300 Lots of Early Americana Cross the Block at Munda Auctions

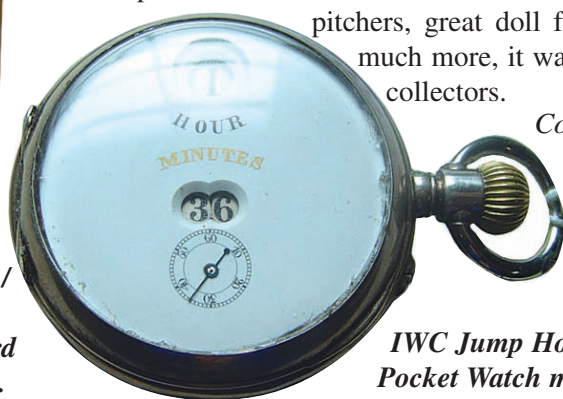

History of R.S. Prussia

History of the Company

Much of the historical information about R.S. Prussia in antique publications prior to 1994 is incorrect. Although not known until long after the fact, a detailed history of the ownership and economic fortunes of the Reinhold Schlegelmilch Porcelain Factory was described in Brend Hartwich's 1984 thesis. Information in his thesis was not available in America until the translation was published in 1993 (Int'l Society R.S. Prussia Collectors, Inc). Perhaps the best discussion of the inaccuracies concerning Reinhold's porcelain factory can be found in the first part of Capers Notes on the Marks of Prussia, (Alphabet Printing Inc., 1996).

For a long time, it was thought that Reinhold and Erdmann were brothers who jointly owned or ran the factory at Suhl, Germany. In actual fact, there were two factories in Suhl, Erdmann's and Reinhold's. Contrary to folklore, these two operations were in direct competition with each other. Reinhold's factory was founded and initially owned by Reinhold, and subsequently with his two sons, Ehrhard and Arnold. Arnold took over an existing porcelain factory in Tillowitz in 1894, and continued to run it as part of the Reinhold Schlegelmilch enterprise until he died in 1934. Erdmann's factory, in contrast, was founded and originally owned by Leonhard Schlegelmilch. Later on, Oscar, Julius Martin, and Carl Schlegelmilch had a hand in owning and/or running the factory. Oscar Schlegelmilch eventually started his own factory in Langenwiesen, and Julius eventually (1899) took over the ownership of Erdmann's Suhl operation. The historical research by Ron Capers shows there was no blood relationship between Leonhard and Reinhold Schlegelmilch.

From the time of founding up to 1892, it appears that little porcelain was exported to America from Reinhold's factory. At the present time, we know for sure what just a few of these early products look like. Objects in several mold patterns used between 1889 and 1892 are known to be marked with the RS "Arrow" mark. Unfortunately, "Arrow" marked objects do not appear in any of the 1892-93 catalogs we have accessed. This may explain the small degree of overlap of "Arrow" marked mold and transfer patterns with other marked examples in the RS continuum of products from later years. Beginning 1893, US wholesale firms began to import larger quantities of china tableware from Europe, and almost all was from Reinhold's factory. Two events in 1894 appeared to have a significant on Reinhold's production. First, the second factory in Tillowitz, (Upper Silesia) began to make far less expensive porcelain than the one in Suhl, owing to the closer proximity of raw materials, and the abundance of cheap labor. Second, the very high US import tariff on decorated porcelain was substantially lowered by the Tariff Act of 1894. Based on the number and type of entries in American wholesale catalogs, the tariff reduction opened the door to a flood of European porcelain. Overall, most of the tableware (as opposed to dinnerware) came from Reinhold's two factories. To date, we have not been able to find any china tableware from Erdmann's factory in wholesale catalogs issued before 1902.

We estimate that between 1895 and 1900, R. S. Prussia exports to U.S. wholesale firms increased between five and ten fold. It was during this time that the R. S. "Wing" trademark was used. The run of good fortune continued through 1903-05, partly due to the growing popularity of the Art Nouveau movement, and partly to the continued updating of the mold and decorating patterns. Reinhold's firm was noted for innovations in the manufacture and decoration of porcelain. Two patents were issued in the United States. One for a clock case was assigned to George Borgfeldt of New York in 1894. Clocks made according to this patent were sold up to the turn of the century. While a round, beveled "patent" mirror was used in many different molds for shaving mugs, we have yet to find records that a patent was actually issued. The conversion to quality decalcomanias (decals) for decoration beginning

1900 produced goods with more color and eye appeal. This may have been the key that opened the door to greater sales. Throughout the years, there was a continued improvement in the manufacturing facilities. Hartwich details many of the modifications made to improve both the quantity and quality of porcelain that the firm could produce.

