"Pauline Pottery & Her Clay Kin" A Special Exhibit at the 66th Fall WADA Antiques Show October 6 & 7, 2017 Waukesha (Milwaukee) Wisconsin

Edgerton Pottery signed

Folks familiar with the semi-annual shows produced by the Wisconsin Antiques Dealers Association, aka WADA, are familiar with dealers Phil and Jayne Schauer of Pipsqueak and Me Antiques, Janesville, Wisconsin. In recent years they have exhibited in Booth 55 at the WADA shows, but this October they will ALSO exhibit their Pauline Pottery collection in WADA's Special Exhibit Booth just around the corner from the show's entrance.

"Pauline Pottery & Her Clay Kin", is a free exhibit, for those who attend the 66th Fall Wisconsin Antiques Dealers Association Show & Sale at the Waukesha Expo Center. Attendees will be astounded to see the rarity, quality and variety of objects assembled by these top collectors. Phil and Jayne will be on hand October 6 & 7 to answer questions and to share knowledge of this fascinating field of collecting.

Quick background supplied by the Wisconsin Historical Society:

"Between 1888 and 1909 the city of Edgerton, Wisconsin was home to six different companies producing nationally-recognized ceramic art. The Marie Brastad, Stoughton, 1893. art potteries of Edgerton were part of a late 19th and early 20th century trend known as the American Art Pottery movement. Rather than one single style, American art pottery is best characterized by an innovative approach to ceramic design and an emphasis on decoration over function. Such pottery was offered for sale at stores like Marshall Field's of Chicago, Kimball's of Boston, and Tiffany's of New York."

Come see the collection!

To prepare us for the special exhibit, Phil revealed how their collection started. "I was at a country auction in 1968 just outside of Evansville, Wisconsin and there was 'choice' on a table; I had my eye on a leafy- Edgerton patterned organic flat dish impressed on the back in block letters Pottery decorated PAULINE POTTERY. As the high bidder, I realized I'd better learn by Marie Brastad, Stoughton, 1893. Saturday, 10-5. In addition to the good food customers have more if I wished to recognize it going forward. Because it had been locally made, I thought I'd be able to find more in my neck of the woods. Oddly I found it everywhere, not just Rock County; New York, Tennessee, Ohio, and Indiana where it was less recognized as most of it was unmarked."

Researching Pauline Pottery's history, I learned it was founded in 1883 by Pauline Jacobus and was the first art pottery company in Chicago. She and her husband, Oscar, moved to Edgerton in 1888 after a superior clay source was discovered there, avoiding expensive transportation costs for Ohio clay. There Oscar oversaw the production of ceramic battery jars for Bell

Telephone. The cash flow from their commercial contracts allowed Pauline and 13 women to dabble in art pottery. In 1891 Pauline realized she had to branch out with more than just pretty dishes, so she recruited Thorwald Samson and his brother along with Louis Ipson, professional potters at the Hjords Pottery in Denmark, to work as designers. However, the next year the Samsons and Ipson left Pauline to form American Art Clay Works, producing busts and figurines.

When Pauline's husband died in 1893 and the commercial contracts evaporated, Pauline Pottery was forced to close. The company reorganized as Edgerton

Pottery Company although some wares were marked Rock Pottery using the old Pauline Pottery molds. Pauline Jacobus was not involved with the new company as she began to teach pottery making and decorating out of her home.

A Pickard 'Clay Kin' Connection . . .

Two of Pauline Pottery's 'clay kin' were Wilder Pickard and decorator Mae Johnson who had worked for Pauline. In 1894 they established Pickard China in Edgerton, now located in Antioch, Illinois. In 1895 the American Art Clay Works was sold and continued under the name Edgerton Art Clay Works. By 1902 Pauline Pottery was back in business operating on a smaller scale from the Jacobus' home until 1909 when it closed permanently. In 1903 the Samson brothers and Louis Ipson reunited to form Norse Pottery, closing in 1913. By then most of the pottery manufacturers in

Edgerton had either ceased production or had moved out of the area. Pauline and her 'clay kin' were gone. The Schauers' Special Exhibit booth at the antiques show will display examples of many of these Edgerton potteries along with a stunning amount of Pauline Pottery pieces.

