Lightning Strikes Twice at Semi-Annual Chicagoland Antique Advertising, Slot Machine & Jukebox Show

Just two days before the April 7th thru April 9th Chicagoland Antique Advertising, Slot Machine and Juke Box Show all eyes were on the sky's changing weather.

Fifty mile an hour winds and rain--sometimes mixed with snow--hammered the Pheasant Run Resort, some 35 miles west of Chicago, the site of the semi-annual event. But as the show began, warmer temperatures and clear skies greeted visitors and dealers alike.

It wasn't weather-related, but one dealer at the show exclaimed, "lightning did strike twice!" In November of 2015, Bill Rawski of Zap Props Inc., Chicago showed and sold a rare 1908 one-penny cast iron Berger vending machine for what he termed "a five-figure price, and only the



Buyers & Dealers come from Around the Country for the **Semi-Annual Chicagoland Show**

At the April gathering this year, Rawski was all smiles again, showing a fourth example of that same cast iron machine which he priced at \$15,000. Within hours the 16" tall original was wisked off the floor to a new owner at an undisclosed but "close" price.

While some folks talked about Rawksi's fantastic find, still others roamed around his varied offerings-- spread over 10 booths! Many people checked out two large early neon signs. a 1 1/2 by 3-foot sign spelling out GAS could be taken home for \$5,000, and a USED CARS 48" example could light up your place for \$8,500.

Since the April show is held during many school spring breaks, the Pheasant Run Restort Mega Center welcomed a generous mix of parents and kids - some of the younger set helping out on the show floor.

Nathan Lippe of Hanover Park, IL, once again was assisted by daughters Charlotte, 7 and Hannah, 4. The girls helped Dad set up advertising signs, including a 1940s 12" by 24" 1940s Sweetheart Bread sign, priced at \$325, and a 48" tall 1960s Reddy Kilowatt sign priced at \$95.

It was a "dad and lad" shopping trip for 25 year coin op veteran collector Shawn Flock and 13-year-old son Orrin. The pair drove to Chicago from Hesperia, MI, north of Muskegon, and the teen took home two machines for his collection. Did he get a good deal? He smiled and said, "The guy wanted \$20 for one of them, but I got him down to \$10."

Serious vending machine collectors hovered around the booth of Paul Hindin of Mequon, WI, for a closer look at two examples. One "objects of desire" was a circa 1918 O Pee Chee porcelain front chewing gum vendor --which Hindin said there are "less than six known", priced at \$7,995. Others checked out his Mitt Muist German Chocolate and music vendor, circa 1899, priced at \$7,500. Many People admired his 1920s countertop Fey cast aluminum finger striker strength tester that you could try at home for \$20,000.

As usual, dozens of slot machine and gambling devices filled the booth of Frank Zygmunt Jr., Westmont, IL, priced from \$500 and up. Many collectors stopped to admire the fancy cast iron design on his countertop 1912 Caille Silver Cup trade stimulator. Made in Detroit, MI, the unusual two dial 19" tall trade stimulator could be played at your house for spare change - and \$45,000.

Still another Caille item, this time a 1907 immaculately restored Waterman outboard motor, was shown by B.J. Pawlaczyk of Au Gres, MI. The collector said there was a sale pending on the rare motor "in the neighborhood of \$20,000." Other outboard motors on display were priced at \$1,195 and up. Pawlaczyk said he had sold-out his entire booth three times in the past 15 years showing at of Chicagoland.

Music from vintage jukeboxes were the order of the day for during three days of the show. Multiple tunes filled the booth of John Papa, National Juke Box Exchange, Mayfield, N.Y., with full color to accompany the sounds of those jukes.

A trio drawing attention included a 1920s Rowe "Bubbler" priced at \$3,500, a 1940s Wurlitzer 850 Peacock priced at \$14,500, and a 1940s Packard Manhattan tagged \$4,500. Papa said the April Chicagoland show marked his "61st show in a row, never missing one."

Brothers Bob and Richard Sandage drove to Pheasant Run from Louisville, Ky., to show jukeboxes and other collectables. Many people stopped to admire, listen and play their 1940 all- original restored Wurlitzer 700 that offered 24 different selections, priced at \$5,500. The brothers, known for quality restorations, have been coming to the show for 30 years.

The popular tall, slender 1950's Coca-Cola '44 bottle 10-cent vending machine is still the No.1 want for many collectors, and John Mahar of Saginaw, MI, offered a prime example. "It works perfect," said the dealer, adding "it'll fit in just about anywhere and priced right at \$3,900."

Although there's plenty of on-the-spot buying and selling, the semi-annual Chicagoland event also is popular for completing deals made throughout the year. For example, Keith and Tammy Stelter of Buchanan, MI, completed a swap involving two coin-operated upright arcade games that Gerard Leuchter of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada met with the couple, made the trade, and as Stelter said, "We both walked away happy."