Reinhold's products from the 1900-1905 period were noted as being among the best to be made in Europe. Unfortunately, public taste began to change about 1905. The complex mold patterns stocked by American wholesale firms began to be replaced by china in simple shapes. At the same time, imports of inexpensive Japanese china increased. All these factors contributed to year to year decline in the amount of R. S. Prussia carried by wholesale firms. By 1910, simple shapes predominate in all catalogs, wholesale and retail, and Reinhold's products were largely replaced by china from both Japan and other European firms.

Reinhold's products made after 1910 are frequently referred to as R. S. Germany, owing to a change in trademark. However, the change in the country of origin is only one of several to have been made between 1895 and 1910. Consequently, we consider the products made from 1910 to the beginning of WWI to be R. S. Prussia, for both manufacturing plants were still in operation. When the hostilities of WWI began in earnest, the Suhl factory was effectively shut down, owing to a lack of skilled labor. Most likely, some talented factory workers were relocated to Tillowitz. The manufacture of porcelain in Tillowitz continued through WWII. Although the plant survived undamaged, much of the equipment used to make porcelain was removed upon Russian occupation. Today, the factory still stands, but the major product is china dinnerware.

We need to note at this time how most of the R. S. Prussia was sold in this country, at least during the 1892-1910 period. During January and February, Reinhold shipped factory samples to wholesale firms, and most likely, to factory representatives as well. Orders based on these samples were taken and placed with the factory during the first part of the year. In this way, the firm knew before mid-year just how much china had to be made and subsequently shipped overseas. Manufacturing likely started upon receipt of an order, but delivery was probably timed to arrive at wholesale firms in late September or early October. In this way, merchandise could be in the hands of retail accounts by the Holiday selling season. Most wholesale firms issuing catalogs throughout the year show large sections of imported china only in their September through November issues. In catalog after catalog, we note that imported china was promoted as giftware for Thanksgiving, Christmas and the New Year holidays.

The sampling, ordering, manufacturing, and shipping cycle was a continuous, year round process. This had several consequences for Reinhold's firm. First, samples could be made from October to the following January without impacting any of the manufacturing activities. Second, if orders were not placed for items in the sample merchandise, then no more were made. The import of salable samples may explain why collectors occasionally find an object with a unique decoration. Third, Reinhold's firm knew exactly how much china had to be produced by any given date. For this reason, the firm would not have made a "surplus" of unfinished goods. Although some unpainted porcelain was furnished to other European decorating firms (eg. Helena Wolfsohn), examples of their finished products are almost unknown in this country. While white ware could have been exported to American firms supplying china blanks for home decoration, there is no evidence to suggest this took place. Our review of catalogs from firms selling into the home decorating market prior to WWI indicates that undecorated blanks primarily came from Austria and Bavaria. The sale of an excess of Reinhold's undecorated blanks has been proposed to explain some of the trade names to be found on R. S. Prussia blanks. At present, there is no evidence to support this view.

