The weather was cold and windy, but the bidding was hot and furious at the April 29th, 2017 auction at Garnavillo Auction. The standing-room-only crowd vied throughout the day for the 671 items on the auction.

A 27-drawer walnut spool cabinet with center mirror threaded its way to the high bid of the day at \$1,500. Interest in mahogany double china with secretary and three mirrors reached \$1,375. The large ship wheel navigated a final bid of \$1,250 while the arts and crafts library table booked in at \$1,125.

Dr. Pratt's Medicine Show four-wheeled covered wagon rolled to a stop at \$1,375. Another advertising piece, an early large store coffee advertising tin brewed to \$775. A 12 punch tin pie safe baked to \$725 while 36 draw Nebraska Seed Co. cabinet planted \$500.

Buyers' rung up big sales at the cash registers offered at the auction. A National Model #318 dollar-ringer with original marquee registered

\$800. Another National with a special order check print cashed in at \$675. A Corticelli spool cabinet, 7-drawer walnut cash register tendered \$600.



Smileage sign, \$800.

Signs displayed interest with a B.F. Goodrich "Smilage" advertising sign grinning at the \$800 winning bid. The Coca-Cola porcelain lollipop sign licked a \$650 bid and a 1950s Schlitz framed beer sign

hopped to \$275. A mini-baseball bat display slugged its way to \$200.

Antique furniture carved some impressive results at the sale. A large refinished Oak hi-boy with beveled glass realized \$600 while a Victorian 6-drawer walnut chest

settled at \$400. An Oak corner china cabinet with beveled glass, oval mirror and clawed feet finished at \$600.

Steel-pressed toys played well with a four-piece tractor and accessory set raking in \$200; a Structo two-piece tractor and back hoe digging \$100; a press steel bus stopping at \$110; a train and tender pulling into the station at \$90 and a 1920s Structo dump truck unloading at \$90.

The auction also featured 37 lots of bike accessories and parts. Bike luggage racks stored a bid of \$110 while cables and lights beamed a \$150 bid. Bike tire pumps and levels inflated a \$130 bid.

Other bids of interest included a Roseville Futura pottery piece for \$300; 42" church pew kneeled at \$225 while six oak-back saloon chairs sat at \$250. A collage of 50 butterflies floated to \$500 while a large reverse painted panel lamp lit up a \$525 bid.

Adopting real Florida manatees for family and friends this Holiday season is nature-inspired, thoughtful gift-giving that helps Save the Manatee Club increase conservation and education efforts for the endangered marine mammals and their aquatic habitat. It also helps holiday shoppers stretch those often limited budgets.

Last year, Lisa Cartossa from Holt, Missouri, decided that since her two young nieces, Lily and Rose from North Carolina, were fortunate enough to have most everything they needed, she would adopt manatees as Christmas presents for them. Lisa chose adoptees "Paddy Doyle" and "Flash," who regularly winter at Blue Spring State Park, from Save the Manatee Club's Adopt-A-Manatee program. All of the manatees available for adoption can be viewed on the Club's website at <http://www.savethemanatee.org/adoptees.htm>. Two new manatees recently added to the list of adoptees are from Alabama, "Zewie" and "Bama."

An annual manatee adoption costs \$25, which is just a little over \$2 a month, and includes a color photo of a real manatee, an adoption certificate, biography, membership handbook, and subscriptions to the Club's newsletters which feature updated reports on the manatees in the adoption program. Shipping is free within the United States. Gift adoptions are sent with a personalized holiday message. Or for a \$35 tax-deductible donation, each new member will also receive Save the Manatee Club's 2012 wall calendar, featuring spectacular manatee photos to enjoy all year and well past.

"When my nieces received their adoption packets for Christmas, I was told you could not have heard two children screaming with excitement louder than they were," said Lisa. "Immediately, the manatees' pictures went on their walls. They knew about

manatees, but Save the Manatee Club's adoption program created this passion and enthusiasm in them that's very wonderful for me as an adult to be part of. I can't tell you how thrilled my nieces are to get the newsletter addressed personally to them. They read every word front to back. Who knows, the Club may have just created the next generation of marine life specialists dedicated to the conservation of these wonderful creatures."

