Illinois State Archaeological Society Indian Artifact Show

The 17th Annual Indian Artifact Show will be held Sunday, October 7th, 2018 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Amerian Legion Hall, 9054 Route U.S. 34 (just east of Rt. 47) in Yorkville, Illinois. The show is free and open to the public. It is sponsored by the Illinois State Archaeological Society, a non-profit organization which has been in existence since 1936.

Exhibits will be brought from throughout Illinois and surrounding states with the Chicago area heavily represented. Exhibits will include a wide variety of tools and weapons used by Native

American people over the thousands of years of their residence in the American.

Visitors are encouraged to bring any Native American items which they have found, purchased, inherited or which may have been hiding in the family attic. Free identifications and appraisals will be offered. There will be a professional archaeologist from the University of Illinois on hand to answer

questions and to help with identifying artifacts.

Attorney Ron Kaminski is probably the most well known attorney in Manitowoc for the

past fifty years. Part of his practice was devoted to family law and he had some memorable cases. What

made Ron stand out was all his community efforts.

As president of his
Senior class in high
school, he raised funds for the
design, and construction of the large
statue of Abraham Lincoln which
stands in front of Lincoln High

School. Lincoln High School was built in the 1920's and is the oldest high school in the state of Wisconsin. Forty years later in 1961 the school finally had its statue, almost 60

years later it still stands.

After his education, Ron returned to Manitowoc and set up his law practice.

He continued to be involved in com-

munity projects with the acquisition, funding, and restoration of the old Capital theater which became the Capital Civic Center, a show case for all kinds

of events. He also led the restoration of the old Teachers College into the home of the Manitowoc County Historical Society. His promotion and involvement of the arts led to his purchase of the Historic Forst Inn in Tisch Mills, where he produced live theater and entertainment in his Little Sandwich Theater. He took on-stage roles many times.

Ron received many community awards in his lifetime including the prestigious Teply Award for substantial contribution to the arts. In his home

Genius! The 19th century candy container was early packaging and merchandising at its best, designed to delight the affluent child, first with the candy and, afterwards, with the toy that remained.

The early 1900s were the golden years for candy containers. The first commercially made in the late 1800s are generally of German origin, originally of a flour and paste recipe and later, mold-pressed papier-mâché, all with a hidden inner chamber to house the candy surprise. Begun as a cottage industry, companies in Germany, France, Japan and the U.S. expanded upon the idea and began to mass produce a wide variety of containers, not just in the original traditional materials, but also in glass, card-board and tin litho to name a few. Themes are endless and include animals, dolls, transportation, buildings, weapons, furniture and furnishings, folk figures & more.

"Any collection of holiday items (Easter, Christmas, Halloween, etc.) will ultimately lead to candy containers." So says collector Jackie Kojis who, decades ago, was busy collecting bears. "I have two candy containers with Roosevelt bears on them but bought them because I was collecting antique bears. Same with dog or cat containers they often look like a stuffed toy and it's a surprise the head comes off and the bodies are hollow!"