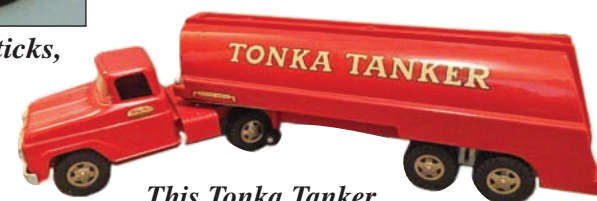

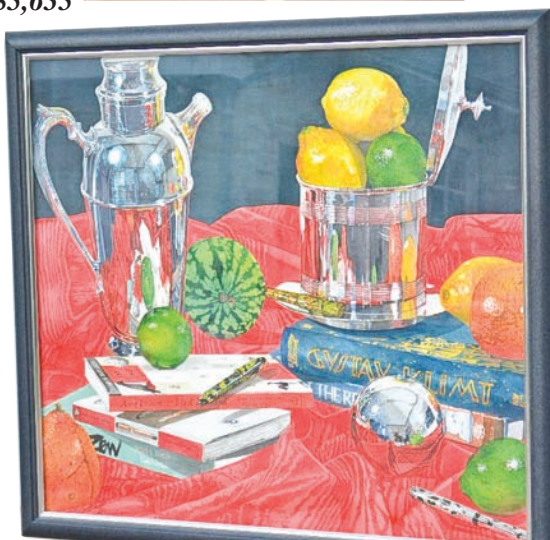

A Brief History of Antique Pressed Glass

Pressed Glass, also referred to as Pattern Glass, was produced between 1850 to 1910. The majority was produced in the 1880's. When it was originally designed, it was intended for everyday use and was made to be very durable and at the same time, attractive.

Families would use glassware as part of their table setting or for entertaining guests. For these reasons, producers made many different patterns to attract the customer to buy their products. Once a pattern was designed, it was patented along with its name so that it could not be duplicated, unless patents or molds were sold to other companies.

Often competitors would produce similar patterns or similar names, if the pattern proved to be popular with the public. For example, the “Flamingo” pattern has similarities to the “Clear Flamingo” pattern, not only in looks, but name as well.

Pressed Glass was produced in both Canada and the United States, with American companies outnumbering Canadian factories. Each year companies competed to produce the most attractive and popular patterns. Pressed Glass patterns were designed and then duplicated into a cast iron mold. The mold was then fired at an extreme temperature. The pieces of the mold were pulled away from the glass and the piece was left to cool.

If you examine a piece of pressed glass you will always find either two, three or four seams running through the glass, although sometimes the seams were well hidden in the pattern. The number of mold lines in a piece of glass does not determine the age. If the piece was small, manufacturers would use a two piece mold; if they were making compotes they would use a three piece mold. When manufacturers made punch bowls, they would use a four piece mold because of its large size, or a four piece mold was used for square patterns to help create the shape.

Around the 1920's, Pressed Glass lost its popularity and crystal became the 'in thing'. Affordable crystal was being shipped from Europe and France. When the depression came, people could no longer afford crystal and returned to pressed glass, or "the affordable glassware." This new period of glassware became known as "Depression Glass". It was produced the same way, pressed into a cast iron mold, but in different patterns and colours to brighten your day.

When manufacturers began producing pressed glass (1850-1910); patterns ranged from very plain to very elaborate cut glass imitations. The market tried and tested each pattern. Even patterns with Animals, Fruits and Florals were designed and created, with attention to fine details. Some of the patterns were produced as full table settings, while others were produced only in goblet form or single tableware pieces. People originally bought goblets and tableware for their beauty and artistic design. In addition, it was functional and affordable.

Just as ladies back then were collecting, trading and buying pressed glass for gifts, we continue to do so today. Collectors enjoy choosing and finding their favourite patterns among the over 3000 known patterns produced in early Pressed Glass.

A Short History of Celluloid

How are these three items related to the history of Celluloid?

- 1) An antique billiard ball
- 2) A Celluloid button
- 3) A ping-pong ball



A brief history lesson about Celluloid buttons will reveal the answers. Celluloid was invented in 1869 by the American inventor, John Wesley Hyatt. It was developed from the compound Cellulose, which is a combination of wood fiber and cotton fiber.

In 1862 the British inventor, Alexander Parkes, was given credit for inventing Cellulose — the first true plastic. He named it Parkesine. In those early years there was much chemical experimentation with Parkesine. They were looking for ways to stabilize and manipulate it so as to manufacture products for the ever-growing world market. Although treating it with nitric acid produced many uses for it, this method went by the wayside because it was still too unstable and very costly to manufacture.

Around the same time that all of this chemical experimentation was going on, an American company called Phelan and Collender in 1862 offered a prize of \$10,000 to anyone that could invent a satisfactory substitute for Ivory. They used Ivory, which came primarily from elephant tusks, for the manufacturing of billiard balls. The game of Billiards was gaining in popularity at that time and elephant tusks were becoming increasingly scarce. The company that offered the \$10,000 prize is still in business today and is known as the Brunswick Corporation.

The American inventor John Wesley Hyatt took up the challenge in 1862.



