





Through our research we were able to bring clarity to the (4) grades of Evans decoys (Mammoth, Standard, Competitive, and Hardware Store) and the distinguishing characteristics between each grade. The objective of the book was not to speculate, but only make claims based on known/documented facts. The book was completed in April 2017 and available to collectors at the 2017 North American Vintage Decoy and Sporting Collectibles Show. Given that this has been the first comprehensive publication regarding Walter Evans and his decoys, it has been well received and appreciated by collectors.

To maintain the HCIF Archives at the University of Iowa, which is available to the public as a depository of books, articles, catalogs, pamphlets, advertising products, historical correspondence and other items relating to the history of the Haviland companies for individual and group research.
