Two Days of Fantastic Items Cross the Block at Stanton's Auctioneers in Michigan

Day One (Friday) produced a great deal of interest in a G.E. Arnold gas engine that was produced in Ionia that sold for \$19,800. To a buyer from Kansas, a scale model of a Reeves Steam tractor also sold bringing \$6,050; A modern popcorn wagon \$660; Olds miniature gas engine model \$1,320; A pedal airplane and a pedal tractor each sold for \$605 and \$550; Marklin steam engine, \$715; United 5 HP gas engine \$1,265; German Marklin Steam engine w/gear driven dynamo, \$2,475; John Deere 1 1/2 HP gas engine, \$770; Excellent model machine shop depicting the Arnold & Sons machine shop, \$1,870; Cushman gas engine, \$550; Engine for a bicycle by Smith Motor Works, \$880; Ro-Peller hand crank boat motor, \$385; Clarke Trolling motor, \$825; Modern miniature wooden boat w/Antique Neptune single cylinder outboard motor, \$825; Superwear 100% Pure Pennsylvania Lubrication rocking can, \$880; Saito steam engines (3), \$580; Empire double fly wheel steam engine, \$980; 2 Winchester cannons \$1,980.

Day Two (Saturday) found more exceptional smalls crossing the block and all of the antique and collector's automobiles being sold. Starting with the 1939 BSA Army motorcycle selling for \$8,800; followed by the 1930 Ford Model A "Phaeton" that brought \$44,000; 1967 NSU "Wankel" Spider sold for \$14,300; 1938 "Bantam" brought \$8,250; 1967 King/Midget \$6,600; Two of the highlights of the auction were the Amphicars that could be driven on land or used as boats in water, one sold for \$49,500 and the other sold for \$46,750; A 1906 Reo Roadster brought \$34,100 and Stanton's Auctioneers had sold this car 33 years earlier to Mr. Sprague in a Lansing Estate auction that they had previously conducted. A 1969 Reliant Regal motorcycle car sold for \$6,600; then a very fine 1936 Ford 2-door Cabriolet Club car with 829 miles on the odometer sold for \$57,750; One of the Rarest cars in the auction was the 1940 Cadillac with a V-16 engine, The formal sedan had only 45,231 miles and was in excellent condition, there were only 60 cars of this type produced - The car sold for \$77,000; 1946 Lincoln Continental 2-door convertible brought \$33,000; 1937 Packard 12 Series Sedan brought \$45,100; The Rolls Royce Silver Cloud 1 Sedan sold for \$28,600; There also was a Rolls Royce child's coin operated Kiddie

Ride that brought \$2,750; and a Great 1948 Midget Racer that had been restored with a VIN number of 7 brought \$16,500; The 1955 Ford Thunderbird "T-Bird" (red with white interior) sold to competitive bidding for \$44,000; two Thunderbird Jr. battery operated cars that were made by Thunderbird Powercar Company sold for \$2,750 and \$1,640 respectively; The 1966 Glen Pray Cord 8/10 Sportsman Convertible sold for \$22,000; One of the cars to receive the most pre-sale interest was the 1903 Holley Motorette Runabout, the early example was in excellent condition and sold for \$46,750; 1953 MG "TD" 2-door Roadster convertible brought 19,800; A replica of a 1903 Olds Delivery wagon sold for \$3,300; 1951 Crosley "SS" Roadster sold for \$7,150; The unusual BMW "Isetta" 300 with front door access brought \$19,800; 1926 Ford Model T Roadster in very good condition sold for \$20,900; 1978 Cadillac Eldorado Coupe, Biarritz model \$9,900; and a 1968 Cadillac also brought \$9,900.

Also sold at the auction was a great group of signage, neon and related items including Minneapolis Moline Farm Implement Dealers Neon Sign that Sold for \$7,150; Delco Heat (Product of General Motors) Neon Sign, \$5,160; Used Cars and Trucks Outdoor Neon Sign, \$4,400; Atlantic porcelain Oil Sign \$1,320; 1936 Socony Mobil Oil Shield Sign \$2,310; Victor Welding Porcelain and Neon Sign, \$4,950; Town and Country Motor Sales neon sign, \$2,750; Cities Service Cloverleaf Porcelain Sign \$1,375; and others with nearly \$50,000 worth of signs sold.

The second day of the sale also produced the sale of many fine model and scale size engines that drew a considerable amount of interest from the onsite buyers, as well as the phone and internet auction participants from around the United States.