Hyatt, who had over 100 patents to his name, was determined to win the \$10,000 prize. One day in the mid-1860's while working in his lab, he accidentally spilled a bottle of Colloidine on the Cellulose material that he was experimenting with. He found that it congealed his Cellulose into a tough, flexible mass. He decided to make a demo set of billiard balls with this new material. This new material worked to some extent, but it was still too unstable. It frequently caused small explosions when the billiard balls collided and the bil-

liard balls would sometimes shatter because they had become too brittle.

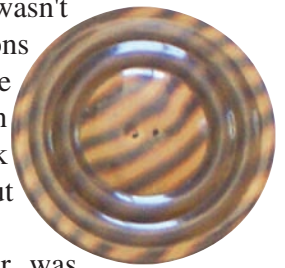
So back to the laboratory he went. In 1868 he found a solution to these problems. He found that when Camphor, which is a by-product of the Laurel tree, was added to the raw Cellulose it caused the problems to disappear. He filed for a patent in 1869, and he named his new product, Celluloid. This product was the first thermoplastic: a substance molded under heat and pressure that would retain its shape when the heat and pressure were removed. He also won the \$10,000 prize.

Buttons were not on the list of the many products that used Celluloid in their manufacturing processes in those early years. Combs, pins, umbrella handles, eyeglass frames, dentures, piano keys, photographic film, and billiard balls all preceded buttons. The use of Celluloid in button manufacturing did not start to appear until one or two decades later.

The earliest buttons that used Celluloid used it as a clear sheet to protect lithographs and for background and trim. Today, those earliest buttons that used Celluloid are called Victorian Celluloid buttons.

The first patent for the Celluloid tighttop button wasn't made until the year 1917. The tight-top Celluloid buttons were the most abundant type of Celluloid buttons made and thus, most Celluloid buttons are classified as Modern vs. Antique buttons. Celluloid buttons reached their peak in the late 1930's, but by the 1940's were being phased out and replaced by other plastic type material buttons.

The first patent for the Celluloid tighttop button wasn't made until the year 1917. The tight-top Celluloid buttons were the most abundant type of Celluloid buttons made and thus, most Celluloid buttons are classified as Modern vs. Antique buttons. Celluloid buttons reached their peak in the late 1930's, but by the 1940's were being phased out and replaced by other plastic type material buttons.



The main reason that Celluloid lost its luster was because of its high flammability and its degradation problems. The common degradation problem occurred because the Camphor worked its way out of the button. This degradation when combined with water or water vapor would form a nitric acid gas that is very corrosive to metal, fabric, paper, and other materials. Extreme heat and UV ray exposure also contributed to the problem. Those things caused the button, or buttons to become brittle and they would develop deep crazing. The buttons affected would completely crumble away in time.

What can you do if you see this type of damage to your buttons? The answer is nothing because there is no way to stop this degradation once it has begun. The buttons affected should be discarded and the remaining buttons should be given a light cleaning.

How can you prevent this from happening to your buttons? Celluloid buttons should be stored separately from your other buttons, particularly metals. They should be kept out of direct UV exposure and they should have proper ventilation and temperature controls. With the proper care most all of your Celluloid buttons will be around for many years to come.

After reading this short history on Celluloid, button collectors should have a deep appreciation for the antique billiard balls of the past because without them, Celluloid buttons would never have been invented, and thus, we would not have any to collect. Finally, do you know what the only Celluloid product now made in any quantity is? The answer is the ping-pong ball!

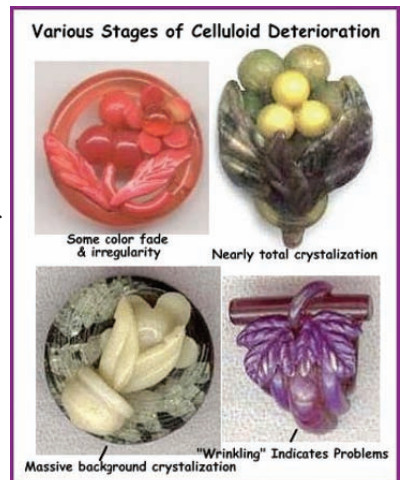


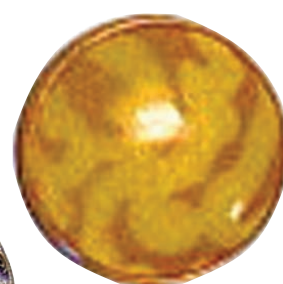
