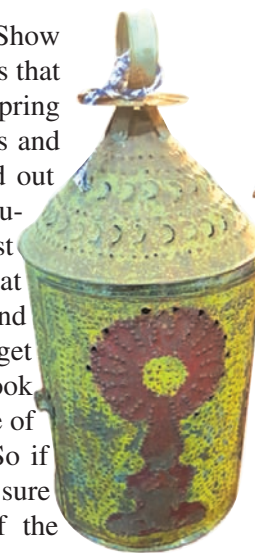

Antiques School Releases List Of Top Sellers For 2017



The latest results from the Asheford Institute (a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising), recently published its annual survey of top buying trends within the antiques and collectibles community this past week.

The Institute, which has been conducting the industry related survey for over six years now, released its latest trending data on decorative arts sales for 2017 via a dedicated page on the school's web site. The survey, which focuses on compiling and grouping information related to customers buying habits over a twelve month period, came about as a result of strong interest from readers requesting updates from previous surveys, said current Director of the Institute, Charles Green. He went on to note that there were some interesting changes in the poll results this year. "Our questionnaire has become more detailed, resulting in answers that are more period and genre specific. We're really able to drill down now into the types of antiques and vintage items that are actually selling well within a 12 month period." Green also acknowledged that the increase in poll-participants (up 15% over last year), had led to more accurate survey numbers in regard to particular sales categories. "More data has simply given us better survey results," said Green.

The school's lead Poll Researcher, Tony Frey, echoed Mr. Green's sentiments and went on to say that the main goal of the Institute's survey was to provide meaningful analysis of measurable interest in current trends within the antiques and collectibles marketplace, based on actual sales results and requests for specific items from vendors.

Frey, who has worked on all six of the school's past polls, noted that while the survey was based on a general series of questions, and did not employ any standardized formulas, the overall results were still very revealing when looked at as a whole. "The shift in what's considered collectible is continuing to change, and at a more accelerated pace than ever before," said Frey. "For the last few years it's been Mid-century modern, but this year we're beginning to see some cracks in that crown."

Some of the other highlights from the poll included a resurgence of all things Western. "We're seeing a revitalized interest by the public in literally anything related to the American past and particularly the wild, wild west" said Frey. Other top sellers on the school's list include a few industry standards such as Star Wars items, space related toys from the 1960's and 70's, as well as automobilia and related mechanical items. Frey noted that just as in past polls, the most visible movement in collecting genres was being reported by younger dealers, who indicated that consumer tastes seemed to be trending towards virtually anything related to the latter half of the twentieth-century. "The reality is the younger collectors are the one's moving the ball forward now," said Frey, "the rest of us just appear to be along for the ride."

Tri-County Arena Hosts 21st Annual Appleton Show & Sale

Hearthstone Historic House Museum is the main sponsors of the show. Proceeds from the 20th Appleton Antiques Sale & Show will support the museum. Hearthstone is a beautiful Victorian home built in 1882 on a bluff overlooking the Fox River. It was privately owned until 1986, when a group of citizens formed a non-profit corporation and bought the house. They devoted countless hours to restore the house and open it as a museum. Appleton is the home of the nation's first commercial hydroelectric plant. It is also home to the first home anywhere powered by hydroelectricity: Hearthstone, built by mogul Henry J. Rogers and now known as the Hearthstone Historic House Museum located at 625 W. Prospect Ave., Appleton, or www.hearthstonemuseum.org.

