

Founded in 1948, the Wisconsin Antiques Dealers Association is a non-profit charitable organization dedicated to preservation & education within Wisconsin. Funded by admissions charged at their February & October antiques shows, their Association awards scholarships and grants annually.

Through the support of those who attended past WADA shows, two Waukesha County 2017 high school seniors were awarded scholarships. Joseph Foye of Muskego High School received a scholarship for his essay, "Learning From Our Past," the history of a 1921 silver dollar given to him by his grandfather on the day he became an Eagle Scout. Julia Gahr of Sussex Hamilton High School also received a scholarship for her essay, "The Traveling Ring," the story of their family's wedding ring that has been used for several generations.



## Kalamazoo Expo Center Hosts 25th Anniversary Airgun Show

Although the Powers team handed off the show, both agreed they would be on hand for future events because they thoroughly enjoy the yearly gathering.

Visitors at the Aug. 20 show could hunt for goodies with dealers from all over the United States. But not all dealers came to sell items - some to just to share their prizes with fellow collectors.

Mentioning the name Quackenbush will make air gun rifle collector heads turn - and there were examples both for sale and for display only at the show.

It was a 10-hour drive to Kalamazoo for Jeff Sipling of Spring Grove, Pa., who showed off his flawless Quackenbush Excelsior rifle produced between 1877 and 1889. It could be used for target practice at your place for \$4,000.

Show promoter Powers smiled as he showed off his personal1922 #10 Quackenbush rifle, "only of one of 810 produced" and priced at \$1,100. Other rifles at his booth were priced from \$40 to -- \$1,100 each.

Foot traffic came to a halt at the booth of Terry Wittmer who drove 1,500 miles from Banner, Wyo., to show - but not sell -- a massive display of 19 Quackenbush rifles mounted high along with an illustrated company history. It was the second time at Kalamazoo for the Western dealer/collector, who proudly offered a dozen "hard to find" flat cast iron bb targets priced from \$800 to \$1,200 each.

"It's the only one I've ever seen," said George Sage of Galesburg, Ill., pointing to a Hy-Score .22 pellet pistol at tagged \$100. Someone else liked it too, as it sold before the show ended. Many folks checked out his 19-inch-long King cork rifle made by the same company that produced BB guns in the early 1900s. It was priced at \$75.

Another pistol marked "sold" early in the show was bizarre looking cast iron 1903 dart ball pistol shown by Scott Evans of Monroe, Mich., and tagged at \$275. An early Upton BB gun made by the Whirlpool Corporation in Benton Harbor, Mich., was ready to use for target practice at your range for \$95.

Double-barrel bb guns were said to be a favorite of many collectors, and Richard Gentry of North Lawrence, Ohio, offered a pair at the show, priced at \$700 each. The dealer said the 5-hour drive to the show was "well worth it."

"I like to share," said George Mitchell of Minburn, Iowa as he pointed with pride to a display of vintage BB gun advertising pieces, added with a smile, "They're not for sale, but fun to look at." Two real crowd pleasers were a pair of 3-foot-tall die cut cardboard signs featuring famous cowboy Red Ryder, holding BB guns of the same name. The two signs are part of six displays of the same kind from the Mitchell collection.

The longest drive a first-time show attendant may have been won by Larry Hannusch, who spent 26 hours and 1,450 miles traveling to Kalamazoo from his Texas home. When asked about his first visit to the Kalamazoo show, he stated, "it's phenomenal for displays as well as buys."

The annual event was once again a "grandad and lads" event for Bill Duimstra and 15-year-old Grandsons Eli and Alex from Holland, Mich. The pair have been assisting their grandfather for five years of the 20 years he's been showing at the event.

Dealer Dennis Plummer, also from Holland, mixed a bit of humor and advice for potential buyers with a printed notice at his booth, stating: "I am here to sell soooo feel free to make offers. I promise not to be offended with a low ball offer if you promise not to be offended if I giggle a little. Package deals are always considered and generally yield the greatest 'discount'."