Unequivocal Vintage 1856 Glassware

The steamboat Arabia departed St. Louis, Missouri, August 30, 1856, "headed for all points on the Missouri River between St. Joseph, Missouri, and Sioux City, Iowa", the Missouri Republican reported, with a cargo of new merchandise consigned to merchants along the river. Nine days later on September 5th however, after unloading freight at Westport Landing near the City of Kansas (present-day Kansas City), a village of 3,000 at best, disaster lay 10 miles up river, near Parkville, Missouri.

The Arabia struck a submerged tree trunk and "sank in the short space of ten minutes in some twelve feet of water," according to one newspaper story. The tree reportedly ripped through the steamboat's oak hull, penetrating some 10 feet and causing water to flood the main deck. While all 130 passengers reached shore safely, the Arabia and its 200 tons of new merchandise settled into the sandy bottom of the Missouri River. By evening, "all that could be seen of our boat was the top of the pilot house," a passenger recalled.

During the years since the Arabia's fatal voyage, the Missouri River shifted its course northeast, which left the steamboat buried on farmland. In November of 1988, some 130 years later, a small group of treasure hunters led by the Hawley family located the Arabia in a farmer's cornfield. Excavators uncovered the Arabia at a depth of 27 feet and salvaged the vintage 1856 cargo. Greg Hawley would later write, "I was perched on the edge of history, and what a glorious sight it was." Among quantities of housewares, clothing, footwear, bottled fruits, perfume, fabrics, tools, and building supplies, the treasure hunters found blown and pressed glassware in pristine condition.

Scroll Flask

Eight dozen scroll flasks in hues of blue and green were salvaged from the cargo compartments of the Arabia. The flasks (Figure 1), which were popular during the period 1830 -1850, are attributed primarily to mid-western glasshouses, as all of the marked ones are from that area. Some 75 variations of the curvy shape and scroll-work-in-relief pattern have been recorded and classified (McKearin and Wilson, p. 423).

Their original use is unknown, though whisky flask seems most likely. Unaffected by varying temperatures or rough transport, whisky was freely consumed on the frontier. Typically, whisky was shipped in bulk containers and bottled locally. Perhaps the Arabia's scroll flasks were destined for that purpose.

Whale Oil Lamps

Excavators salvaged both mold-blown and pressed whale oil lamps. The mold-blown lamp with the engaging umbrella-shaped font (Figure 2), is yet to be identified. The font consists of an umbrella-shaped dome of 16 panels over a circular disk applied directly to stem and base.

The trio of lamps with whale oil burners (Figure 3) exemplify home lighting technology on the eve of the kerosene era. The so-called Elongated Star lamp at the right has a mold-blown font joined directly to a pressed stem and base. While attribution of the lamp remains uncertain, just such a technique was developed and patented in 1844 by Patrick Slane and John Golding of the American Glass Company. The technique employed "a mechanical device supporting a metal mold in which a lamp font was blown, centered on, and attached to a previously pressed glass base"(Kaiser, *The Acorn*, p. 40). Each of the two pressed lamps is joined with a wafer to its stem.

The dating and design of the Sharp Diamond pattern derive from a New England Glass Company catalog, ca. 1868-69. The Arabia's Sharp Diamond lamp (Figure 3) and bowl (see Figure 9), however, move the pattern date back a dozen years to 1856 and, in turn, provide an important visual link to "130 pieces pressed sharp diamond pattern glassware" exhibited by New England Glass at the 1853 Crystal Palace Exhibition in New York City (Goodrich, *Science and Mechanism*, p. 220). The pat-

tern is not illustrated in Exhibition reports.

The lamp with the onion-shaped font (Figure 4) and applied and tooled stem and foot is in a shape usually attributed to the 1860s but due to its presence here, seen to be earlier. Pressed pattern whale oil stand lamps such as those found on the Arabia were easily converted to kerosene lamps, and many probably were converted, as the cleaner and cheaper fuel became available. The collar size was the same as a kerosene burner (Thuro, *Oil Lamps*, p. 78).

Though dictionaries declare a glass container with spout and handle a "jug," M'Kee & Brother and J. B. Lyon and Co. named glass molasses containers with metallic spouts and tops "cans" in their respective illustrated catalogs (1859-1860 and 1861). The metallic tops or marketing concerns may have called for a special classification. The tops were available in either tin or britannia at a higher price.