Save the Manatee Club, a national nonprofit organization, was co-founded thirty years ago by singer/songwriter Jimmy Buffett. Funds from the Holiday gift adoptions help with manatee rescue, rehabilitation, and release efforts; research; education and public awareness projects; conservation work to protect manatees and their habitat; and for programs in the United States, Central and South America, the Wider Caribbean, and West Africa. Manatees are listed as endangered at the state, federal, and international levels.

Patrick Rose, aquatic biologist and Executive Director of the Club, points out that manatees face tremendous challenges to their survival from human activities. "In Florida alone, since record-keeping began in 1974, more than 38% of manatee deaths where cause of death is known were human-related. So it is imperative that we continue to educate the public about the presence of manatees in our waters. Adopting a manatee is a great way to learn more about this beloved species and how to help make a difference in their lives."

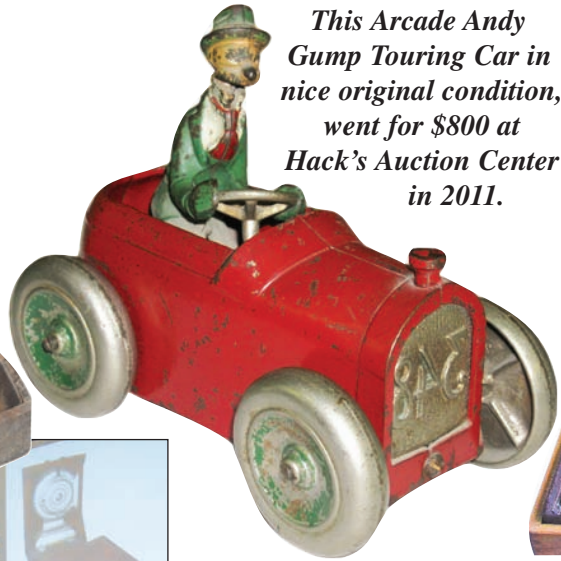

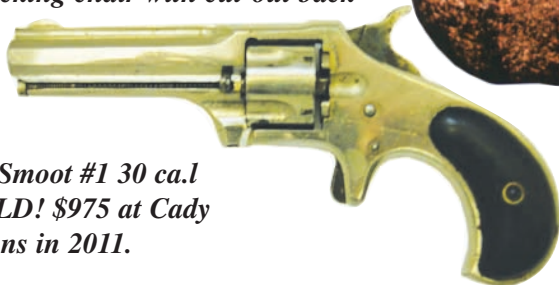

Through our research we were able to bring clarity to the (4) grades of Evans decoys (Mammoth, Standard, Competitive, and Hardware Store) and the distinguishing characteristics between each grade. The objective of the book was not to speculate, but only make claims based on known/documented facts. The book was completed in April 2017 and available to collectors at the 2017 North American Vintage Decoy and Sporting Collectibles Show. Given that this has been the first comprehensive publication regarding Walter Evans and his decoys, it has been well received and appreciated by collectors.

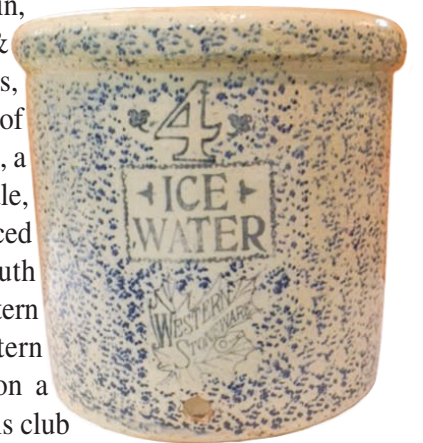

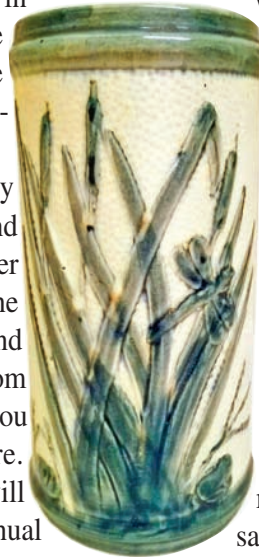
