



Plenty to See at the Wisconsin Decoy & Sporting Collectibles Show in Oshkosh, Wisconsin

Andy Schoneich, a dealer at this annual event, was selling his latest book he cowrote with Terry Smart, the president of The Evans Society, who was also present at the show. The book is titled, "Evans Duck Decoy Factory: A Collector's Pictorial Reference Guide." The name says it all for what it is. For the collector who gravitates toward Evans decoys, for \$75, this book would be of good use.

For those who are not as sharp-edged on understanding the decoy world, the dealers were willing to share their knowledge and help a beginning collector get started. There are a good number of decoy factories that made their mark in history, and are collectible, but knowing which company made which decoy can be rather difficult to recognize to the untrained eye. There was a free appraisal booth near the entrance of the show, for anyone who had a decoy and wanted to know the company that made it, its age, and its value to solve this problem for people with these questions.

Being a show for decoys and sporting collectibles, the event was chockfull of decoys, lures, gun powder tins, shell boxes, and hunting goods; but the duck decoys made up a good amount of the show. One eye catching highlight was the 36" Lead

Decoy, the largest decoy ever made to use with the idea that it would be seen easier by the ducks flying past. Another decoy that was rather intriguing was the stamped Evans canvasback drake that had never been rigged or used out on the water.

Although a good portion of the show gravitated towards the duck decoys, the sporting goods held their ground in keeping the namesake accurate. There was a head turning, late 1800s/early 1900s punt gun boat. Being a 14-foot-long boat, it wasn't too hard to spot in the room. In addition to falling along the category of sporting collectibles, there were a few booths with great fishing lures. Eye-popping Heddon lures, brilliantly painted Paw-Paw Wottafrogs, a neatly designed automatic fish hook by Monarch, and plenty of fish decoys were to be seen at this extravaganza.

The show was sold out of displays with 94 tables showing off exceptional merchandise falling under the decoy and sporting goods category. The show was on the 10th of March, but there was also room trade that started on March 7th all the way through March 9th. Next year's show is going to be on March 9th of 2019. 





A \$3.00 admission fee is charged for the event.




