


Neat Pieces Cross the Block at Munda Auction in Illinois

History of the Christmas Tree

Article by Shelby Weister Four Seasons Antique Mall The tree has been the center of the Christmas celebration for generations. People believe it is tradition, although the tree dates back only about 100 years. The vision of a candlelit. orna-

ment trimmed

tree creates a warm hearted feeling in the mind.

Evergreens were seen as a symbol of everlasting life and promise of the rebirth of nature in spring. The evergreen was given a prominence in religious celebrations. In the Bible we find the Tree of Life, the Burning Bush and the Tree of Knowledge. With history and the use of evergreens, there are links to northern Europe. A widely told story about the origin of the Christmas tree refers to Martin Luther. It is told that after wandering about on Christmas eve under the bright sky and stars, he returned home and set up a tree for his children. He lit the evergreen with candles to impress his children of the true meaning of Christ, the Light of the World.

The Yule tree is an early German custom, a close relative of the decorated tree. Often people dug the tree out, dirt and all, planted it in a container, then replanted it outside in spring. The thought to dispel the gloom of winter and a reminder of the rebirth of nature in spring.

During the Victorian period one of the first artificial trees was introduced. Households created trees out of such things as pine limbs or broom handles, then bored holes in them and installed branches. But the feather tree was the first commercially produced tree. Goose or turkey feathers, which had been dyed green, were wrapped onto wire branches.

The first decorated tree appeared in the White House under President Pierce around 1856 and became a tradition thereafter. Around 1890 Christmas became a legal holiday. Around 1900 the first Christmas tree farm was established in New Jersey. The business was profitable and helped with American conservation measures. In 1923 the first national Christmas tree was displayed during the Coolidge administration.

During the 1960's period the silver aluminum tree, complete with a rotating color wheel, made its appearance. Followed by artificial trees that were very real looking. Now these green fake trees come complete with lights. Many families prefer the real tree for ambience and that pine smell. May the meaning of your Christmas tree for you and yours be memorable.

Poinsettias at Christmas



The poinsettia was made widely known because of a man called Joel Roberts Poinsett (that's why we call them Poinsettia!). He was the first Ambassador from the USA to Mexico in 1825. Poinsett had some greenhouses on his plantations in South Carolina, and while visiting the Taco area in 1828, he became very interested in the plants. He immediately sent some of the plants back to South Carolina, where he began growing the plants and sending them to friends and botanical gardens.

One of the friends he sent plants to was John Bartram of Philadelphia. At the first Philadelphia flower show, Robert Buist, a plants-man from Pennsylvania saw the flower and he was probably the first person to have sold the poinsettias under their botanical, or latin name, name 'Euphorbia pulcherrima' (it means, 'the most beautiful Euphorbia'). They were first sold as cut flowers. It was only in the early 1900s that they were sold as whole plants for landscaping and pot plants. The Ecke family from Southern California were one of, if not, the first to sell them as whole plants and they're still the main producer of the plants in the USA. It is thought that they became known as Poinsettia in the mid 1830s when people found out who had first brought them to America from Mexico.

There is an old Mexican legend about how Poinsettias and Christmas come together, it goes like this:

There was once a poor Mexican girl called Pepita who had no present to give the the baby Jesus at the Christmas Eve Services. As Pepita walked to the chapel, sadly, her cousin Pedro tried to cheer her up.

'Pepita', he said "I'm sure that even the smallest gift, given by someone who loves him will make Jesus Happy."

Pepita didn't know what she could give, so she picked a small handful of weeds from the roadside and made them into a a small bouquet. She felt embarrassed because she could only give this small present to Jesus. As she walked through the chapel to the altar, she remembered what Pedro had said. She began to feel better, knelt down and put the bouquet at the bottom of the nativity scene. Suddenly, the bouquet of weeds burst into bright red flowers, and everyone who saw them were sure they had seen a miracle. From that day on, the bright red flowers were known as the 'Flores de Noche Buena', or 'Flowers of the Holy Night'.

The shape of the poinsettia flower and leaves are sometimes thought as a symbol of the Star of Bethlehem which led the Wise Men to Jesus. The red colored leaves symbolize the blood of Christ. The white leaves represent his purity.

The Poinsettia is also the national emblem of Madagascar.







Antiques School Releases List Of Top Sellers For 2017



The latest results from the Asheford Institute (a professionallevel distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising), recently published it's annual survey of top buying trends within the antiques and collectibles community this past week.

The Institute, which has been conducting the industry related survey for over six years now, released its latest trending data on decorative arts sales for 2017 via a dedicated page on the school's web site. The survey, which focuses on compiling and grouping information related to customers buying habits over a twelve month period, came about as a result of strong interest from readers requesting updates from previous surveys, said current Director of the Institute, Charles Green. He went on to note that there were some interesting changes in the poll results this year. "Our questionnaire has become more detailed, resulting in answers that are more period and genre specific. We're really able to drill down now into the types of antiques and vintage

items that are actually selling well within a 12 month period." Green also acknowledged that the increase in pollparticipants (up 15% over last year), had led to more accurate survey numbers in regard to particular sales categories. "More data has simply given us better survey results," said Green.

The school's lead Poll Researcher, Tony Frey, echoed Mr. Green's sentiments and went on to say that the main goal of the Institute's survey was to provide meaningful analysis of measurable interest in current trends within the antiques and collectibles marketplace, based on actual sales results and requests for specific items from vendors.

Frey, who has worked on all six of the school's past polls, noted that while the survey was based on a general series of questions, and did not employ any standardized formulas, the overall results were still very revealing when looked at as a whole. "The shift in what's considered collectible is continuing to change, and at a more accelerated pace than ever before," said Frey. "For the last few years it's been Mid-century modern, but this year we're beginning to see some cracks in that crown."

Some of the other highlights from the poll included a resurgence of all things Western. "We're seeing a revitalized interest by the public in literally anything related to the American past and particularly the wild, wild west" said Frey. Other top sellers on the school's list include a few industry standards such as Star Wars items, space related toys from the 1960's and 70's, as well as automobilia and related mechanical items. Frey noted that just as in past polls, the most visible movement in collecting genres was being reported by younger dealers, who indicated that consumer tastes seemed to be trending towards virtually anything related to the latter half of the twentieth-century. "The reality is the younger collectors are the one's moving the ball forward now," said Frey, "the rest of us just appear to be along for the ride."