The molded pattern on the molasses can in (Figure 5) remains unidentified. Perhaps a reader can assist. Meanwhile, an apt suggestion coming from Frank Robertson, researcher and author, is a Colonial variant. The pressed Colonial pattern, which Ruth Webb Lee reportedly considered one of the earlier pressed patterns, features a punty in the upper portion of the panel.

The molded pattern on the molasses can in (Figure 6) is Star and Punty, better known as a pressed pattern found on bottles and spoon holders and not identified as to maker. The syrup jug or cruet in (Figure 7) has mold-blown ribs, a style of decoration popular throughout the 19th century and not attributable to any factory.

Tablewares

The pressed tumbler with applied handle in (Figure 8) is known also as a handled whiskey or mug. Though the contemporary pattern name was Palace, collectors continue to revert to its descriptive alias, Waffle and Thumbprint. This Palace pattern is illustrated in the Lyon and Company 1861 catalog, as well as in the New England Glass Company catalog of 1868-69 and an advertisement of Curling, Robertson & Sons of Pittsburgh shown in Lowell Innes's *Pittsburgh Glass*. American Glass Company invoices issued as early as September, 1854, reference "2 Palace bowls"(Kaiser, p. 67).

The footed bowl in (Figure 9) is pressed in the New England Glass Company's Sharp Diamond pattern discussed previously, while the spoon holder in the same picture is in the pattern shown as Comet in the M'Kee & Brother 1860 catalog. Molds for the pattern were found at Sandwich according to Ruth Webb Lee and the Cape Cod Glass Company advertised a Comet pattern in about 1863.

Though classified as cologne bottle, fancy shaped bottles such as the Arabia bottle in Figure 10 were used for numerous cosmetic liquids.

The perfume shipped aboard the Arabia included French perfume, according to analysis by International Flavors and Fragrances of New York City. However, an American perfumer may have prepared the cosmetic for market using domestic bottles. American manufacture of perfume and cologne bottles is recorded as early as 1818. Attribution of the Arabia bottle is undetermined. (McKearin and Wilson, p. 394).

A quantity of small glass panels of the size and contour illustrated in (Figure 11) were found in a box together with ink wells. All who have seen and discussed the objects are puzzled, David Hawley reports. The contour of the panels seems to rule out laboratory slides.

The unequivocal date in history which appends to the Arabia's glassware is indeed significant. Due to a general lack of factory or related other records, glass historians and collectors are seldom able to arrive at exact dating. The Arabia's pressed pattern artifacts, in particular, may well, over time, continue to link to earlier periods of American glassmaking.

Author's note:

The cargo recovered from the steamboat Arabia is housed and exhibited in The Arabia Steamboat Museum which opened November, 1991. The museum is located in Kansas City at historic City Market, which was established in 1857 *adjacent to Westport Landing, the Arabia's final port-of-call.*

