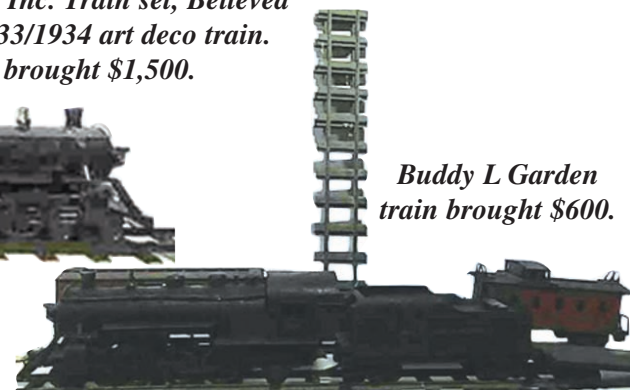

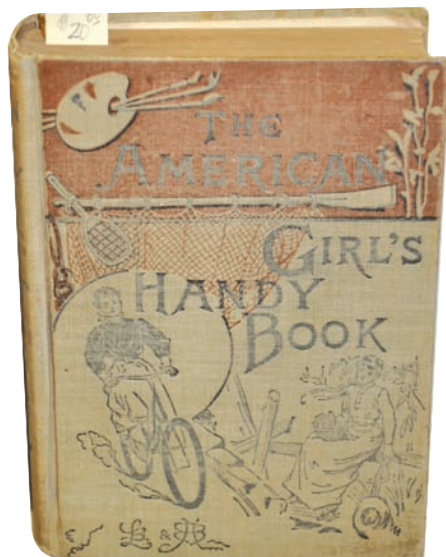

Aulik Estate Comes to North Central Sales

The estate of James and Alice Aulik goes to auction June 3, held by North Central Sales. The Auliks made their home at 1919 Fifth Avenue since they built it in 1964. Jim and Alice were active hobbyists and collectors in many fields.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Aulik worked at the Fidelity Savings Bank, now Chase, which is where they met. When the bank modernized, Mr. Aulik salvaged much of its original material such as the marble clock that hung over the lobby, the barrel chairs that sat around the board room table, the intercom system with original labels, the Greco-Roman style bronze light fixtures, slabs of marble and many other artifacts large and small. His collection also includes items of interest from the bank ranging from Fidelity Savings Bank tape measures to bank bags.

From the time of his youth, Mr. Aulik had a passion for understanding how things worked, collecting and fixing them. His wide-ranging interests provide an excellent example of curiosity and life-long learning. His collections include clocks, wristwatches, telephones, radios and music-playing devices from many decades.

Other areas of interest could be described as “things pertaining to money.” Mr. Aulik collected small banks from the 20th century, money counters, adding machines, cash registers, and a prized item: A 1929 Mills Poinsettia five cent slot machine (in good condition with key). The small banks are also notable as they are from the Langlade National Bank and the Fidelity Savings Bank. The bank held the key to unlock the patron’s savings, thus, while the banks are common, the keys are rare. Many of the Aulik banks have keys.

Mrs. Aulik developed a serious interest in glass and ceramics. She attended sales and auctions weekly for decades building her collection of carefully-curated pieces. It was not unusual for her daughter to wake up on a Saturday morning to find the kitchen table covered with “finds”, with more in the garage. She regularly bought and sold, leaving a refined collection at the time of her death in 2000.

Mr. Aulik, as president of the Fidelity Savings Bank, received many gifts of fine liquor. The bottles and decanters, with their contents, have been stored for decades. A favorite is a brandy decanter of a football player wearing green and gold with #15 on his jersey, holding the ball back before releasing a pass, in a seeming homage to Bart Starr. It is unopened. It claims “Wisconsin: Sports capital of the world” and

comes with the original collector certificate. Brandy, bourbon and whiskey drinkers will appreciate that neither Aulik cared for those spirits and many unopened bottles from the 1960s and 1970s have survived to this day.

Jim and Alice collected antiques, as well as the many items inherited from each of their families. They were also a very modern couple in 1964 when they built their house and furnished it with the very most on-trend mid-century furniture. A bedroom set, end tables, and many still-hip decorative elements remain and will be for sale.

