



# Henry Decoy Show Celebrates 50th Anniversary

Although it is a decoy show, there was a good amount of waterfowl calls, books, magazines, wildlife art, and contemporary carvings and calls in the mix. You would've seen contemporary carved ducks by Don Allen, Dick LeMaster, Fred Traver, Ray Krahn, and more. There were people who made their own duck calls presenting at the show as well. There was a bit of the old, and a bit of the new to fit whatever preference people like to collect and/or use.

The show had amazing displays, but more than just the displays made the show. There were people like Ken Ingram, an excellent and well-known decoy maker, present at the event. Ken Ingram studied under the renowned Hector Whittington (carved from 1924-1981,) who rarely gave away tricks of the trade. Ingram started carving in 1971 and received his first ribbon when competing in 1972. Also, in 1972, Ingram

met and befriended Dick LeMaster. LeMaster was one of the first pioneers to push the decoy artistry to the next level, and an author of books on decoys. Ingram then got his first blue ribbon in 1974, and his first Best of Show 1975. He then received Best of Show again in 1976 and 1977. He retired from the profession in 1978.

The show was held mainly in one large room, and some was displayed in the entrance to the event. There were around 90 display tables, and the admission was \$6 a person. The first 250 people received a pin commemorating the show's 50th Anniversary. Children 12 and under were free. There was a raffle door prize of a Perdew-style decoy for one lucky winner, and food and drinks were available at the

# Antiques & Appraising School Launches "New" e-Course

The Asheford Institute of Antiques (AIA), a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising, recently rolled out its first ever online "e-Course," at an industry trade gathering earlier this month, in anticipation of the schools 50th anniversary to be held in New York later this year.

Described by school spokesperson Shelly Dumont, as a watershed moment for the Institute, Dumont said the school's first foray into e-learning was consistent with Asheford's innovative and groundbreaking teaching techniques employed

over the last 50 years. "When we offer something new, we like to take the time to make sure it's done right," said Dumont at a Q & A session following the announcement.

When asked about the differences in curriculum between textbooks and the new e-Course format of the program, Dumont said there was literally no comparison. "In terms of sheer volume, it's almost double the size of the printed version, and

comes loaded with interactive videos, multimedia-activities, web-based resource links, and a host of other features we simply can't add into the texts." Dumont went on to say that the e-Course had been in development for almost two years by the school's IT team, before any release dates were even considered.

Industry insiders attending the trade gathering were granted temporary passcodes to the e-Course, and were given full access to the programs options and features at a demonstration held during the event. Director of the school, Charles Green presided over the presentation, and noted during the unveiling, that the program had undergone almost a year of beta-testing by international students prior to its intended release in North America.

A statement issued from the school's Admissions Officer, Tony Drew seemed to indicate a "full" release date for the new e-Course to be some time in mid-July. "We don't want to rush it, but we're really pleased with the response so far," said Drew, "We think the e-Course is really going to be a game-changer when it comes to setting the bar for future antiques and appraising education." The press release went on to say that while the textbooks for the Asheford program were still available, they would likely be phased out in the next five to ten years.







# Rare Stoughton, WI Area Decoys to be Featured in Member Display during the 53rd Annual North American Vintage Decoy & Sporting Collectibles Show in St. Charles, IL

This year's Member Display at the 53rd Annual North American Vintage Decoy & Sporting Collectibles Show will feature vintage decoys made in and around Stoughton, Wisconsin, a treasured canvasback hunting area (Lake Koshkonong) which drew attention from hunters and celebrities from all over the U.S. and abroad.

The work of well-known makers such as Enoch Reindahl, Ferd and Mandt Homme, Russell "Raz" Barry, and many others is sure to delight show attendees. What makes these men unique is that they were self-taught artists who were careful observers of nature. Reindahl, in particular, had photographic skills which helped him so accurately mimic the natural birds in his output. Today, collectors will pay as much as \$50,000 for a single decoy by one of these masters.

Many of these makers were friends, which created a competitive fire as they tried to outdo each other. However, it was a friendly rivalry where they shared tips and techniques with each other, which continuously improved their work. Almost all of the carvings were true working decoys made for their makers or close friends, with very few miniatures or decorative carvings. Most of these carvers made fewer than 100 decoys so this is a rare opportunity to see these fine examples of their work. These pieces will be available for viewing Friday and Saturday in the Mega Center, following a week full of decoy and related sporting collectibles events.

The site's sections on the Society, itself, and on their annual convention is almost secondary. This is an excellent reference site for both collectors and dealers, or for that person who just happens to own a piece of Old Ivory or Ohme porcelain and wants to know a little more about it.

### **Antiques School Releases List Of Top Sellers For 2017**



The latest results from the Asheford Institute (a professionallevel distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising), recently published it's annual survey of top buying trends within the antiques and collectibles community this past week.

The Institute, which has been conducting the industry related survey for over six years now, released its latest trending data on decorative arts sales for 2017 via a dedicated page on the school's web site. The survey, which focuses on compiling and grouping information related to customers buying habits over a twelve month period, came about as a result of strong interest from readers requesting updates from previous surveys, said current Director of the Institute, Charles Green. He went on to note that there were some interesting changes in the poll results this year. "Our questionnaire has become more detailed, resulting in answers that are more period and genre specific. We're really able to drill down now into the types of antiques and vintage

items that are actually selling well within a 12 month period." Green also acknowledged that the increase in pollparticipants (up 15% over last year), had led to more accurate survey numbers in regard to particular sales categories. "More data has simply given us better survey results," said Green.

The school's lead Poll Researcher, Tony Frey, echoed Mr. Green's sentiments and went on to say that the main goal of the Institute's survey was to provide meaningful analysis of measurable interest in current trends within the antiques and collectibles marketplace, based on actual sales results and requests for specific items from vendors.

Frey, who has worked on all six of the school's past polls, noted that while the survey was based on a general series of questions, and did not employ any standardized formulas, the overall results were still very revealing when looked at as a whole. "The shift in what's considered collectible is continuing to change, and at a more accelerated pace than ever before," said Frey. "For the last few years it's been Mid-century modern, but this year we're beginning to see some cracks in that crown."

Some of the other highlights from the poll included a resurgence of all things Western. "We're seeing a revitalized interest by the public in literally anything related to the American past and particularly the wild, wild west" said Frey. Other top sellers on the school's list include a few industry standards such as Star Wars items, space related toys from the 1960's and 70's, as well as automobilia and related mechanical items. Frey noted that just as in past polls, the most visible movement in collecting genres was being reported by younger dealers, who indicated that consumer tastes seemed to be trending towards virtually anything related to the latter half of the twentieth-century. "The reality is the younger collectors are the one's moving the ball forward now," said Frey, "the rest of us just appear to be along for the ride."