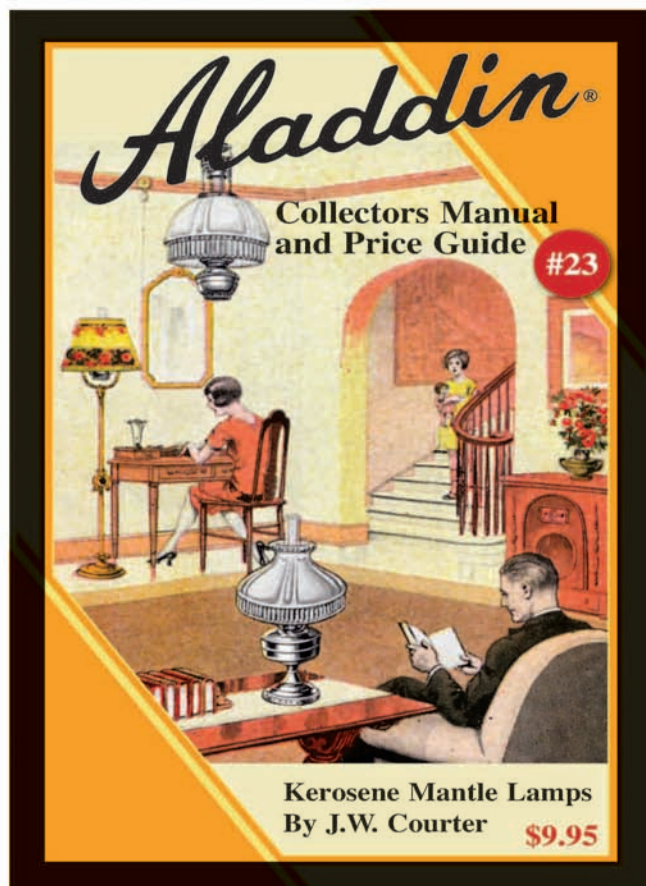

Collecting Clubs Have a Bigger Role to Play

Looking back to the 1960s, 1970s, even the early 1980s when many of our collecting clubs got their start, things seemed a lot simpler. The primary goal of collecting clubs in those days was to establish a way for collectors in a given collecting area to communicate with one another, get to know each other, and to perhaps buy, sell and trade among the members. A newsletter got started, and usually some form of "gathering" which for many clubs developed into an annual convention. Later some clubs started local chapters and perhaps doing projects or offering other resources for their members. Often a member or two started a mail auction or sales list which provided additional opportunities.

The evolution in the antiques & collecting industry has made major changes during the past decade or more, and particularly since 1990. In fact, most everything has changed...except collecting clubs which often times seem to be resistant to change.

Yes, the Internet has a major role in this change. The way we buy and sell and trade has been influenced big time by the Internet. But collecting, itself, has changed. We have new types of collectors who are far from being traditionalists. And, for sure, they do not understand collecting clubs...and collecting clubs do not understand them.

This is why so many collecting clubs today are fretting over a decline in membership and an aging membership, while at the same time we have more collectors than ever, and more younger collectors.

Collecting clubs still have a significant role to play in the collecting industry, perhaps more so than ever. As clubs mature, there seems to be an evolution that takes place within the club, itself. Whereas it may have started out simply as a way for fellow collectors to get to know one another and to foster this communication, over the years the knowledge base of many of our collecting areas comes to rest within the membership of these collecting clubs. Hence, clubs now have an additional responsibility - that of a legitimate resource for the collecting area the club serves - and not only to their own members, but to anyone who has a need for information relating to their particular collecting area, i.e. the entire collecting community.

Bottom line, many of our collecting clubs need to start thinking differently and doing things differently. As an important resource to your collecting area are you fulfilling your role? Are you truly interested in reaching out to new audiences - collectors who need your help and expertise - and not only bringing them in but serving them in the ways they need to be served?

It has been documented that every generation seeks out and uses resources with which they feel most comfortable...and that these resources are quite different from one generation to another. If the bulk of your membership is in the age bracket or 50 or higher, chances are that you are not providing club information in either the correct context or using the right vehicles for reaching younger generations.

The Association of Collecting Clubs exists to support collecting groups, their leadership and membership, in a variety of areas including club promotion, membership recruitment, reaching new audiences, strengthening conventions, working with young collectors, networking, club insurance and club management. The NICEE is an in-person opportunity for young inventors in grades 3-12 to display their creative and critical thinking skills through inventing, innovating, and entrepreneurial activities.

Antiques & Appraising School Launches "New" e-Course

Article by Charles Green (Asheford Institute of Antiques)



The Asheford Institute of Antiques (AIA), a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising, recently rolled out its first ever online "e-Course," at an industry trade gathering earlier this month, in anticipation of the school's 50th anniversary to be held in New York later this year.

Described by school spokesperson Shelly Dumont, as a watershed moment for the Institute, Dumont said the school's first foray into e-learning was consistent with Asheford's innovative and ground-breaking teaching techniques employed

over the last 50 years. "When we offer something new, we like to take the time to make sure it's done right," said Dumont at a Q & A session following the announcement.

When asked about the differences in curriculum between textbooks and the new e-Course format of the program, Dumont said there was literally no comparison. "In terms of sheer volume, it's almost double the size of the printed version, and

comes loaded with interactive videos, multimedia-activities, web-based resource links, and a host of other features we simply can't add into the texts." Dumont went on to say that the e-Course had been in development for almost two years by the school's IT team, before any release dates were even considered.

Industry insiders attending the trade gathering were granted temporary passcodes to the e-Course, and were given full access to the programs options and features at a demonstration held during the event. Director of the school, Charles Green presided over the presentation, and noted during the unveiling, that the program had undergone almost a year of beta-testing by international students prior to its intended release in North America.

A statement issued from the school's Admissions Officer, Tony Drew seemed to indicate a "full" release date for the new e-Course to be some time in mid-July. "We don't want to rush it, but we're really pleased with the response so far," said Drew, "We think the e-Course is really going to be a game-changer when it comes to setting the bar for future antiques and appraising education." The press release went on to say that while the textbooks for the Asheford program were still available, they would likely be phased out in the next five to ten years.