The garage holds another bit of Aulik history: A John Deere riding mower. Aulik Implement, a former Antigo business, was the successor of the Aulik & Sons blacksmith shop, and the Auliks purchased many John Deere items over the years. The mower is a recent 2014 purchase of a John Deere Select Series X310 Tractor. Jim rode it often tending to his .8 acre lot.

Mr. Aulik also took immaculate care of his vehicles and the sale includes a 2001 Buick Lucerne and a 1986 Chevy Silverado pickup truck. Neighbors recall the truck as a sign of spring, as it was stored for the winter and would emerge to take the results of spring yard work to the dump. Former Dairy Queen employees will also remember Mr. Aulik arriving in the truck to purchase a baby cone for the dog where she’d enjoy the cone before he’d drive her around town to stop to look at other dogs and get some barks out.

While still in high school, Jim learned clock and gun repair from neighbors. Those interests continued his entire life with a wide variety of clocks and wristwatches from many decades and styles. In recent years, he became a dedicated volunteer in the community and participated in many raffles. He won a variety of things (including a lot of NASCAR mirrors) and became a gun collector. At auction will be over ten new shotguns, rifles and pistols as well as a historic Russian rifle with ammunition returned from WWII by an American serviceman.

A part of Jim Aulik that many people did not see involved overalls and work boots. He created a very complete shop in his basement that included a table saw, lathe, and a vast collection of supplies and equipment for carpentry, electrical work, painting and plumbing.

The History of the W. Nelson McCoy’s Blue Bird Pottery

W. Nelson McCoy was born in 1820 in Harpers Ferry, Virginia, which is located in West Virginia. In January 1848, he and his wife Ester moved to Ohio’s, Muskingum County, Springfield Township, in a community called Putnam. At that time, Putnam was a suburb of Zanesville, but in 1872, it became incorporated into Zanesville.

During the same year as W. Nelson and his wife arrived in Putnam, they had a son whose name was James W. Years later J.W. would go on to establish a well-known pottery, the “J.W. McCoy Pottery”.

W. Nelson came to Putnam as a farmer. He acquired some land and built a house. In addition to farming, he also built a small, log building to produce stoneware during the warmer months. The pottery was a small, “Blue Bird” type shop, which was like the ones many of the farmers had at the time. It was primitive in its equipment, and the ware it produced was rough and unfinished. Although during that period, most of the home-owned, “Bluebird” shops operated under primitive conditions.

W. Nelson only produced pottery for a few years, not eight as previously believed. In January 1853, a notice was published in the “Zanesville Daily Courier” stating that a partnership that W. Nelson had with Jeremiah Elder was dissolved. The partnership was in a Putnam grocery store, named Elder & McCoy, which had been established at some uncertain prior time.

On the same date that W. Nelson ended his partnership with Elder, a second notice was published reporting that he had taken another partner, Norman Dodge, in the grocery business. Later W. Nelson bought out Elder, and the name of the grocery was changed to “McCoy & Dodge”.

35Considering his job at the grocery, and the labor involved in farming, maintaining his household, supplying clay and firewood for his kiln, one would imagine that W. Nelson only had a small amount of time for actual pottery production. Surely, the volume he produced was small, and it was undoubtedly unmarked, since none that is attributable to him has been found.

Prior to 1853 a grocery store in Zanesville was owned by “James Benjamin & Co.”. Sometime after 1858 W. Nelson acquired the major share in the “Benjamin & Co.”, and the name of the store was then changed to “McCoy – Benjamin & Co.”. Hugh McDonald was another owner besides McCoy and Benjamin.

In addition to the operation of the store itself, James Benjamin had other interests; he was a wholesale dealer in stoneware. The newspaper “Zanes Times Signal” carried an article in 1957 by Norris F. Schneider, who, quoting old sources, said that during the 1870’s Benjamin was one of the three major stoneware wholesalers in the region. The other major stoneware wholesalers at the time were J.C. Gillespie, and Hudson C. Ward.