Did it work? Plummer said with a smile, "We've had a really good day. We were priced right and willing to negotiate."


As the show ended, retiring promoter Powers summed up his 15 year stint with, "We've made a lot of friends because of BB guns."

The new director, Dennis Baker, said he was pleased with the show's past performance, adding that he looked forward to keeping it a fun event for both dealers and visitors.

Next year's show is tentatively being planned for the usual third weekend of August at the Expo Center at the Kalamazoo,



### **Antique Motorcycle Club of America**

The Antique Motorcycle Club of America was founded in 1954 by a group of antique-bike fans in the New England area (pictured from left are T.A. Hodgdon, Emmett Moore, Henry Wing Sr., and Henry Wing Jr.). AMCA FoundersIn the decades since, the AMCA has grown to become one of the largest organizations of antique-motorcycle enthusiasts in the world, with 11,000 members in the United States and more than a dozen other countries.

Owner with three-wheeled motorcycleFrom the beginning, the purpose of the club has been the "preservation, restoration and operation of old-time motorcycles." Members of the AMCA own, restore, preserve, study or just admire motorcycles that fall into the antique category, meaning they are at least 35 years old. Although the Club is based in the United States, fans of motorcycles from all countries are welcome, and ownership of an antique motorcycle is not required to become a member.

Through its network of 59 affiliated Chapters in the U.S. and abroad, the AMCA provides a way for antique-bike fans to share their interest with others in their local area. Chapters typically host regular meetings, plus activities like bike shows, swap meets and antique-bike road runs.

At the national and international level, the AMCA maintains a calendar of National Meets and Road Runs that include some of the premier antique-motorcycle gatherings in the world. National Meets typically include a large vendor area, where members can sell everything from antique-bike parts to entire motorcycles that are at least 35 years old. In addition, National Meets offer a full schedule of other activities, ranging from seminars and bike shows to motorcycle field games and antique-bike racing.

JudgingAll National Meets also feature the AMCA's National Judging Program, in which members' motorcycles can win awards in three categories: Restored, Original Condition or Period Modified. Instead of competing against each other, bikes entered in the AMCA Judging Program are evaluated on a 100-point scale against the standard of the same motorcycle as it would have appeared when it originally left the factory.

National Road Runs provide an opportunity to use these classic machines for their intended purpose—riding on back roads in some of the most scenic parts of the country.

In addition to those events, AMCA members also get access to a number of benefits, including a high-quality magazine six times per year, online forums where they can seek advice from experts, and the AMCA Virtual Motorcycle Library, featuring downloadable copies of hundreds of old and rare sales brochures, parts lists and repair manuals. Plus, AMCA members receive discounts on admission to some of the country's premier motorcycle museums.





### **Evans Decoy Book Available Now**



Ever since the inception of the Evans Society in the late 1990's there has been discussion of documenting the history of Walter Evans and the Evans Decoy Factory. Over the years there have been a number of articles written based on information that was gathered by Evans collectors. A few years back, Jackie

Robinson worked to put together a book on Walter Evans, but with Jackie's passing the book was never completed and we are not aware of what happened with all her work. In 2012, Terry Smart was elected president of the Evans Society. Andy Schoneich and Terry Smart began their independent work on the Evans book almost two years ago after agreeing at the 2015 Oshkosh Wisconsin Decoy show to take on the project. The majority of the work started in July 2015. The goal of the book was to provide the collector a comprehensive pictorial guide to the different grades and species of Evans decoys. With the support of many collectors, we were able to assemble a comprehensive collection of all the species and grades of known Evans decoys. Through our research we were able to bring clarity to the (4) grades of Evans decoys (Mammoth, Standard, Competitive, and Hardware Store) and the distinguishing characteristics between each grade. The objective of the book was not to speculate, but only make claims based on known/documented facts. The book was completed in April 2017 and available to collectors at the 2017 North American Vintage Decoy and Sporting Collectibles Show. Given that this has been the first comprehensive publication regarding Walter Evans and his decoys, it has been well received and appreciated by collectors.


