Shoppers Come From all Around to Centreville Antique & Collectible Show in Search of Treasures

Gary Petelle of Churubusco, Ind., 15 miles northwest of Fort Wayne showed off a fancy 18-inch-long commercial cast iron Bonanza apple peeler priced at \$295. At the same spot, a 24-inch-tall Jardiniere and pedestal with daffodill flower pattern could grace your home for \$365.

The dealer opened his shop, Gary's on Main in Churbusco in 2015 and hours are Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 4p.m. and "by chance or appointment" at other times.

He called attention to "lots more dealers and shoppers" at Centreville in July.

More than 350 items including 1890s R.S. Prussia, Waterford Crystal, Lalique vases, depression glass and fine pottery filled the outdoor tent manned by Jeff Botruff, Cutlerville Antiques and Collectibles, Grand Rapids, Mich. The dealer said they were priced from \$5 to \$250 each and were "just a sample of the items offered in his shop.

"Those shades are outlandishly gorgeous" gushed one shopper pointing to a matching pair of 3-foot-tall 1950s lamps, with wavy shades. They were tagged \$65 for the pair by Lori West, proprietor of Jive Junction, Galesburg, Mich. The dealer said she opened the shop in "in a small storefront" on Mother's Day weekend adding "it's going well." Her business card reads, "an eclectic mix of vintage, re-purposed and jazzy junk."

Also from Galesburg, Ken and Karen Mahaffay have a spot at Burgess Antique Mall, downtown Galesburg. They are five-year Centreville dealers and called attention to "regular customers" adding that promoter Bob Zurko is "easy and fair to work with." Scale collectors checked out their early 1900s cast iron and brass Fairbanks Scale number 2, priced at \$125. Catching many an eye was a late 1800s cast iron collar crimper offered at \$95. "I asked my wife to crimp my collar with the device," said Ken, chuckling, "But I just got ignored."

"Mark it sold," said dealer Jim Dykstra of Coldwater, Mich., pointing to a 1940s Marx wind-up tin "Sparks" race car with a price tag of \$125. The dealer also offered a 12-inch-tall 1940s pewter pitcher "in need of some loving care" for \$29.

Morton and Kathleen Tucker traveled to the show from Hobart, Ind., and offered antiques and collectibles in a wide price range. A good looking 1962 black

Illinois Bell telephone that Tucker said "works like a champ" could dial up at your home for \$60. Foot traffic stopped at their booth to admire a 5-foot-tall fancy brass and cast iron floor lamp with original shade priced at \$600. 517-368-4909

Carol Lindsey of Delton, Mich., has been setting up at the Centreville market "on and off for 25 years." Primitive collectors admired her early 1900s square nail construction table measuring a whopping 12-feet-long and priced at \$250. Others checked out her 30 by-33-inch hardrock maple butcher block table tagged at \$450. A 28-inch-long butcher cleaver perched along side the massive table could be taken home – and used – for \$125.

"I've got about a thousand books for sale here at Centreville and another quarter million back at home," said book dealer Denny Olson of Vicksburg, Mich. He pointed out two of his favorites: A 1908 hardcover "Dorothy and the Wizard of Oz" priced at \$200 and a 1939 hardcover "Nicodemus and the Gang" that could also be read and displayed for \$200. Others at his booth were priced at \$1 and up.

"I love to buy military items – and sell them too," said dealer Ed Danaher of Jones, Mich. Sword collectors checked out his World War II german police sword and an 1840 Civil War artillery model priced at \$650 each. A collection of WWII knives were offered for \$20 to \$500 each. The dealer said he enjoyed good luck in July both buying and selling at the fairgrounds show.

Among the many shoppers at the Centreville market were Three Rivers, Mich., residents Brian and Elizabeth Dangelo and 19-month-old son Oliver, who was carried on dad's back with an awning-top backpack. "We usually come to every show," said Brian, adding ,"We're looking for items for our finished basement." The tiny tot seemed very comfortable on Poppa's back.

The next Centreville Antique Market is scheduled Aug. 13 at the St. Joseph County Fairgrounds at Centreville, Mich., just south of Kalamazoo.

"And we expect shoppers from the big Michigan Highway U.S. 12 statewide garage sale that stretches from Detroit to New Buffalo on that same weekend," said promoter Zurko. He added, "We're just 12 miles north of Sturgis, Mich., part of the trail for that big event."



Antiques Abbreviations

by Mike Paul

A while ago a reader asked about explaining some of the abbreviations they encounter in auction ads. This got me thinking about the abbreviations auctioneers use and why we use them. After a phone call to Gloria I offered to put together a listing.

By definition, an abbreviation is a shortened form of a word or phrase used for brevity. Within context and reason it identifies certain aspects of a piece to the buyer without needlessly going into detail. A lamp buyer will know what a "bracket lamp" is. It's unnecessary to say, "Victorian cast iron wall bracket with mercury glass reflector, chimney & drop in finger font". Most auctioneers use abbreviations in order to keep the size of the ad affordable. However it can be too much of a good thing and some of the more arcane descriptions can confuse or mislead the reader. To a person who collects a particular category most abbreviations in that category are readily recognized. To anybody else they are probably gibberish. Even a novice farm toy buyer won't need a three day weekend to decipher IH, McD & JD. WWI & WWII are obvious but would most folks recognize CW (Civil War) out of context? Coins, firearms, Hummels (152/A TMK3 UB K255 HB, anyone?) and other categories all have their own abbreviations that often are exclusive to that field. But if you are a glassware buyer does it really matter if you can't translate a 28g, o/u, d-bbl, ss w/syn stock and vr?

