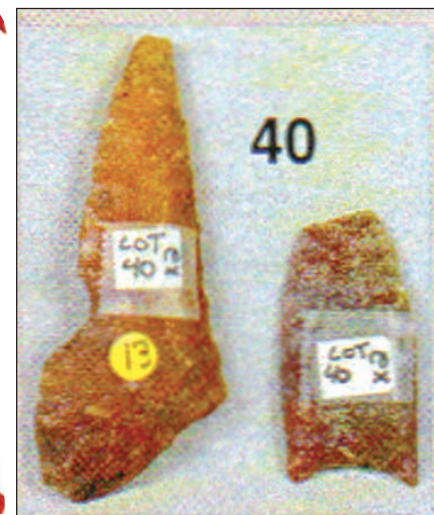

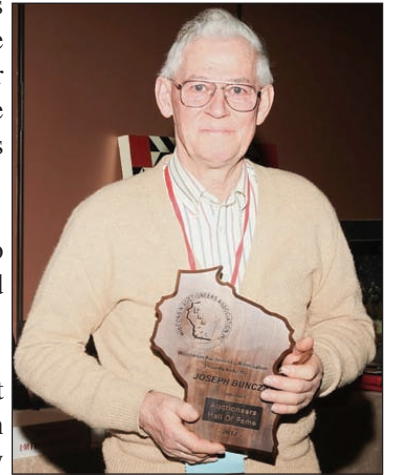
The WAA Auxiliary presented two scholarships to Taylor Hansen of Prairie Farm and Maria Bunzcak of Rosholt, WI.

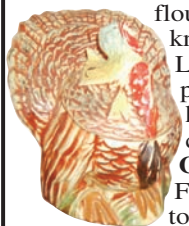
