### **Gateway Gas & Oil Show Races with Room Trade**

The show was held in the Doubletree Hotel & Conference Center in Collinsville, Illinois, making an easy drive for anyone from Chicago, Kansas City, Indianapolis and Memphis. Since the Doubletree is a hotel, the event had room trade added in with the two ballrooms the hotel had, along with the outdoor vending.

Room trade is where venders set up their merchandise in their rooms and sell their goods from within that room. It creates a difference in how collectors scope out what they're looking for and gives vendors a new source and way to display their merchandise. Vendors who participate in shows are familiar with this way of set up. Normally, they have an empty space with a few tables. When dealing with room trade, their boundaries are within a furnished room, giving opportunity to display in ways they couldn't in an empty space. At this occasion, you would've seen a lot of signs. Hundreds of gas, oil, tire, and car dealership signs were displayed in brilliant colors from the turn of the 1900s to the mid-century. Soda signs were scattered around the rooms for anyone looking. To add even more color, there were mid-century neon advertising signs to light up your world in this annual occurrence. For anyone who likes toys, there was a good supply of toys present, along with some oddities and rarities that would perk the interest of the avid collector, such as the Navy spotting scope from WWII, or the Hotchkiss grill from the 1930s that was turned into a mirror.





One piece at a time is usually how they entered our home but occasionally I was able to find a pair.

The matching newlywed platter is a favorite and this Porquier Beau themed collection is a source of great pride for us both.




