Domestic Violence, Divorce & The Personal Property Appraiser



We have all heard stories about domestic violence, but no one in the communities of Weston, Schofield, and Rothschild, WI were prepared for the harsh reality that recently took place on Wednesday, March 22nd. In the end, the result left one police officer, an attorney and two bystanders dead. The shootings took place at three locations.

When the media released information that the shooter was Hmong, several people were quick to pass their judgment, based on the shooters race. It is unfortunate that a person can place blame based on a person's race or skin color. This senseless act had nothing to do with race. It was a case of domestic violence.

The attorney was representing the suspect's wife in a bitterly contested divorce action. The two bystanders had nothing to do with the case. It appears that they were just in the wrong place, at the wrong time. The police officer, who took an oath to protect and to serve, gave his life doing just that!

Nobody is immune to this growing problem in the United States. Domestic violence takes place everyday throughout this country. People of all ages and all races can be and are affected by it. Many people never give it a second thought until reality strikes. Since this incident took place, some attorneys have realized just how dangerous family law really is. They are now taking steps to increase their security.

Of all the appraisal assignments, dissolution of marriage is the most volatile situation that an appraiser can be put in. The problem is divorces can be nasty. The appraiser must be prepared for the parties to fight with a vengeance. What had been a union of two people based on love, has now become a separation based on anger, hate, and mistrust. As a personal property appraiser who specializes in divorce, I know first hand about the risks and dangers involved. There are precautions an appraiser can take that will reduce the odds of becoming the target of one of the parties.

Always remember, your task as an appraiser is to value the marital property as a basis for the court or the couple to use in dividing the property. You should never allow yourself to inflate or deflate a value merely to help one spouse that you feel is more right than the other one. Advocates are not what appraisers are. It should never matter to you what the other issues are in the case. Appraisals are supposed to be fair for both parties regardless.

I recommend that you never allow both parties to be together during the appraisal inspection. The risks of violence are significantly increased. Especially if there has been any form of domestic violence involved. Human behavior is one of the hardest things to predict. In one case, I had a knife pulled on me. In another case, I found

myself in between a couple due to the anger that was escalating. Luckily, I was able to defuse the situation. Need more proof of why having both parties together is a bad idea? A couple years back, my wife, who is a dispatcher for the Sheriff's Department, called me upset, asking where I was. I told her in the office why? She went on to tell me, a woman had just called 911 to report her husband was strangling the appraiser. You never know how the parties are going to react, once they are together.

Domestic violence is a learned pattern of abusive behavior. It can take many forms. It's not always just physical. Abuse can be psychological, economic, emotional, verbal and even sexual. The statistics are staggering. While domestic violence is not associated with all divorces, the potential is always there. A good practice for an appraiser is to go online to Wisconsin Circuit Courts and check the type of divorce it is. Is it a stipulated divorce or is it a contested one? I have found there is less risk of violence in a stipulated divorce.

You should also check to see if there is any history of violence involving either party. If you discover there have been past incidents, always be prepared. Another thing to remember, when it comes to domestic violence, it is not always the man that is the abuser.

An appraiser must always use caution in a divorce assignment. They also need to be respectful and understanding. It is often an emotional rollercoaster for some. There are times where there is a lot of anger. If a party verbally lashes out at you, take a step back and imagine yourself in their shoes. It is a trying time for some. A divorce can take an emotional toll on a person. It's also expensive and affects them financially. Never lash back at the party. The situation could turn explosive in a heartbeat.

Do not go into a divorce situation thinking it can't happen to me, because it can. Do not make the assumption that you're safe because you have a concealed carry license. Nobody is invincible. Be sure to take steps to minimize your chances of becoming a victim.

Despite the dangers and risks involved in divorce appraising, there is nothing on Earth I would rather be doing. People have asked me how I became so good at appraising for divorce. I tell them, I can relate to the parties because 1) I have been through a divorce and have experienced the anger and the hurt. 2) My sister and I are domestic violence survivors.

Domestic violence is a growing problem. It can strike anyone at anytime. The results can be devastating. The recent shootings have changed many lives forever. I remember many times my mother, sister and I would run away with only the clothes on our backs. Many times we found ourselves hiding and sleeping in a car. We never knew if our step father would actually show up and make good on his threats. We were fortunate, we survived but there are many, many scars that do not show up on the surface.



Grooved Ax from St. Charles County, MO, Brings \$7,500 at Rainbow Traders Auction

Dennis Arbeiter of Rainbow Traders said, "We are encouraged in these economic climates at the enthusiasm that continued to push Native American Indian art and relics, the items from our historic and ancient American past". Prices were strong throughout this auction, with excellent quality items crossing the block.