The crock shown is an example of Benjamin’s wares. The inscription on it is stenciled in blue ink, and reads, “Jas. Benjamin Wholesale Stoneware Depot Zanesville, O”.

W. Nelson is not known to have been associated with James Benjamin in the pottery business in Zanesville. However, he and Benjamin were associated in the pottery business located in Cincinnati. (See the article, “The History of the James Benjamin Potteries and his Connection with W. Nelson McCoy”, which is contained on this Web site).

W. Nelson as a long-time, Zanesville businessman, became respected and popular. In 1881, he was elected the mayor of Zanesville, and in 1883, he was reelected. W. Nelson continued managing and working in his grocery and dry goods store until the early 1890’s. He died in 1894.

History - Brown & McCoy Pottery

Paul Moody of Richmond, VA made a remarkable discovery of a previously unknown salt glazed crock, labeled, BROWN & McCOY WHOLESALE DEALERS IN STONEWARE ROSEVILLE. O . Just how this piece fit into the known history of the McCoy potteries was intriguing, so an investigation was begun. At first it was thought that the crock was made by a Brown & McCoy Company where the McCoy was unrelated to the McCoy family known to us, but subsequently the following was found.

The Brown in the inscription was James E. Brown who was born in 1820. His father, Joseph Brown who was from Delaware, moved his family in 1837 to McLuney, Ohio. McLuney is located in Perry County in Harrison Township about 11/2miles south of Crooksville.

James E. Brown had married Lucy Ann Sowers before 1850, and moved to Roseville. Throughout their marriage they had seven children, one of which was Sarah E. Brown. There is more about Sarah below. James E. Brown became a well-known merchant, and both he, and later his son George Washington Brown, was quite influential in the Roseville area. Among James' business ventures was a general merchandising store. In the Federal censuses of the late 1800s, James listed his occupation as a merchant rather than a potter, indicating that he was not involved in making pottery, but rather a wholesale seller of it in his store. It is known from a history of the Brown family, that James employed his son G. W. Brown, and J.B. Owens at the store, and that G.W. went on to establish a pottery around 1850. In 1883, J.B. established the J.B. Owens Pottery Company.

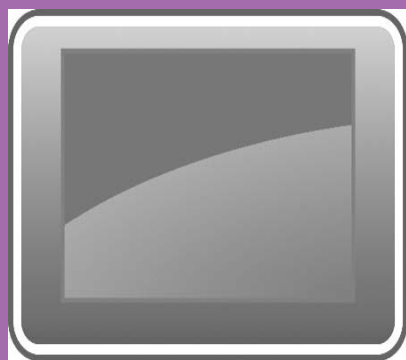
In April 1870, a connection between the Brown family and the McCoy family occurred. The McCoy in this connection was James W. McCoy. J.W. was born in 1848, the same year as his family arrived in Muskingum County. His father, W. Nelson and wife Esther, had settled in Putnam, which later became a part of Zanesville. J.W. was 22 years old in 1870 when he married Sarah (Sade) Elizabeth Brown, the daughter of James E. Brown.

During the following year, J.W. and Sarah moved to Uniontown, Newton Township, Muskingum County, where he operated a dry goods store. In 1872, they moved to the community of Roseville, very near his wife's parents. McCoy references have reported that J.W. opened a general merchandise store in Roseville in 1876, but I was always curious why he, and his wife, moved to Roseville five years earlier, and what J.W. did during that time.

It was discovered that the reason he moved to Roseville was that his father-in-law offered to take him in as a partner in his mercantile business, and their partnership became known as Brown & McCoy . The Brown and McCoy business operated from 1872 until 1888. It is surprising that neither the name James Brown, nor information about the Brown & McCoy business, has appeared in the literature.

After 1888, evidently the Brown & McCoy business was sold; for James E. Brown went on to establish a furniture store on First Street in Roseville - he was 68 years old at the time. He died in 1907 at the age of 88. It is not known when J.W. left the business, but as mentioned above, J.W. opened a general merchandise store in Roseville in 1876. Then in 1886, he entered into a series of partnerships in the pottery business. Finally, in 1899 he, along with several investors, established a pottery in Roseville solely in his own name, the J. W. McCoy Pottery.

