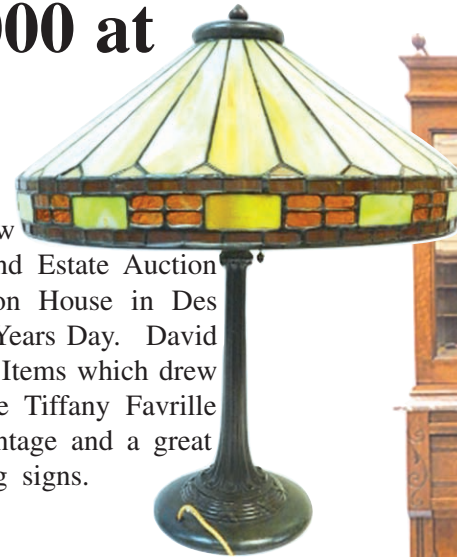

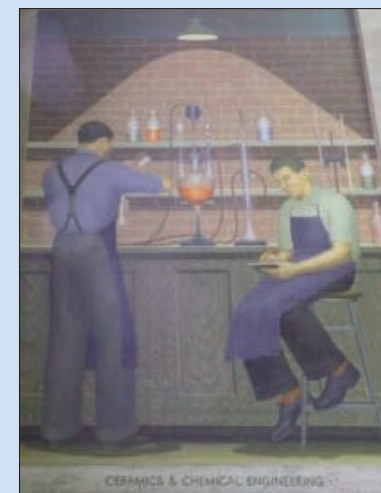

Dick's Quimper collection began with a major piece, the Porquier Beau statue "The Newlyweds." It was love at first sight for him.

I had been collecting cups and saucers and an occasional small plate to display with my four Quimper eggcups. My budget for collecting was tiny and even buying a piece at all seemed like a huge luxury.

Dick and I were at an antique show in L.A. when one of our favorite dealers had some wonderful cups & saucers AND this large wonderful statue. Well, Dick took a good look at the statue and decided that we should have it. So, after quite an extensive conversation we agreed – we would buy it. I must admit, the statue pretty much ate up a whole year's collecting budget for me but I have never regretted the decision.

Through the years, I've added to Dick's collection a piece at a time. The terracotta pieces don't seem to mix well with the faience pieces (or maybe they do and I'm overly sensitive to glazes and finishes), but in any case, they certainly display well as a collection! One piece at a time is usually how they entered our home but occasionally I was able to find a pair.

The matching newlywed platter is a favorite and this Porquier Beau themed collection is a source of great pride for us both.

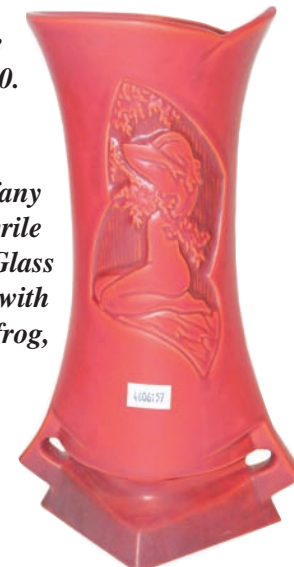

Tea Predates Coffee, but Exact Origin Unclear

Tea is making a comeback in the United States. Its consumption has more than doubled since 1990, with Americans consuming about 50 billion cups a year. Just as having a cup of tea is more popular, so are teapots.

Long before people were drinking coffee, they were drinking tea, which originates in one of two legends. One is that a Chinese emperor enjoyed drinking hot water. One day some tree leaves fell into the water and he enjoyed the taste. That was the start of cultivating tea.

The other legend is that a Buddhist monk planned to meditate for nine years. By the fifth year, he was losing his focus and reached for some leaves and chewed them. The result was wakefulness, so he added eater and now we have tea.

Teapots come in a lot of sizes and are made from a variety of materials. Children's tea sets became popular in the Victorian era. By the 1930's a lot of glass companies were making tea sets in the Depression glass colors of pink, green and clear.

In the 1940's and '50's, tea sets changed from china or glass to tin and plastic. Then the 1960's saw the popularity of aluminum tea sets grow. In the 1970's there were more tea sets for children again with cartoon characters or Barbie images as decoration.

People have remained faithful to tea for centuries. Perhaps it's because tea has a number of properties that are good for you, for example, green tea has a cancer-fighting agent.

A Brief History of Nippon

The Nippon era began in 1891 when the Japanese porcelain was clearly marked "Nippon" due to the McKinley Tariff Act. This act required that all porcelain be marked with the country of origin. ("Nippon" literally translates to "Japan".) This porcelain was made specifically to be exported to the west with designs and patterns that suited American's tastes. At that time, Japan had a thriving porcelain industry using methods used in Europe and the United States.

The Japanese items were less expensive than pieces coming from Europe and became very popular in the U.S. The porcelain was sold in gift shops, dime stores, fairs and even at the local grocery. Nippon items were also sold by Montgomery Ward, Sears & Roebuck, mail order houses and other department stores.

In 1921 the United States government changed its position and required that Japanese imports no longer be marked "Nippon", but with "Japan". This marks the end of the Nippon era.

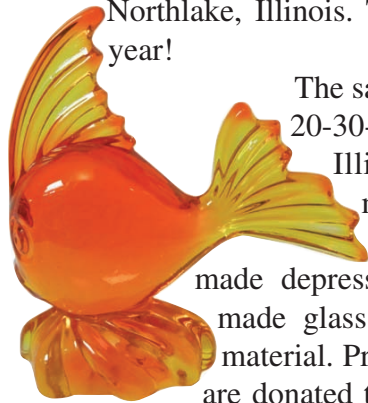

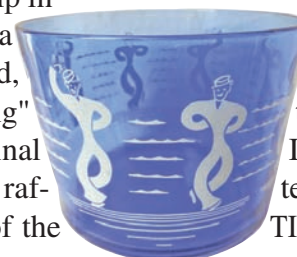
raffle will be drawn late in the day on Sunday. Winner need not be present.

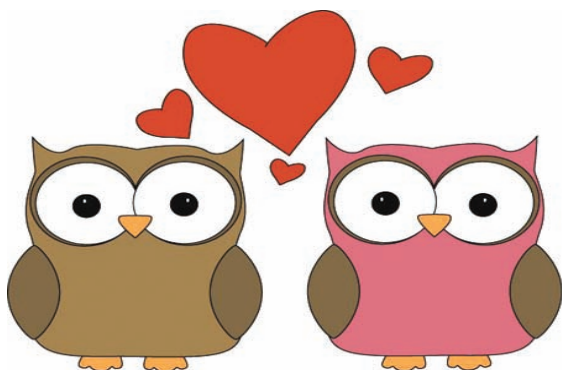