The show had vendors ranging from places in Wisconsin, Illinois, Minnesota. Featuring items from 18th & 19th century furniture, primitives, lodge and Native

American, antique jewelry, advertising, in fact, you'll find dealers here to satisfy most any collector's tastes, whether its art glass, pottery or vintage toys. There were so many items that I came across that I totally fell in love with. It is a good thing this gal left her pocket purse and U-Haul at home. 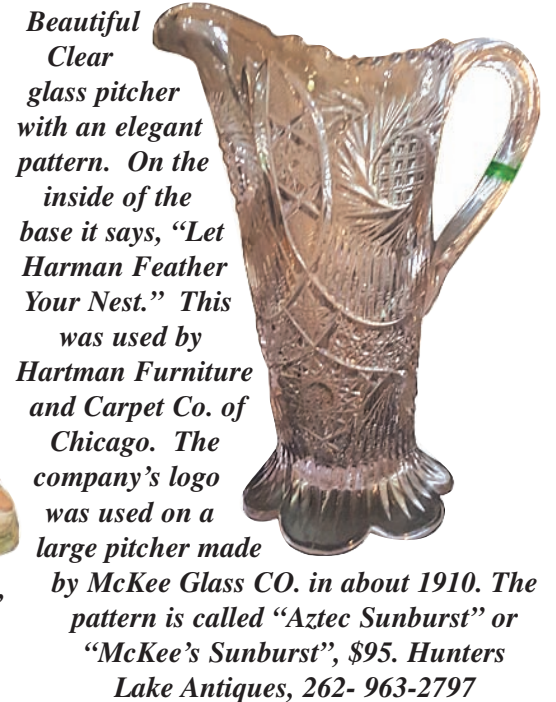

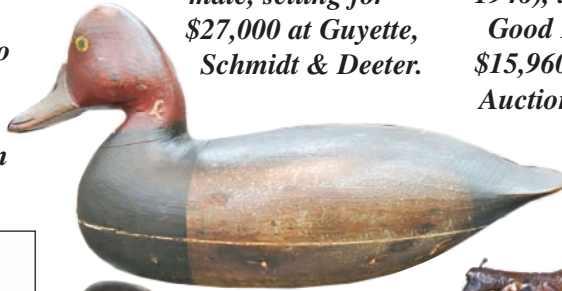

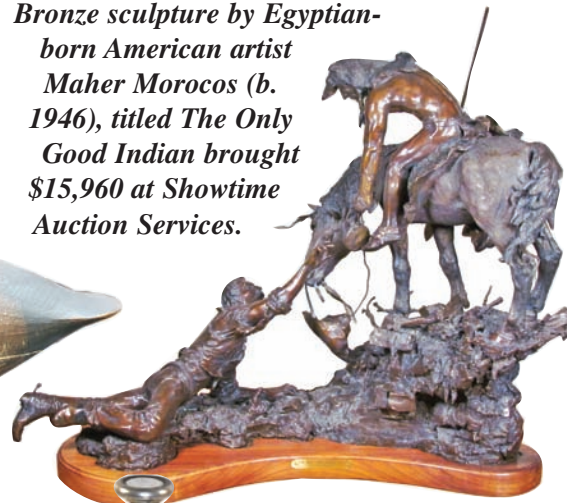

Roseville Egypto, 1905, in the form of an ancient Roman oil lamp.



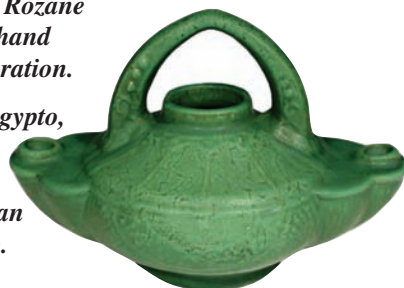
Roseville Creamware "Good Night" candle holder. Roseville began making decaled Creamware utility ware by 1910 and continued making it at least through the 1920's if not longer.

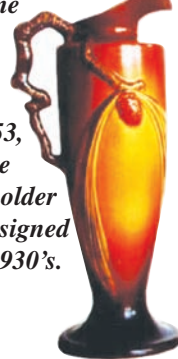

On April 3, 2002, the National Cambridge Collectors, Inc. proudly opened a premier glass museum in downtown Cambridge, Ohio. It houses a superb collection of Cambridge glassware produced by The Cambridge Glass Company from 1902 to 1958.