From vintage Holiday decor to jewelry to antique cupboards, wander the three large rooms at the show featuring the Midwest's top dealers from 9 states, each offering a choice variety of authentic vintage and antique treasures. The Waukesha County Expo Center's Forum Building, 1000 Northview Road, Waukesha, WI 53188, is the home of this semi-annual event. Show hours are Friday, 10-8 and come to expect, a traditional Wisconsin Fish Fry will be

served late Friday afternoon and evening so bring your appetite!



A Brief History of Nippon

The Nippon era began in 1891 when the Japanese porcelain was clearly marked "Nippon" due to the McKinley Tariff Act. This act required that all porcelain be marked with the country of origin. ("Nippon" literally translates to "Japan".) This porcelain was made specifically to be exported to the west with designs and patterns that suited American's tastes. At that time, Japan had a thriving porcelain industry using methods used in Europe and the United States.

The Japanese items were less expensive than pieces coming from Europe and became very popular in the U.S. The porcelain was sold in gift shops, dime stores, fairs and even at the local grocery. Nippon items were also sold by Montgomery Ward, Sears & Roebuck, mail order houses and other department stores.

In1921 the United States government changed its position and required that

Japanese imports no longer be marked "Nippon", but with "Japan". This marks the

History - Brown & McCoy Pottery

Paul Moody of Richmond, VA made a remarkable discovery of a previously unknown salt glazed crock, labeled, BROWN & McCOY WHOLESALE DEALERS IN STONEWARE ROSEVILLE. O . Just how this piece fit into the known history of the McCoy potteries was intriguing, so an investigation was begun. At first it was thought that the crock was made by a Brown & McCoy Company where the McCoy was unrelated to the McCoy family known to us, but subsequently the following was found.

The Brown in the inscription was James E. Brown who was born in 1820. His father, Joseph Brown who was from Delaware, moved his family in 1837 to McLuney, Ohio. McLuney is located in Perry County in Harrison Township about 11/2miles south of Crooksville.

James E. Brown had married Lucy Ann Sowers before 1850, and moved to Roseville. Throughout their marriage they had seven children, one of which was Sarah E. Brown. There is more about Sarah below. James E. Brown became a well-known merchant, and both he, and later his son George Washington Brown, was quite influential in the Roseville area. Among James business ventures was a general merchandising store. In the Federal censuses of the late 1800 s, James listed his occupation as a merchant rather than a potter, indicating that he was not involved in making pottery, but rather a wholesale seller of it in his store. It is known from a history of the Brown family, that James employed his son G. W. Brown, and J.B. Owens at the store, and that G.W. went on to establish a pottery around 1850. In 1883, J.B. established the J.B. Owens Pottery Company.

In April 1870, a connection between the Brown family and the McCoy family occurred. The McCoy in this connection was James W. McCoy. J.W. was born in 1848, the same year as his family arrived in Muskingum County. His father, W. Nelson and wife Esther, had settled in Putnam, which later became a part of Zanesville. J.W. was 22 years old in 1870 when he married Sarah (Sade) Elizabeth Brown, the daughter of James E. Brown.

During the following year, J.W. and Sarah moved to Uniontown, Newton Township, Muskingum County, where he operated a dry goods store. In 1872, they moved to the community of Roseville, very near his wife s parents. McCoy references have reported that J.W. opened a general merchandise store in Roseville in 1876, but I was always curious why he, and his wife, moved to Roseville five years earlier, and what J.W. did during that time.

It was discovered that the reason he moved to Roseville was that his father-in-law offered to take him in as a partner in his mercantile business, and their partnership became known as Brown & McCoy . The Brown and McCoy business operated from 1872 until 1888. It is surprising that neither the name James Brown, nor information about the Brown & McCoy business, has appeared in the literature.

After 1888, evidently the Brown & McCoy business was sold; for James E. Brown went on to establish a furniture store on First Street in Roseville - he was 68 years old at the time. He died in 1907 at the age of 88. It is not known when J.W. left the business, but as mentioned above, J.W. opened a general merchandise store in Roseville in 1876. Then in 1886, he entered into a series of partnerships in the pottery business. Finally, in 1899 he, along with several investors, established a pottery in Roseville solely in his own name, the J. W. McCoy Pottery.