Mr. Paul J. Hendricks grew up in Indianapolis and started collection Native American & Precolumbian relics & paintings shortly after he graduated from college, enrolled in the Peace Corps and served in Venezuela. During a long career of teaching business and speech communications in the San Diego area, Mr. Hendricks continued to collect. His extensive collecting interests resulted in the establishment of his Museum in Metmora in 1987. Having decided to retire, Mr. Hendricks closed the museum and decided to share his assemblage with the collecting community after 50 years of having the thrill of acquiring & curating the unusual items.

Having retired from the medical profession in St. Louis, MO, Don & Diane Leahart decided to share their lifetime collection. Don has stated that it was always his intention to enjoy these items and then return the same to the collectiong community at retirement. The Leahart assemblage ranges widely from local Missouri ancient arrowheads and axes, through Precolumbian, ancient and Southwestern contemporary pottery, as well as fine historic baskets.

The late William Horn was a well known Civil Engineer who worked on Harbors, Chicago rapid transit, the World Trade Center, grain elevators and bridges. A Navy Veteran who raised four fine children. William was always a collector of antiques, old firearms and Indian relics.

James H. McKinney was known to have always carried an arrowhead in his pocket. Beginning in the 1930's as a young man, he hunted the fields, streams and cave shelters of Maries Co., MO. Following his military service in the South Pacific in WWII, in which he earned a Bronze Star, as well as playing baseball for the U.S. Army's traveling team, Mr. McKinney returned home to farm and manage the local MFA Farmers Elevator. Although he helped raise six children, coached softball teams for many years, farmed crops and cattle, he continued to expand his relic hunting areas to include Osage, Franklin, Gasconade and other Central Southern Missouri counties. Jim enjoyed showing his collection to school children, and was a familiar presence at many Missouri Archaeological shows. Mr. McKinney was the recipient of several "Best of Show" and "Best Personal Find" awards at Missouri and Greater St. Louis Archaeological events over the years.







The Friends of Hearthstone support the preservation of this historically significant home and provide tours, exhibits and special events to share its unique history with the public.

This year's 20th Annual Appleton Antique Show & Sale will be held Saturday, April 8th from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday, April 9th from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is \$6 and good both days of the event. 





Antiques & Appraising School Releases Data On Top Selling Items



The latest results from the Asheford Institute Of Antiques survey of buying trends within the antiques and collectibles community were recently published online this past week by the school's Research & Polling Department.

After conducting similar surveys over the past five years, the internationally recognized home-study school on antiques, collectibles and appraising, released its latest trending data from the antiques marketplace for the 2016 year. The survey, which concentrated on compiling and grouping information related to customers buying habits over a twelve month period, was brought back this year after a strong response on the school's website from readers requesting updates from previous surveys, said current Director of the Institute, Charles Green. He went on to note that there were some interesting differences between the results from this poll, and

those from previous years. "We've made our questionnaire sharper, and more specific, as well as bringing the participant base up to over 1,200 respondents, but the questions are still essentially the same," said Green, "even though the answers are quite different."

Carlee Jackson, the school's public relations director agreed with Mr. Green's assessment, and stated that the main goal of this year's survey was to once again measure the interest in current trends of antiques and collectibles, based on actual sales results and requests for specific items.

She noted that while the survey was informal in nature, and not predicated on scientific formulas, the results were still quite compelling when viewed in their entirety. "What we're seeing is a strong change in direction when it comes to certain areas of the decorative arts..." said Jackson, "It's not just Mid-century modern that's moving, but a number of other areas that are also making up ground." Jackson went on to note that interest in 1960's and 70's collectibles, particularly space and Star Wars related items, had also risen sharply as well. "There's no doubt in my mind that these are the new younger collectors that we're seeing today," said Carlee. "They're the one's who are really beginning to drive the industry forward."

Aside from the popularity of Mid-century modern furniture, many of the younger dealers from the survey also noted that literally anything twentieth-century, from brutalist metal sculptures to lesser known painters had also become increasingly sought after by both dealers and collectors. "We're in a virtual bidding war every time something from this era comes up," said Shannon Smith, a young east coast dealer. "Honestly, sometimes I wonder if it's worth all the fuss!"

Older dealers seemed to echo a similar sentiment, but indicated that there were other areas of the market that were beginning to show signs of renewed interest, particularly in the area of Greek and Egyptian revival styles - especially when done in stone and marble. Claude Paquin, a longtime dealer from Quebec, said some of his Victorian marble-top side tables, which hadn't moved in years, were suddenly flying out the door. "Who knows," said Paquin, "...maybe it's the beginning of something old!"