The History of the Nelson McCoy Pottery

In 1910, Nelson McCoy Sr., with help from his father and along with five stockholders, established the Nelson McCoy Sanitary and Stoneware Company in Roseville, Ohio. The pottery produced utilitarian stoneware and operated successfully until about 1919. At that time the pottery joined with eleven other stoneware potteries and formed the American Clay Products Company, which was located in Zanesville, Ohio. All of the member potteries produced stoneware to be marketed by the new company. The ACPC produced sales catalogs of the wares that were produced, which purposely had no trademark, and had salesmen to advertise and take orders. The pottery orders received by the company were shared among the different potteries based on production capability, and the revenue received was proportionally distributed.

The ACPC thrived until January 1926, at which time the company was liquidated. The demise of the company released the former member potteries to once again become independent and they became in direct competition with one another. Also around this time the demand for utilitarian stoneware was beginning to decrease.

In order to re-establish its own identity, and also to reflect the changing times, the Nelson McCoy Sanitary and Stoneware Co., by 1929, had changed its name to the Nelson McCoy Sanitary Stoneware Co. Additionally, it was around this time that the company began the practice of marking its wares. No evidence has been found that the company had ever marked any of its wares prior to this time. In 1933, in response to a further decreased demand for food and sanitary wares, and an increased demand for decorative pieces, the name of the pottery was changed again. The pottery became simply, the Nelson McCoy Pottery Co.

Nelson McCoy Sr., Nelson Melick, and later Nelson McCoy Jr., in turn, operated the pottery for 57 years until it was sold in 1967 to the owners of the Mt. Clemens Pottery Co., although Nelson McCoy Jr. remained as president of the pottery. After about seven years of operation the Lancaster Colony Corporation purchased the pottery in 1974. In 1981 Nelson McCoy Jr. retired. In 1985, the pottery was sold once again, this time to Designer Accents of New Jersey. Some months earlier, Designer Accents had acquired two other potteries, Holiday Designs of Sebring, Ohio and their Sebring Studios division. Designer Accents also acquired the Sunstone Pottery of Cambridge, Ohio.

All production at these potteries was moved to the Nelson McCoy Pottery. The production of some of the wares formerly produced was continued, and other wares were discontinued. The ware formerly produced by Holiday Designs, being lower priced items, was discontinued, while the higher priced wares from Sebring Studios were continued for some time. The ware produced under the name Sebring Studios was marked with only a style number.

Selected items previously made by the McCoy pottery, and some newly designed items, were marketed by Designer Accents under the name Nelson McCoy Ceramics. Some of these items have the familiar McCoy name on them. The Floraline line with its distinctive mark, first produced by the Nelson McCoy Pottery in 1960, was also continued.

Designer Accents operated for about five years until late 1990 when the doors were finally closed. The portion of the pottery containing the offices burned in the fall of 1991.

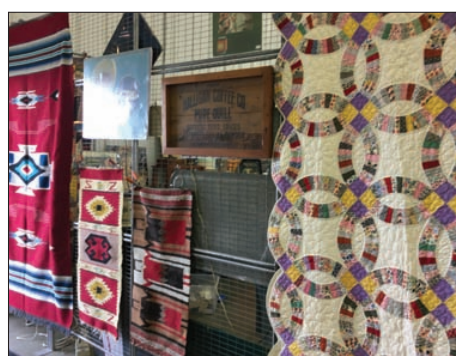

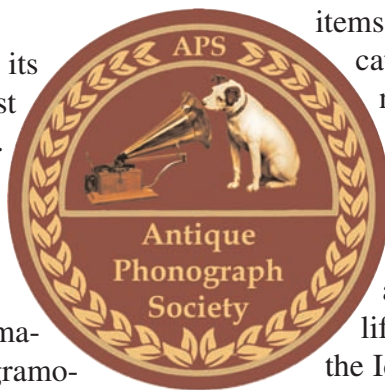
