

# WADA Celebrates 44th Annual Winter Antique Show

To truly appreciate the history of this event, one must look back to the organization behind it. WADA (Wisconsin Antique Dealers Association) was founded in 1948 as a non-profit organization. With the goal of obtaining a better education about antiques, one of its purposes is to preserve the history of Wisconsin. WADA also gives scholarships and grants associated toward this very purpose. The Winter Antique Show started later than the organization's beginnings, but it helps with WADA's ability to achieve as much as they do. A good sum of the money from admissions to the show go towards the scholarships and grants they give out.

With around fifty-five dealers to shop and learn from, it was an educational treat for the family to enjoy. Some were repeat show-goers and remembered the first WADA

shows they went to. Others were new to the scene and absorbed their first experience in intrigue and curiosity.

The show contained a variety of antiques. Victorian furniture from upper class estates, early 1900s Czechoslovakian glassware, high-end cameo glassware from Europe, stoneware from the mid to late 1800s, and much more around every corner of the event. Jewelry, toys, dolls, and early 1900s holiday décor were also seen in the



# "Disneyland for Gearheads" - Davids4Speeds



After 40 plus years of collecting David from Davids4Speeds, LLC. is retiring and plans to tour the world – which means his exciting collection of petroliana, gas, oil, automotive collectibles and advertising will be offered at auction.

Davids4Speeds LLC was a hobby that grew out of control. David learned to rebuild transmissions from a neighbor when he was 11 years old. He tagged along with a mechanic at a car dealership as he taught his sons how to work on cars. As a teenager he took up drag racing

at the Great Lakes Drag Way. He then went to work for AO Smith as a mechanic - keeping their wheeled stock running.

In his spare time he did some work on the side and like many success stories, didn't know that it would lead to the successful business he now owns.

While he was doing a frame off restoration of a 1967 GTO, a local speed shop was



looking for someone to rebuild a Muncie transmission and asked if he would be interested in helping them out. That speed shop was surprised when the rebuilt transmission looked and functioned like new. David started doing a few more to take to swap meets, and gradually the demand grew, and soon he found himself in the middle of a growing

small business. People started calling from all over the USA, and then from around the world.

After 30 years at AO Smith David retired in 2002 and started his transmission business full time. It has grown every year since. David has taught manual 4 speed transmissions at the Iola car show for several years, been a guest speaker at Marquette School of Design Engineering and currently ships his restored transmissions all over the world.

David has been collecting since the late 1970's. It started with Kaestner Auto Electric giving him a few signs, and from there he bought and traded for signs along the way. Once retired from AO Smith, he had the chance to collect more signs because now he had a great place to display them! Surprisingly David claims that he did-

n't actively seek out signage, he just ran across the items. People often ask him where do you find this stuff? David's answer - "it finds me" (that's a problem we think many collectors would love to have).

David does however like to frequent places that allow items to find him – like swap meets, job sites, or private collections.

David's most prized item is the rare Holley Carburetor sign. It is a beautiful two sided outdoor sign that never left indoor display. It's in pristine condition and unheard of among Petroliana collectors.




Another favorite item is the Sunoco sign because it reminds him of the first car he owned. It was a 1966 Chevelle SS with a 375hp 396 that was

built up and modified for drag racing. It needed high octane gas, and Sunoco had

gasoline pumps that allowed him to dial in the high octane fuel it needed. His Dad tried out the car and forbid him to drive it on the streets. This was David's first car, and he was only allowed to drag race it! He was 16 years old.

It is fascinating listening to David recall the history of the items. There is a story behind every piece, but the common thread is it's connection to his business as a 4 Speed Transmission Restorer. "I enjoyed turning my shop into Disneyland for Gearheads" and his collection has certainly enter-





Admission is \$5 and children under 16 are free. Display tables are \$60, which includes admission for two.



# **Antiques School Releases List Of Top Sellers For 2017**



The latest results from the Asheford Institute (a professionallevel distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising), recently published it's annual survey of top buying trends within the antiques and collectibles community this past week.

The Institute, which has been conducting the industry related survey for over six years now, released its latest trending data on decorative arts sales for 2017 via a dedicated page on the school's web site. The survey, which focuses on compiling and grouping information related to customers buying habits over a twelve month period, came about as a result of strong interest from readers requesting updates from previous surveys, said current Director of the Institute, Charles Green. He went on to note that there were some interesting changes in the poll results this year. "Our questionnaire has become more detailed, resulting in answers that are more period and genre specific. We're really able to drill down now into the types of antiques and vintage

items that are actually selling well within a 12 month period." Green also acknowledged that the increase in pollparticipants (up 15% over last year), had led to more accurate survey numbers in regard to particular sales categories. "More data has simply given us better survey results," said Green.

The school's lead Poll Researcher, Tony Frey, echoed Mr. Green's sentiments and went on to say that the main goal of the Institute's survey was to provide meaningful analysis of measurable interest in current trends within the antiques and collectibles marketplace, based on actual sales results and requests for specific items from vendors.

Frey, who has worked on all six of the school's past polls, noted that while the survey was based on a general series of questions, and did not employ any standardized formulas, the overall results were still very revealing when looked at as a whole. "The shift in what's considered collectible is continuing to change, and at a more accelerated pace than ever before," said Frey. "For the last few years it's been Mid-century modern, but this year we're beginning to see some cracks in that crown.'

Some of the other highlights from the poll included a resurgence of all things Western. "We're seeing a revitalized interest by the public in literally anything related to the American past and particularly the wild, wild west" said Frey. Other top sellers on the school's list include a few industry standards such as Star Wars items, space related toys from the 1960's and 70's, as well as automobilia and related mechanical items. Frey noted that just as in past polls, the most visible movement in collecting genres was being reported by younger dealers, who indicated that consumer tastes seemed to be trending towards virtually anything related to the latter half of the twentieth-century. "The reality is the younger collectors are the one's moving the ball forward now," said Frey, "the rest of us just appear to be along for the ride."