Some descriptions, while not technically correct, get the point across. For example "Jewel T', (which is short for Jewel Tea, a grocery chain) takes up less space than "Autumn Leaf", (a pattern name for china offered as a premium by Jewel Tea). This may seem like a trivial difference but similar descriptions over several publications begin to add up.

A listing that encompassed all of the collecting fields would be more of a project than I can take on but the following abbreviations should get you through most ads for antique auctions. If you have others you'd like to add to the list or that you've wondered about, please email them to me at mike@paulauction.com.

A&C - Arts & Crafts. Refers to the style of furniture usually associated with early 1900s Stickley. Often but erroneously referred to as Mission or Prairie.

ABC - American Brilliant Cut. Refers to the "Brilliant" period of late 19th/early 20th century American cut glass

B&H – Bradley & Hubbard. A manufacturer of quality lighting and decorative accessories.

B&W – Blue & White. The glaze colors used on utilitarian stoneware that was often found in the kitchen.

CI - Cast Iron.

COP – Century Of Progress. Typically refers to souvenirs hauled back from the Chicago World's Fair of 1933/34. Even in the middle of the Great Depression, a lot of Wisconsinites made the trip to see the COP.

CRS - Somebody explained this to me once, but I can't seem to remember what they said.

Dmg - Damage.

gl - Gallon. Typically used when advertising stoneware capacity

For Rest - For Restoration. Don't go to the auction expecting a cream puff.

GBCF - Glass Ball Claw Foot. Describes the foot usually found on late Victorian parlor and lamp tables.

GWTW - Gone With The Wind. A style of lamp with a matching font and top globe. Correctly referred to as a parlor lamp but popularly known as a Gone With The Wind, after the movie of the same name.

LRRH- Little Red Riding Hood. Typically refers to the Regal China products that feature her.

MIB - Mint In Box. Any item, but often a toy, that is in the same condition as new and in the original box.

MOP - Mother of Pearl. Polished nacre usually derived from mollusk shells. Typically found in jewelry, ladies dresser articles, buttons and in the windows of RPOG art.

NIB - New In Box. Similar to above but often assumed to be of modern production NOS - New Old Stock. Old merchandise, often with original manufacturer's tags and merchant's price tags, that has never been sold or used.

NWOT - New With Original Tags, but sometimes used as New With Out Tags. eBay sellers are usually guilty of using this both ways. If buying online, clarify before bidding.

o/b - Outboard. An outboard motor.

OOB - Oil on Board. Art work done on a board, usually Masonite.

OOC - Oil on Canvas. Art work done on canvas.

Pre Pro - Pre Prohibition, prior to 1920. Refers specifically to alcohol related advertising.

Post Pro - Post Prohibition, after 1933. Refers specifically to alcohol related advertising.

QA - Queen Anne. Generally refers to a 1920's or 30's revival style exemplified by a cabriole leg.

Repro - Reproduction. A good definition would require a separate article but you get the idea. Occasionally people will use the slang "Repop" for repro or "Repo" which is inaccurate and what happens to your car when Vinnie pulls up in a tow truck.

RPOG - Reverse Painted on Glass. Less common as ROG. Any item where the design or artwork has been applied to the obverse side of the glass but typically a lamp shade, decorative framed art or advertising items.

RPPC – Real Photo Post Card. Differentiates a post card that was printed, (developed) off your film from one that was commercially printed. These were so popular that Kodak marketed the 3A folder specifically for the RPPC.

RR – Railroad.

RW – Red Wing. Red Wing, or less often, the several other stoneware companies that called Red Wing, MN their home.

/s/ - Signed.

s/g - Salt Glaze. Refers to the type of glaze used on stoneware and to differentiate it from the later, more common, zinc glaze.

TOC - Tin Over Cardboard. A type of sign made of tin wrapped over a piece of paperboard and hung by a piece of short thread mounted to the back side of the sign. Commonly used in the 1930's and 40's by brewing and other industries.

T&S- Time & Strike. Refers to clock movements. Differentiates between time only and striking movements.

WII German Technische Nothilfe Dress Dagger Brings \$2,200 at Cady Auction Gallery

On April 23 the first of the 3 auctions was held. The auction was attended by a strong in-house crowd, very active phone bidders and a large number of online bidders, equaling 700 bidders. Some of the hottest and most sought after items were knives and daggers especially German WW II. Topping the list was a WWII German Technische Nothilfe Dress Dagger selling for \$2200 (all prices are before buyer's premium), a WWII German Kriegsmarine dagger Model II sold for \$800 and a WWII German paratrooper gravity knife sold for \$600. Other WW III sharp edges that were fought over were a Japanese Samurai sword with an iron tusba guard with the bidding ending at \$2000, a United States M3 Fighting Knife with Scabbard selling for \$850 and a New Zealand / Australian fighting knuckle knife with sheath selling for \$600. Other examples of WWII items that were popular were a M38 US Army 3rd Armored Division tanker helmet selling for \$975, Japanese Type 99 81mm

mortar selling for \$500, German 1939 U-Boat badge selling for \$390 and a German Army tunic selling for \$700.

Of course, since Cady Auction is the premier firearms auction house in eastern Iowa, firearms are always hot items. 