Nona Amour Wilson of North Star Collective, Park Falls, WI, wore two hats at the Chicagoland show. One was to sell high end advertising items spread over several booths - and to promote the Indy Advertising Show's new location and expansion. Wilson purchased the twice-a-year event and moved it from Indianapolis to the Boone County Fairgrounds in Lebanon, IN, south of Indianapolis. She is promoting it as the "Boone County Treasure Hunt." She said she was "excited that well over 100 dealers have already signed up for the Ad Show." In addition to the Ad Show, a Gas and Oil Show, Vintage Market and auction are scheduled Sept. 23 and 24 at the same fairgrounds location.

Some families on spring break roamed around the trading floor while others took advantage of the indoor-outdoor swimming pool and special events planned by the resort for all ages.







The History of the JW McCoy & Brush-McCoy Potteries

In 1848, J.W. McCoy was born and raised in Putnam, which is now part of Zanesville, Ohio. He was married in 1870, and the next year he and Sarah (Sade) Elizabeth Brown his wife, moved to Uniontown in Newton Township, Muskingum County. There J.W. operated a dry good store.

In 1871, the McCoy's moved to the community of Roseville, Ohio. There he entered into about a five-¬year partnership with his father-in-law, James E. Brown in a general merchandise business, which was called "Brown & McCoy".

Then in 1876, J.W. opened a General Merchandise store on his own. In 1886, he entered into a partnership and established the "Williams and McCoy Pottery Co.". After about four years of operation a new partner was taken in and the pottery was renamed the "Kildow, Williams and McCoy Pottery Co.". According to, "The Business Review of Muskingum County", "This plant was one of the most extensive in the valley and produced all kinds of common stoneware and a variety of culinary utensils."

Then in 1890, after about two more years of operation, the KW&M pottery was renamed again, and was called the Midland Pottery Co. By 1892, J.W. was not only involved in pottery manufacturing, and retail pottery sales, but he had become a pottery jobber, selling bulk wares to wholesale dealers.

In 1898, following about six years of operation under the name the Midland Pottery Co., the pottery was sold to the "Roseville Pottery Co.". This ended the partnerships J.W. had in the pottery business. Since very few pieces from these early potteries that J.W. was affiliated with have been found, it is most likely that most of them were unmarked.

As discussed in, "The History of the W. Nelson McCoy's Blue Bird Pottery", (seen elsewhere on this Web site), Wilber F., the cousin of J.W., was a partner in the "Zanesville Hardware Company". The date that Wilber's part-ownership in the store was established remains uncertain, but it was probably between 1870 and 1875.

In 1899, J.W. along with several investors, formed a pottery solely under his name, the J.W. McCoy Pottery Co. He must have devoted much of his time to his new pottery, for in 1901, he turned the management of his general store over to his son Arthur.

For several years, the "J.W. McCoy Pottery Co." concentrated on the production of the simpler, utilitarian stoneware pieces. However, around late 1902 the pottery branched out and began to include the production of art pottery. The art pottery production consisted of elaborately designed, decorative items such as jardinières and pedestals, various other flower containers, umbrella stands, and sand jars. The production of these attractively glazed pieces proved to be a very successful undertaking.

In 1909, George Brush joined the "J.W. McCoy Pottery Co.". Prior to that time he had established a pottery under his own name. However, the pottery only operated about one year before a fire destroyed the entire plant. The "Brush Pottery" was not rebuilt, but he retained the remaining assets of the Brush Pottery. Later in the year after his pottery burned, George Brush became the Manager of the "Globe Stoneware Company", and the "Crooksville Clay Products Company".

After joining the "J.W. McCoy Pottery", within two years George Brush had become the General Manager of the pottery. In October of that year, the directors of the McCoy pottery decided to expand the pottery by the purchase of the "Globe Stoneware Co." (1901-1911).

During August of 1911, George Brush, acting on behalf of the Brush Pottery interests, purchased the old "J.B. Owens Pottery", Plant Number One in Zanesville (1883-1909), along with the equipment and molds. Late in 1911, the officers of the "J.W. McCoy Pottery", at the suggestion of George Brush, agreed to combine the assets of the company with those of the "Brush Pottery". Consequently, George Brush obtained the controlling interest in the "J.W. McCoy pottery", and the name of the pottery was changed to the "Brush – McCoy Pottery".

In 1912, the "Brush-McCoy Pottery" purchased the equipment and molds from the "A. Radford Pottery", which was located in Clarksville, West Virginia.

In 1918, the McCoy family sold their interest in the Brush – McCoy Pottery; however, it was not until late 1925 that the directors of the pottery dropped the McCoy name. The new name of the pottery was the Brush Pottery Co., and it operated under that name until it closed in 1982.