The museum is located at 136 South Ninth Street, one block south of the main street of Cambridge, and is open April through October with hours of operation shown at the bottom of this page.

At right, you can view an interview conducted with Cindy Arent, one of our NCC Board Members who is the chairperson of the Museum Committee. Click on the arrow to start it. Here is a chance to hear first-hand about our world-class museum. If you'd like to see it a little larger, click on the picture while it is showing and you will be taken to the YouTube page where it is presented in a larger size.

The year 2002 marked the 100th anniversary of the making of the first piece of Cambridge Glass (the Big X pitcher, shown below and to the right). The Museum Grand Opening celebration took during NCC Convention week on June 27, 2002. We're easy to find - here's a map of the Cambridge area.

Museum Contents

Big X Pitcher The museum features over 6,000 pieces of glassware made by the Cambridge Glass Company, with an interpretive area demonstrating how glass was made from gathering, shaping, etching, and engraving.

The Sample Room features the door and shelving from the original factory, and a dining room display features a table setting arranged on period furniture much as it would have appeared in the early 1900s.

Guests can do their own rubbings from original etching plates in the Education Center, and view a movie made in the 1940s by the Cambridge Glass Company.

Pieces of Cambridge Glass and jewelry made from Cambridge Glass are available for sale in the gift shop, along with books and other items throughout the museum.

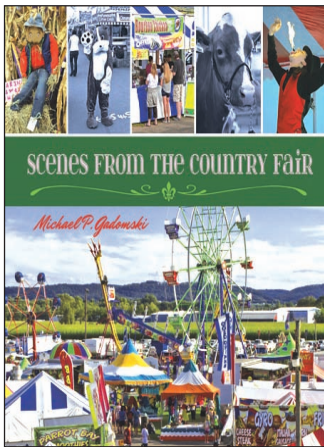

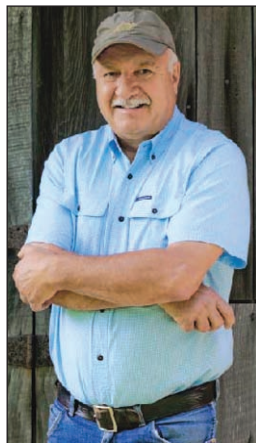

People have remained faithful to tea for centuries. Perhaps it's because tea has a number of properties that are good for you, for example, green tea has a cancer-fighting agent.

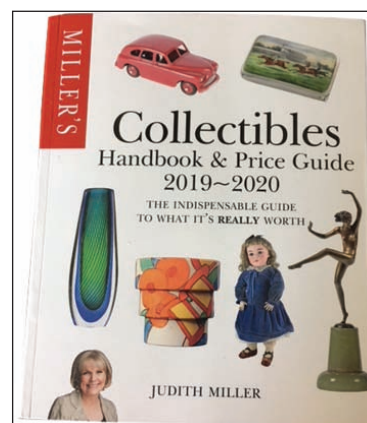

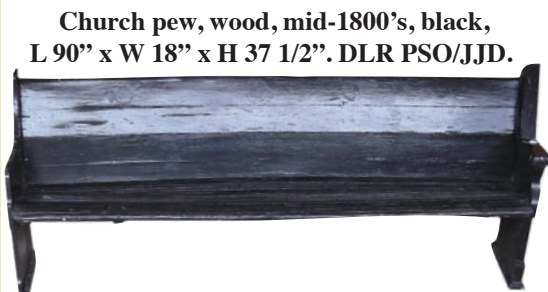

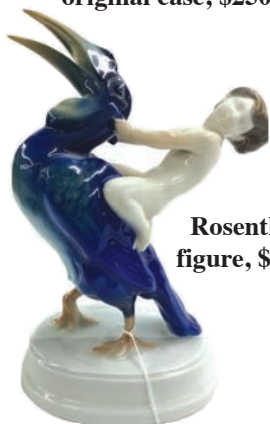
